Teenager killed in shooting in Eden

WINTERS- An teenage girl was killed in a shooting in Eden, Texas on Saturday, January 17, 2015. The Concho County Sheriff's Office identified the victim as Lucero Rubio, 18-years-of-age, of Eden, Texas. According to a brief statement issued by the Sheriff's office, Rubio was killed at approximately 6:30 p.m. at a local residence during a shooting.

Chief Deputy Brent Frazier, said that the Concho County Sheriff's Office is investigating the incident. Rubio sustained a gunshot wound while at a private residence. Rubio was transported to the Concho County Medical Center in Eden, where she was later pronounced dead.

The cause of the shooting is still under investigation. No arrests have been made at this time and the Texas Rangers are assisting in the investigation.

Blizzards fall to 3-2 in district play

WINTERS- The Winters Blizzards fell to 3-2 in district play, as they lost both of last week games.

On Tuesday, the Blizzards fell to a very hot-shooting Stamford Bulldog team. The Bulldogs jumped out to a 27-9 first quarter lead, as they made 11 of 12 shots in the quarter, including five three-pointers. The Blizzards on the other hand were in a shooting slump the entire game, as they managed to score only 24 points the rest of the game, falling 57-33 to Stamford. Luke Kraatz had 9 points, while Daryl Hagle had 8.

Friday night, the Blizzards traveled to Albany, coming out on the losing end to the Lions, 59-42. The Blizzards struggled to score early, trailing 14-6 at the end of the first quarter. The second and third quarters were very similar in that every time the Blizzards made a run, the Lions would answer. Albany led 42-30 going into the final quarter, where they outscored Winters, 17-12, for the final margin. Jake Brock led all scorers with 17, while Daryl Hagle had 8.

As of press time Winters traveled to Hawley, Tuesday night, and has Haskell at home on Friday to conclude the first half of district play.

BALLINGER- With over 100 youth from the 4-H and FFA programs in Ballinger, Winters, Miles and Rowena, the Runnels County Jr. Livestock Show was held Friday, January 16 and Saturday, January 17, 2015.

This year a total of 110 participants showed just over 300 projects among swine, rabbits, goats, sheep and cattle in the event held at the Ballinger Community Center Arena.

In the results of the event, the Grand Champion Steer was exhibited by Sam Woodall

of Winters FFA, and the Reserve Grand Champion Steer was exhibited by Ethan Bredemeyer of Winters FFA. The Junior Cattle Showmanship buckle went to Ballinger 4-Her Peyton Dankworth. The Senior Cattle Showmanship buckle was awarded to Ethan Bredemeyer.

The Grand Champion Market Lamb was exhibited by Brenna Edwards - Winters FFA, and the Reserve Grand Champion Lamb was exhibited by Reagan Smithwick - Miles 4-H. The Junior Showmanship buckle was awarded to Storm Skelton - Ballinger 4-H, and the Senior

Showmanship buckle was awarded to Rachel Gibbs - Ballinger 4-H.

In the goats category Ballinger 4-Her Rachel Gibbs claimed Grand Champion honors, while the Reserve Grand Champion went to Rusty Fischer of Ballinger 4-H. Ballinger 4-H Club members Avery Flanagan and Shane Flanagan received the Junior Showmanship and Senior Showmanship buckles respectively.

The Grand Champion Swine was exhibited by Trey Matschek of Ballinger FFA. The Reserve Grand Champion Swine went to Luke Rollwitz also of Ballinger FFA. Receiving the Swine Junior Showmanship buckle was Jenna Battle - Ballinger FFA, and

the Senior Showmanship winner was Conner Schwartz of Miles FFA.

Grand Champion Breeding Gilt went to Trent Helms of Miles 4-H while the Reserve Champion Breeding Gilt honors were for Nathan Schraer of Miles FFA.

Weather Whys

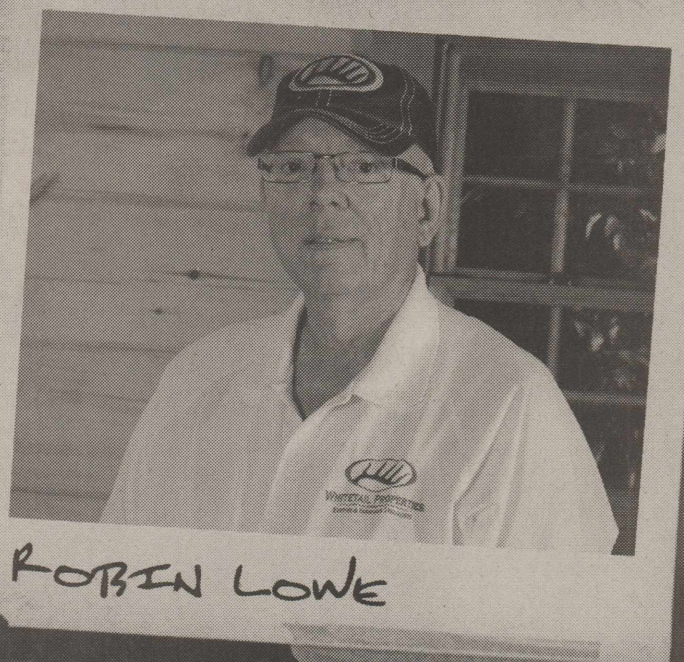
Q: How do 'El Niño' and 'La Niña' change our weather?

A: Both El Niño and La Niña events are more likely to affect the seasonal temperature and precipitation patterns during the winter than in any other season, says Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M. "In general, a La Niña period means drier weather patterns for Texas, whereas El Niño is more likely to bring wetter weather during the cold season. There have been numerous studies done on how El Niño and La Niña affect weather patterns in other seasons, and this includes hurricanes and their intensity. Some research indicates that the types of hurricanes that affect Texas are more common during La Niña periods than during neutral or El Niño periods."

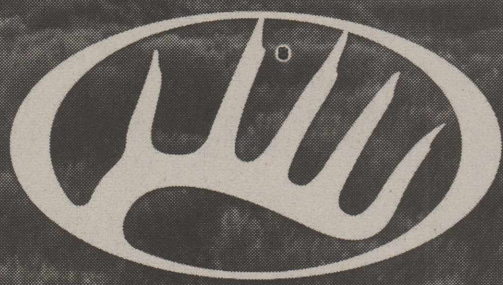

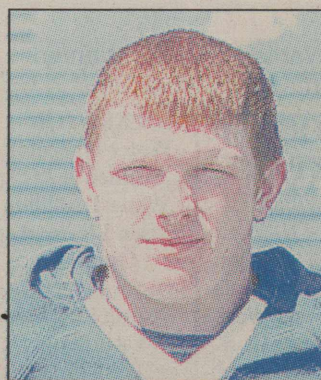

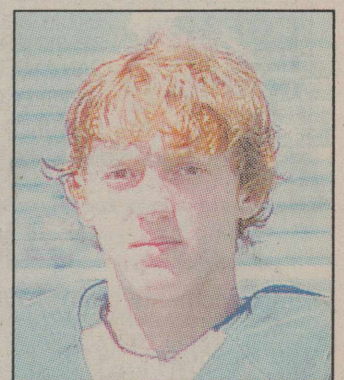
