A week or two ago I was attending one of the many fund raisers being held in the area. As I stood in line I was next to a wonderful table of desserts made and donated to the cause.

My eyes fastened on a gorgeous fruit pie. The perfect, golden brown crust was woven carefully into lattice-work, and sprinkled with a sparkling layer of sugar.

That simple sight sent me back to my grandmother's kitchen, hanging on the pull-out bread board on her cabinet while she deftly rolled pie crust, sliced it into strips, and made the basketweave top look easy.

As I grew older she tried to teach me the trick. I would slice my crust into strips, and make a fair beginning, but before it was over, I would have lost the thread of what I was doing and end up begging for help. I never did fully get the knack of making a basketweave pie top.

It wasn't for lack of trying, but there was a definite lack of talent!

The other talent grandmother possessed was fluting the edges of a pie crust. And, again, I fell short of her expectations, (and mine) by not having a knack for making the perfectly even, ruffled edge.

I still remember her fingers, twisted with arthritis, the joints much enlarged, the skin thin and wrinkled, moving just incredibly fast as she ruffled that pie crust.

My crusts....I resort to using a fork to imprint the edge and seal it.

I don't do basketweave, I cut out stars and a crescent moon or clover leaves, autumn leaves or apple shapes instead.

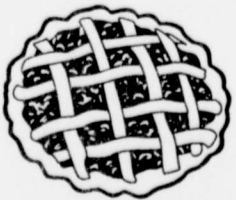
So, I can't pass that little bit of decorative food artistry on to anyone, at my end of the family it is lost.

I hope others still take the time to do these things, especially younger people. For some reason it is a childhood memory that is beautiful to me, and it was a time when my grandparent and I did some bonding.

I love the idea of little girls today learning to do this from their mom or grandmom.

Of course, there is something else I have to confess. Neither my mom nor grandmother would be really thrilled to know that I usually buy a frozen package of pie dough, thaw it and slap it into that pie pan!

Oh well, I suspect I've failed the pie baking rather miserably! It wasn't for lack of trying....although these days lack of time has something to do with it.

Bogata Council agrees to half the cost of creek control

Mayor Kennedy and three councilmembers were present at the regular meeting of the Bogata city Council held November 18. Five employees and approximately 14 guests attended.

Council heard from Donna Rozell, Bogata Housing Authority Executor, who told the council that she has a bid of \$3,000 from Richard Drake Construction Co. of Powderly to do some erosion control on Morrison Creek, which is partially due to a big sewer line break. She asked for the city to pay one half of the amount. Council voted unanimously to pay half the cost. One hundred forty feet of sewer line is scheduled to be replaced on an upcoming grant if the city is successful in obtaining the grant.

Minutes, bills and final water bills were approved.

Police Chief Clegg gave his monthly report which included 37 speeding tickets, one reckless driver, one minor in possession, one tobacco violation, one drug paraphernalia, two larceny, two civil complaints, three assault with bodily injury, one truancy, one burglary of a house, two arrests. The new police car is here in the video has been installed.

Water Superintendent Wendell Davis reported 86 work orders, including five leaks, seven sewer stops, one manhole raised, water tanks and elevated tank inspected at no charge, 32 trash pickups on the fall cleanup, the N. Bryson lift station pump repaired and will be installed soon, six dogs, two cats picked up.

Coy Coker was complimented by Davis and he also received a round of applause for helping supervise the community service workers, and for helping move the tables and chairs to Rozell gym for the recent policy fundraiser.

No action was taken on the street light on 7th SE awaiting cleaning of brush at that location

by the City. The resignation of Councilmember Brian Strickland was accepted, but appointing a replacement was tabled. Mayor Kennedy suggested if anyone is interested in being appointed to contact City hall at 632-5315.

Council voted unanimously to pass two resolutions authorizing the Mayor to execute the deeds and all documents necessary to convey tracts 11 and 12 of W.G. Miller A0560 to Kim Barrett for her bids of \$289.00 and \$233.00 respectively. Council voted not to place a Christmas ad in the Bogata News but rather to have a Christmas greeting placed on the Lions Club marquee and use the money saved to help with the employees' Christmas lunch.

They also voted unanimously to pay the bill of \$125.00 for the appraisal of the elementary school building and agreed to let the Pee Wee football Association store their equipment in a room at the school building, provided they know the city will not be liable for any damages and no keys to the building be given out.

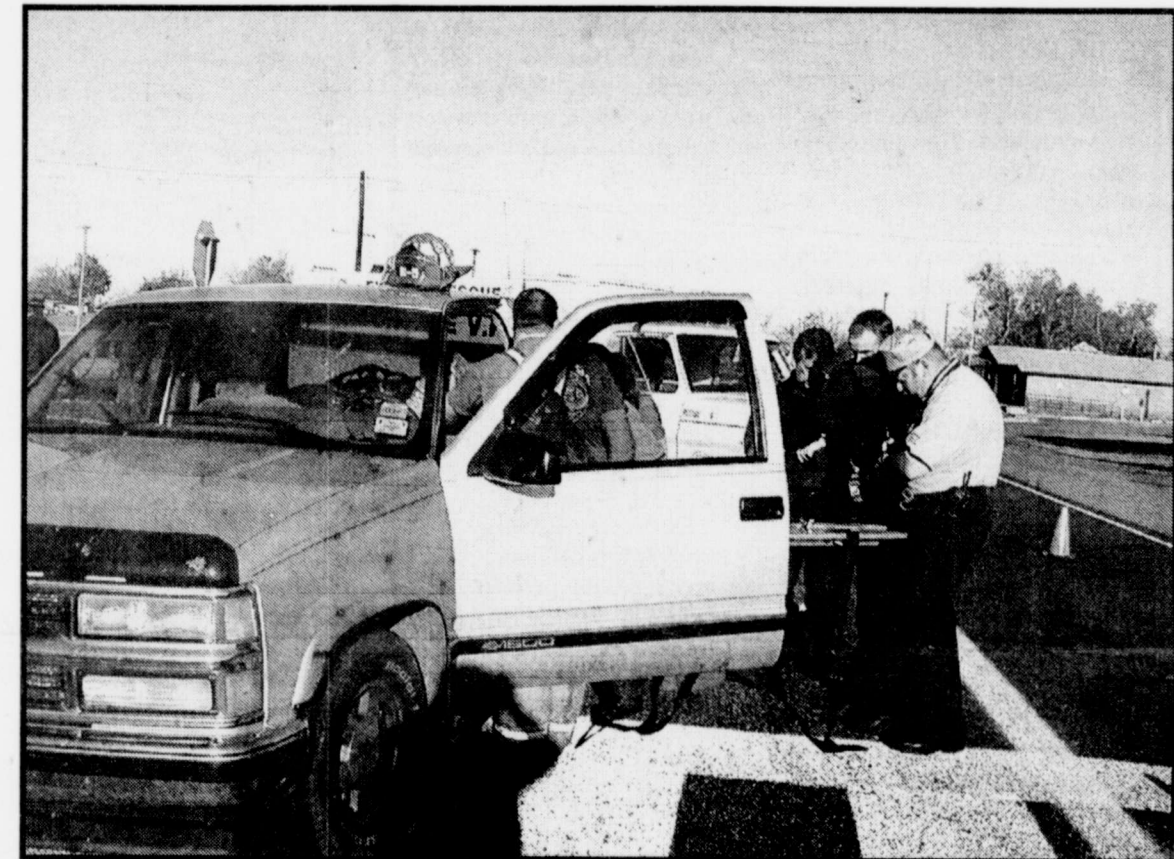
Council voted to have David Rozell cut the tree at the entrance to Thomas Park at a cost of \$500 for removing the tree, chipping all brush and grinding the stump. He will also extract some broken limbs from trees above playground equipment. The council voted to allow the employees to have a Christmas lunch with the employees deciding on a date. No action taken on a conflict between the Police Department and the Fire Department. A meeting with representatives from each department and the Mayor will be held within ten days to resolve this problem.

Donna Rozell told the council that PILOT will be paid to the City as soon as HUD approves her budget.

The meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.

Two car jacking suspects apprehended near Bogata

Two suspect in a car-jacking were captured near the outskirts of Bogata, one on Sunday night and the other Monday morning after an all-night effort. The chase was a multi-department effort with state, county and local law enforcement agencies participating.

The car jacking occurred in Rockwall and a chase was initiated near Sulphur Springs on the Interstate. The two men, one adult and the other a juvenile, went on to Mt. Pleasant. Spike strips shredded the tires, but reports indicate that they managed to take the ve-

hicle down Hwy. 271 to near the roadside park just outside the Bogata City Limits before bailing out and fleeing on foot.

The driver of the car was taken into custody that day. And all night search for the juvenile passenger ended about 9:30 a.m. Monday morning when the suspect was seen heading behind a house on 271. Red River County Sheriff Jerry Neal Conway took him into custody, putting an end to the man hunt.

According to the code, an eligible veteran is one who:

(A) is an honorably discharged member of the armed forces of the United States;

(B) was scheduled to graduate

from high school after 1940 and before 1951 and;

(C) left high school before graduation to serve in World War II.

Thanksgiving recipes**

Southwestern Jalapeno Cornbread Dressing

4 cups crumbled cornbread
10 slices dried bread crumbs-subed
1 pound mild Italian sausage
1-1/2 cups celery-chopped
1 cup onion-chopped
1-1/2 teaspoons salt
1 teaspoon poultry seasoning
1/4 cup jalapeno peppers-seed and chop
2 eggs-beaten
1 cup turkey broth

Preheat oven to 325. In large bowl combine breads. In skillet on medium-high saute sausage, celery and onion until sausage is no longer pink and vegetables are tender; combine with bread mixture. Add salt, poultry seasonings, peppers, eggs and broth. Spoon dressing into lightly greased 3-quart casserole. Bake, uncovered for 45-50 minutes.

Giblet Gravy

neck, heart, liver and gizzard from turkey
1 medium carrot-sliced thin
1 medium onion-diced
1 medium celery rib-diced
1 boiled egg
3 tablespoons fat from turkey drippings
3 tablespoons flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
pepper to taste

Place turkey parts in covered water and boil until done. Saute vegetables in 1 tablespoon butter until onion is clear. Dice turkey parts; add with vegetables and set aside. Combine turkey drippings and flour to make paste. Add enough flour to make gravy thicken. Add vegetables and chopped egg and simmer. Salt and pepper to taste.

Crockpot Scalloped Potatoes

6-8 thinly sliced potatoes
1 can cheddar cheese soup
1 cup Velveeta cheese
1-1/2 cups grated cheddar cheese
1 can evaporated milk
salt and pepper
1/2 cup finely chopped onion

Spray crockpot with Pam. Fill with potatoes and lay 1/2 can soup, 1/2 Velveeta, chunked, 3/4 cup grated cheese and 1/2 can milk. Add salt and pepper and 1/2 of onion. Layer remaining ingredients in same order. Cook on high about 6 hours. More milk may be added if needed.

Squash Casserole

4 cups cooked yellow squash
1 medium onion
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1 stick butter or margarine
2 cups crushed Cheezit crackers
2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
1 cup milk or heavy cream

Cook squash, onion, butter and salt and pepper until onion and squash are tender. Mix remaining ingredients except for 3/4 cup crackers and 3/4 cup shredded cheese. Pour into 2 quart casserole and top with crackers and cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

Mashed Sweet Potatoes

4 medium sweet potatoes
1 tablespoon butter
1/4 cup milk
3/8 cup brown sugar
1 teaspoon cinnamon

Peel, slice and boil potatoes until tender. Mash and add butter and milk; stir. Add sugar and cinnamon. Sprinkle with cinnamon.

Brownie Pudding

1/2 cup all purpose flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup sugar
1 tablespoon cocoa powder
1 tablespoon shortening-melted
1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/4 cup milk
1/2 cup chopped pecans
1 cup brown sugar
1 tablespoon cocoa powder
1 cup boiling water

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine flour, baking powder, salt, sugar and 1 tablespoon cocoa. Stir in shortening, vanilla and milk until smooth. Fold in nuts. Spread mixture in 1 quart baking dish. Stir together brown sugar, cocoa and water. Mix well. Pour carefully over pudding mixture in baking dish. Bake for 30-45 minutes until set.

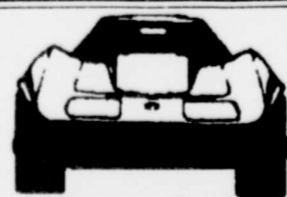
She was preceded in death by a brother, Buck Meacham in April 1999.

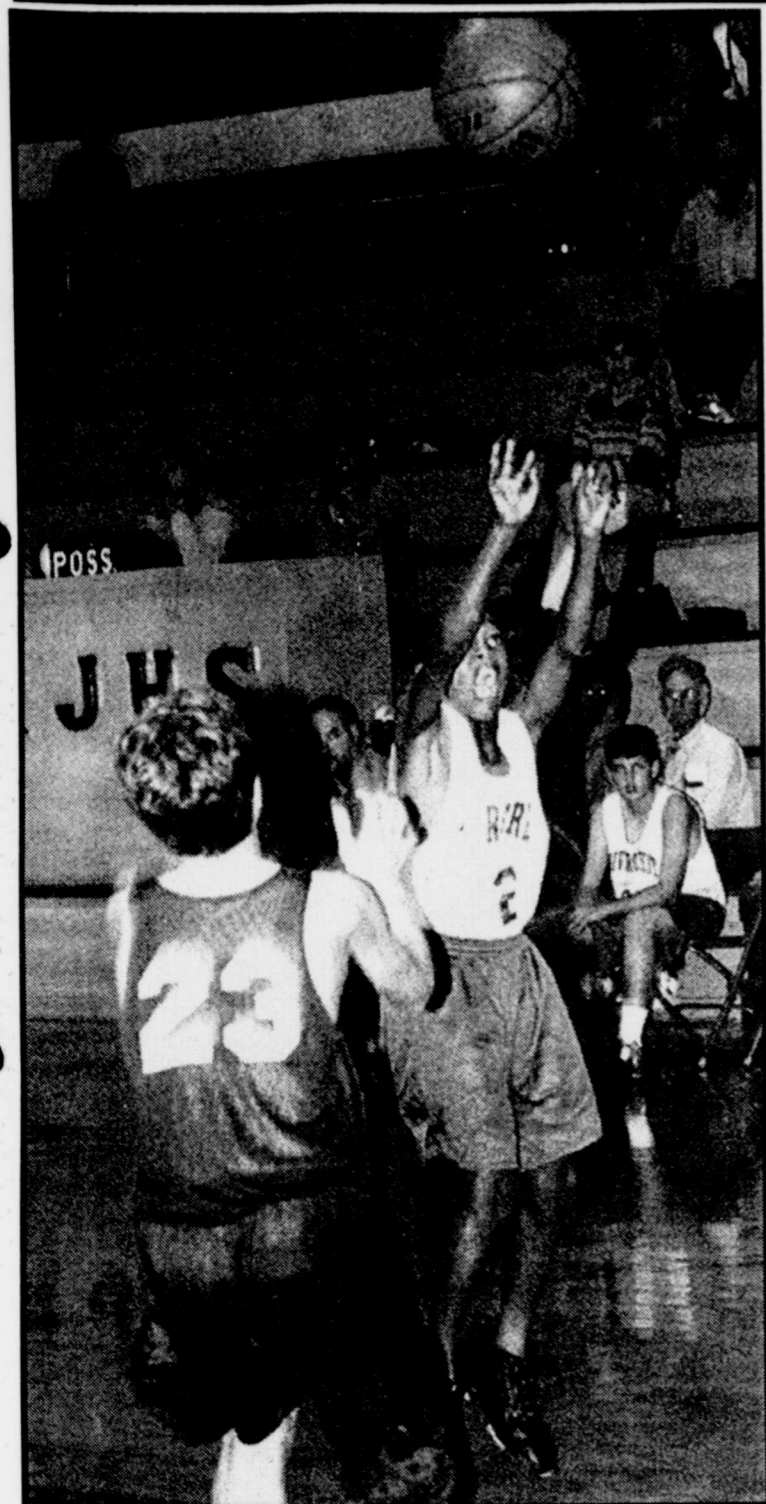

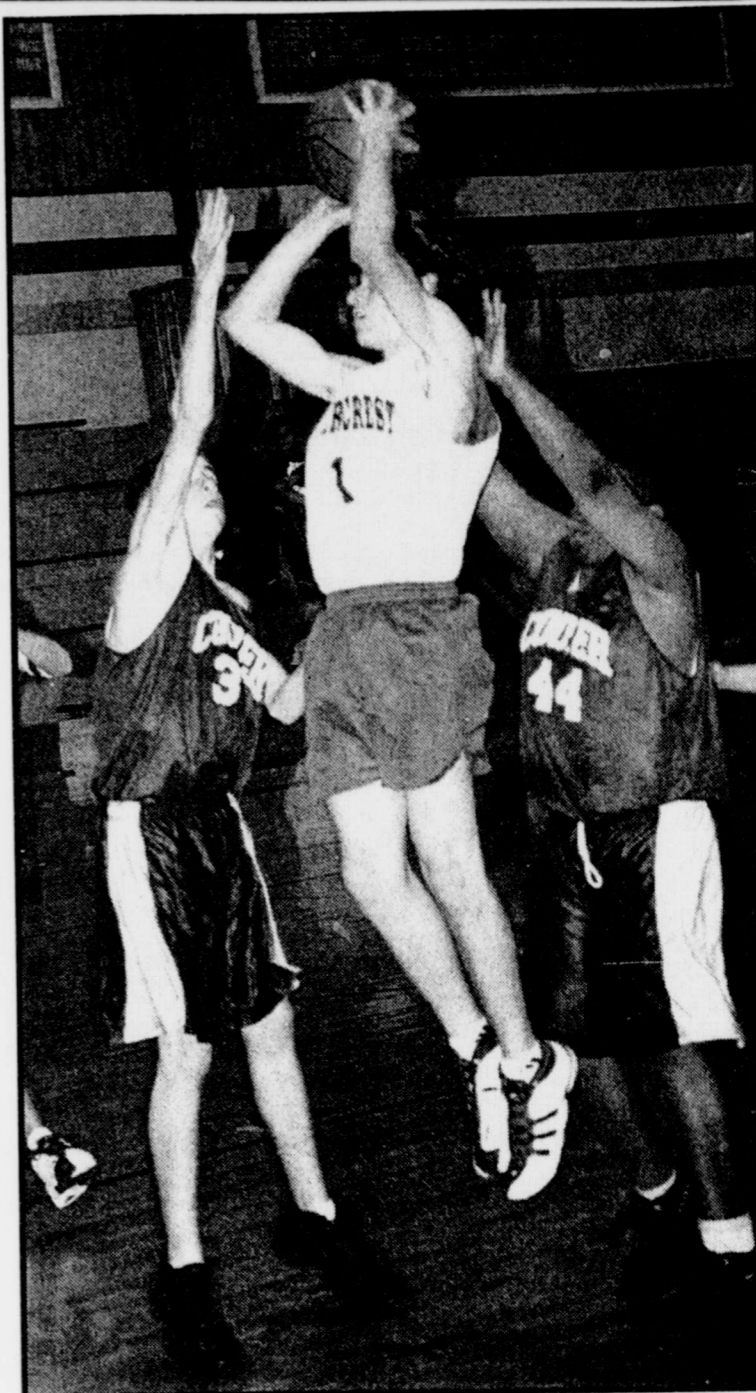

PET TALK

Your pet may not need a wake-up call, room service and amint on its pillow for a pleasant overnight stay, but boarding could require a little homework.

Each year, about 30 million pet owners board their pets for at least one night, according to figures from the American Boarding Kennels Association. And since there are more than 9,000 boarding kennels in the U.S. and Canada, there is probably one near you.

Fees can range from \$8 to \$30 a day, depending on the facility, the type of services offered and other factors.

While boarding a pet may seem like a simple procedure, there are still some questions you might want to ask, says Dr. Alice Blue-McLendon of Texas A&M University's College of Veterinary Medicine.

A good way to find out who the best boarders are is usually by word of mouth. People tend to be picky about their pets, and they know who the good boarders are and which ones to avoid.

Look to see if the facility is clean. Is there adequate lighting at the facility, and is the bedding for the animal sufficient for its needs?

If the owner is to be away for an extended time, it's a good idea to ask how often the animals get exercise or some form of entertainment. Dogs will usually enjoy a brisk walk but some facilities may not have the manpower for such activity.

Parasites can often be a problem for some boarding facilities, and the diseases they carry can be harmful to your pet.

A common ailment associated with boarding of animals is bordetella, commonly known as "kennel cough." Although usually not serious, the ailment can be a nagging problem and is caused by the pet's close proximity with other animals. Vaccinations are available to prevent it.

Once the animal has been picked up at the boarding facility, you may want to see the log kept during its stay. Most facilities keep daily records of how often the pet was fed, exercised or groomed.

"The best solution is usually to keep the animal at home and have someone care for it in its own environment. But if that isn't possible, boarding is necessary and that's when the owner needs to do a little homework. Most facilities are properly run, but it's always best to do a little checking around before you board your pet."
