DEATHS ON HIGHWAY INCREASE

AUSTIN-(AP)—Texas traffic deaths hit an all-time high of 3,487 last year, up three per cent above the 3,367 deaths recorded in 1967, the Department of Public Safety reported Saturday.

December's 369 deaths topped the previous December record of 363 in 1965.

Accidents last year totaled 940,268, compared with 885,268 in 1967.

From 1900 through 1968, the United States has had 1,721,754 traffic deaths, compared with 1,161,007 American deaths in all wars from 1775 through 1968.

The economic loss of Texas accidents last year was an estimated \$836,802,000."

P. S. Written in 1968, but perhaps your son or daughter might like to know that 1976 also will have its traffic statistics.

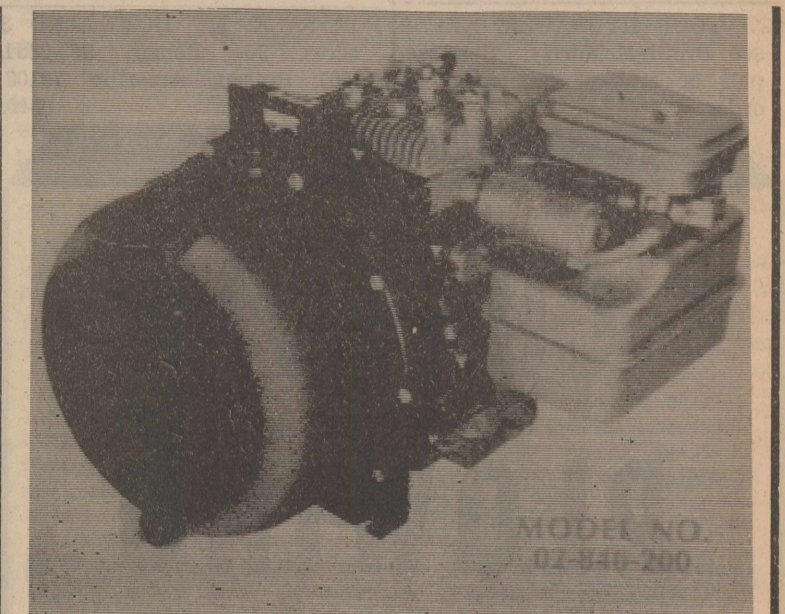
