Friendly Hawaiians, fetching Polynesian Dancers, a precision and comedy diving routine and lively dolphins can all be found on Texas Turf at Hawaii Kai, the new family entertainment park in Arlington, Texas.

The outdoor recreation center on the Dallas-Fort Worth Turnpike recently opened a 40-acre Polynesian Park complete with native Hawaiians and lush tropical surroundings. The young Hawaiians are featured throughout the park, and were selected from the exclusive Kamehameha School in Honolulu where the ancient Hawaiian culture is kept alive for future generations.

The 35 Hawaiian entertainers rehearsed the show in Honolulu for five months prior to the park's opening. The entertainment features authentic native dances, songs and instrumental music from an island stage centered in the Royal Kahua Lagoon, which is flanked by a 50-foot manmade

mountain and waterfall. The islanders are also featured at the Kahili Bay Sea Lion and Bird Show where trained sea lions and colorful birds perform their antics for the public. Another major attraction of the park is the Dolphin/Dive Show which features world-champion divers, trained dolphins, the Aquamaniacs and an exciting fire dive. Visitors to Hawaii Kai are encouraged to participate in all the activities and shows and have the opportunity to feed and pet deer, dolphins, ducks and goldfish throughout the park. Guests may also enjoy an underwater theatre and show, a colorful multi-media production about Hawaii, safely stare at killer sharks on Sharks Reef and ride through an Alaskan Adventure.

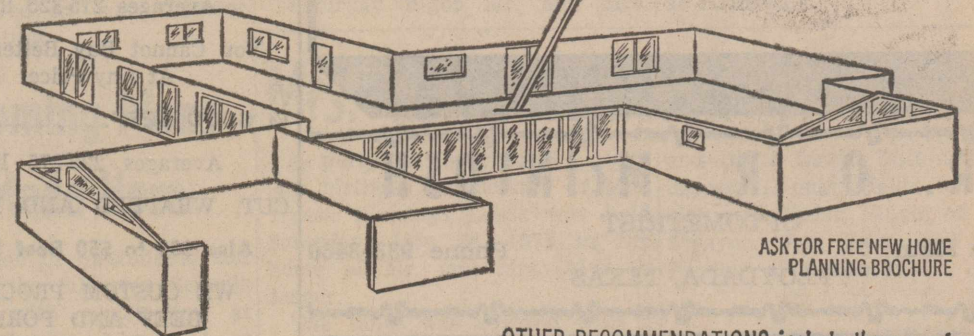

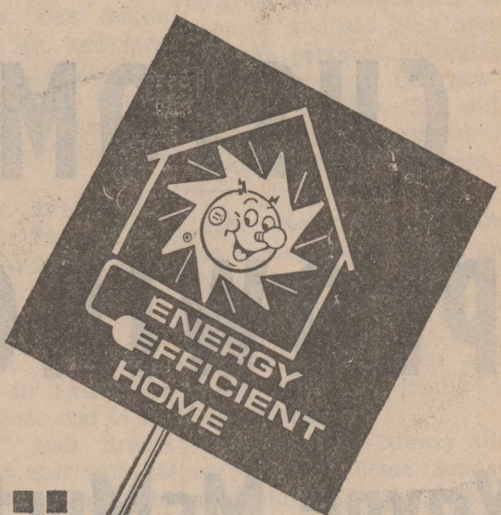
OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS include the use of cool fluorescent lighting, a heating/cooling system like the heat pump that maximizes efficiency and an electronic air cleaner to be used with moving air systems.

WALLS conform to one of three options: #ONE - 6" walls with R-13\* insulation, #TWO - tongue and grooved styrofoam sheathing, 4" walls and R-11\* insulation, or #THREE - R-15\* minimum insulation. Walls must include a vapor barrier of 6 mil. polyethylene or foil-backed sheetrock. Sill insulation or sill caulking (under bottom plate) is also required.

CEILING insulation must equal R-30\*.

FLOORS (if pier and beam construction) must be insulated with R-13\*. In slab floors choose between Option #1, rigid urethane or styrofoam (3/4" minimum thickness) from top of floor along the outside edge of the slab down to the brick ledge, or Option #2, vermiculite poured in the cavity between bricks and slab up to the top of the floor.

WINDOWS AND DOORS are weather-stripped and caulked. Double pane glass or storm windows and insulated core or storm doors also ensure energy efficiency. It is recommended that glass area not exceed 8% of floor space.

\*The "R" value in the guidelines indicates the "Installed Resistance" of the insulation to the flow of heat.
