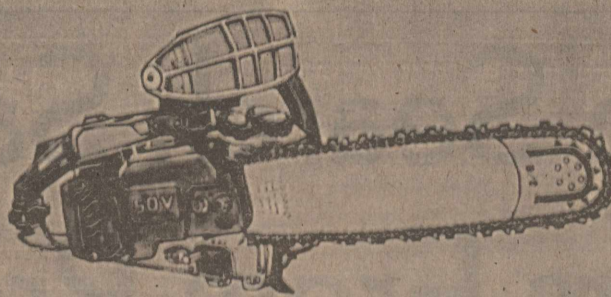

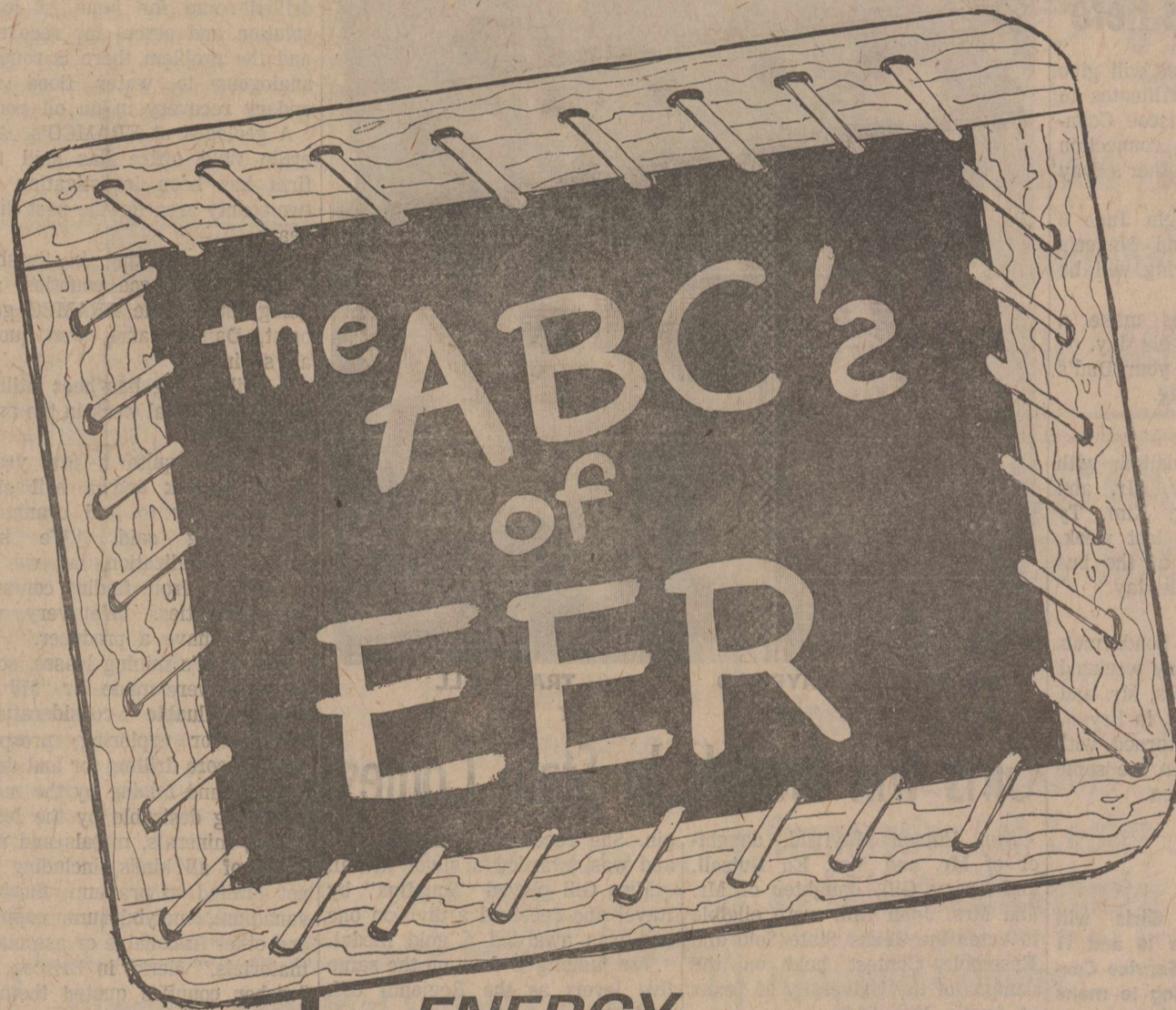

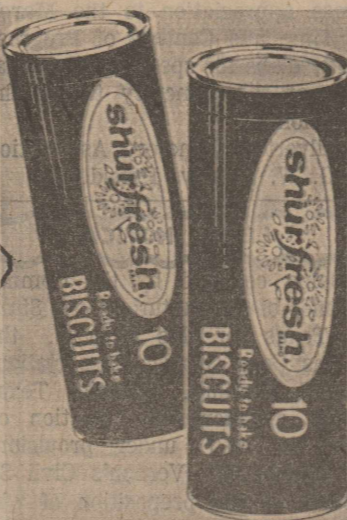

School Books Available For Inspection

Copies of every book submitted to the Texas Education Agency for the 1977 state textbook adoption will be available to all interested citizens for review at the Region XVI Education Service Center, 1601 S. Cleveland, beginning May 5, 1977. Sample books will be on file at the Service Center's resource library during regular business hours, 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday; and 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Friday.

All major publishers have submitted text materials for the Texas adoption in selected elementary and secondary school subject areas, according to Dr. Kenneth M. Laycock, Executive Director of the Education Service Center. Books will be studied in detail by members of the State Textbook Committee and their local advisors throughout the summer. The 15-member committee, which includes public school administrators and teachers, will be appointed by the State Board of Education at its May 14 meeting in Austin.

A series of public hearings will be held in Austin in order to gather citizen viewpoints and opinion before the State Board of Education makes final adoption of textbooks in early November. After that date, copies of the approved texts will be distributed to school districts, where local instructional personnel and administrators will make their choices from the adopted materials.

Elementary subjects scheduled to receive new materials include elementary Spanish for grades three through six, Texas history and geography for grade seven, and literature for grades seven and eight. Secondary subjects on the list include English composition, drama, biology, chemistry, German, Spanish, fundamentals of the free enterprise system, general business, office procedures, business mathematics, and driver education and traffic safety. New materials for instruction in all areas may be adopted for a maximum of six years.

FROM JACK HIGHTOWER

Congressman Jack Hightower today announced an action by the Small Business Administration that should help ease the credit crunch confronting so many farmers in the 13th District. The agency notified Hightower late last week that it plans to publish sometime this week in the FEDERAL REGISTER proposed regulations that would raise the size standard limitation from its current \$275,000 to \$1 million. Any agricultural producer whose annual gross receipts exceed \$275,000 will be ineligible for SBA assistance until the new standard becomes effective.

"Although this action does not solve the most difficult problem, assuring higher prices for the farmers' products, it should enable many farmers and bankers to work together to ride out this period of low market prices and unfavorable weather," Hightower said.

Hightower explained that legislation was implemented during the past session of Congress that provided for the Small Business Administration to begin assistance in the agricultural area. This legislation was welcomed by the agricultural sector of the Panhandle and North West Texas area.

It became evident, according to the 13th District Congressman, that the agency's understanding of farming operations was not clear enough to make the congressional mandate effective. The SBA proposal rules for the gross receipts eligibility limit be \$275,000. This would exclude many of our average sized farmers from the program.

This and problems with refinancing of loans prompted Hightower to request the Small Business Committee of Congress to hold hearings in Texas. A hearing was held in the Dallas-Fort Worth Airport last month in which Hightower testified along with several farmers and bankers from the 13th Congressional District. Congressman Neal Smith of Iowa, Chairman of the Committee, and other committee members were impressed with the testimony. This action along with contact Hightower has had with the agency has played a major role in this change.
