R. S. Mr. Porter was born June 22, 1835, and was nearing his 89.h birthday when the end came. He began his career early in life, and his was a busy life from beginning to end. He was in the gold rush to California in 1849 when a stripling youth. Later he spent quite a while in Panama, long before the days of the canal. He settled in Milam county when that section was undeveloped, and engaged in business. He was promoter of the biggest mercantile establishment in Cameron, the county seat of Milam county, and his place of business was used as a banking system and the funds of the county were kept in his establishment. He was married at the age of 38 to Miss Martin, and many years of happy married life was extended to them. To this union three sons were born, two of which, with his faithful wife survive him. W. M. Porter, a son, lives with his mother and R. B., another son, lives in Oklahoma. Frank, the other son, passed to his reward only a few months ago. Mr. Porter and family came to Haskell county from Cameron in 1912 and settled on a tract of land he had purchased many years ago in the Routon City community. 

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



a good time. Because of the neglect of the home to cooperate along this line, the teachers can not reach this type of pupil. We can preach and talk and explain day after day and week after week and never reach these children.

But if the parents would talk school to their children, instill into them the desire to have good lessons, impress upon their children the value of an edneation-and the tragedy of not securing an education-then the children would be impressed by what their eachers tell them along these lines.

But many parents take little interest in school or what their children do in school. They let their children run the streets day and night-turn 12 year old boys and girls loose to go where they please; permit them to learn idle habits and associate with demoralizing companions; take no interest in their sociates, in their recreation, or the books they read if they read any. As a result of this we are turning boys and girls out by the scores into life unfitted to do anything worth while. They have a distaste for hard work but have a desire to loaf, attend picture shows and hang around cold drink stands. We are going to have to change some and very radically is dealing with our children or we will have a tragedy much worse than the World War.






