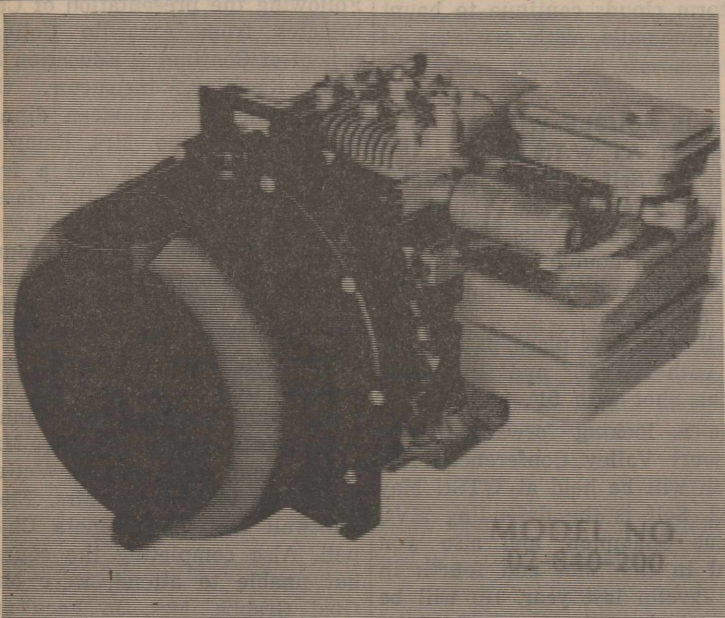

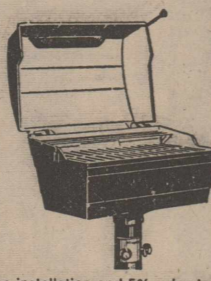

**CORRIDOR (LOCATION) AND
DESIGN (COMBINED HEARING)**
The State Department of Highways and Public Transportation is planning the construction of F.M. Road 3365, extending from State Highway 86 at a point 2.0 miles East of Silverton, North a distance of 4.8 miles, in Briscoe County.

The proposed improvements will follow the same alignment of the existing county road, with a minimum of 100 feet of right of way being required. The additional right of way will not involve any displacements, or relocations. Maps and other drawings showing the proposed location and geometric design, the Social, Economic and Environmental Assessment, and any other information about the proposed project are on file and available for inspection and copying at the office of E. H. Monroe, Engineering Technician at Clarendon, Texas. Also, drawings showing the proposed geometric design have been placed on file with the County Judge of Briscoe County.

Information about the State's Relocation Assistance Program, the benefits and services for displacements and the relocation assistance office, as well as information about the tentative schedules for acquisition of right of way and construction, can be obtained at the District Office of the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation, P. O. Box 909, Childress, Texas 79201.

Any interested citizen may request that a public hearing be held covering the social, economic, and environmental effects of the proposed location and design for this highway construction by delivering a written request to Mr. Monroe's office in Clarendon, or to the office of Mr. Lewis H. White, District Engineer of Childress, Texas, on or before May 24, 1976.

In the event such a request is received, a public hearing will be scheduled and adequate notice will be publicized about the date and location of the hearing.

LEFTOVER TURKEY NEED BE NO PROBLEM

Turkey bones, bits and skin are excellent to make stock or bouillon for soups, jellied consommé, sauces and casseroles. Turkey chunks or cubes are great in stew, pot pies, casseroles, creamed turkey, salads and specialty dishes as chow mein, turkey spaghetti

and how about turkey enchiladas. Ground turkey can be used in sandwich spreads, hash, loaves, croquettes, cutlets and turkeyburgers.

Remember to keep leftover turkey in the refrigerator and use within two or three days. Don't forget turkey freezes well for longer storage and later use.

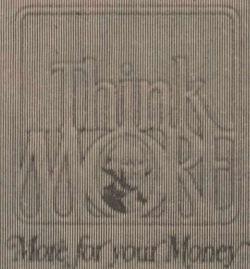

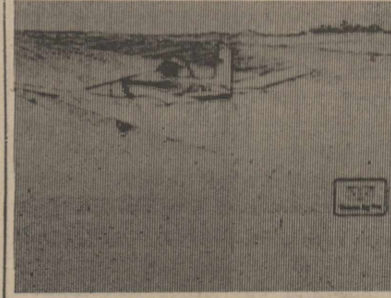
