#### The last drop

A 30 percent chance of rain is in the forecast today thanks to a residual effect from an upper level low the National Weather Service in San Angelo reports.

Long time grocery store to shutter within 30 days

t is the end of an era in Winters as Cash Saver, formerly known as Lawrence Brothers Grocery, will close, company officials say

"It was a situation where we felt like there was not enough business to justify having two supermarkets in Winters," said Jay Lawrence, president and CEO of Lawrence Brothers, based in Sweetwater.

The store which was originally a Piggly Wiggly, opened in Winters in 1966, after Jere Lawrence purchased the store. The location was called the Super Duper which was purchased from Furr's in 1990 and after that it was called Lawrence Brothers. It was renamed in 2014 and became the Cash Saver grocery store.

Lawrence said the company expects to close the location on Main Street in Winters within the next 30 days.

"We expect to close in several weeks depending on how the inventory sells," Lawrence said.

The store is no longer accepting deliveries and all of the merchandise is currently 10 percent off, Lawrence

The addition of Walmart in December of 2014 has been a major competitor for Cash Saver. Other competitors include Family Dollar which opened

Bert Humble, 89, of Winters passed away Monday, Dec. 28, 2015 in Winters.



MARYNEAL - A man was shot and killed in the small community of Maryneal, just a few miles south of Sweetwater, the Department of Public Safety reported Monday, Jan. 4.

Lonnie Odell Sturdivant, 59, of Maryneal, was reportedly shot at 4 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 2.

Following the shooting, the suspect reportedly fled in a vehicle. Lance Light, 54, was pursued by DPS, Sweetwater Police and officers from the Nolan County Sheriff's Office. Light was reportedly shot by a Sweetwater officer after he produced a gun and pointed it at officers. The pursuit ended at U.S. Interstate 20 and State Highway 70.

Light is in critical condition in a Sweetwater hospital. The officer who fired at him is on paid administrative leave.

The case is currently under investigation by the local agencies as well as the Texas Rangers.

#### VETERAN'S CORNER

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced Dec. 29, that it plans to propose expanded disability compensation eligibility for veterans exposed to contaminated drinking water while assigned to Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune. From 1953 to 1987, water sources at the base were contaminated with industrial solvents that are correlated with certain health conditions. The Department of Health and Human Sandra G. Services Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR) Van Zant determined that the drinking water at Camp Lejeune was contaminated with perchloroethylene, trichloroethylene, vinyl chloride, benzene and other petroleum contaminants from leaking storage tanks. ATSDR also determined that prolonged exposure to these chemicals increases the risk of certain health conditions. Based upon VA's review of current medical science and ATSDR's findings, Secretary McDonald intends to propose presumption of service connection for the following conditions: kidney cancer, liver cancer, non-Hodgkin Lymphoma, leukemia, multiple myeloma, scleroderma, Parkinson's Disease, aplastic anemia / myelodysplastic syndromes. The secretary's proposal would also expand benefits eligibility to Reserve and National Guard personnel who served

at Camp Lejeune for any length of time from August 1, 1953 through December 31, 1987. These personnel would be presumed to have been exposed to the contaminated water during their Reserve or National Guard service and, in appropriate circumstances, to have been disabled by such exposure during service, thus allowing them to qualify for VA benefits under the statutory definition of "veteran." This would make them eligible for VA disability compensation and medical care for any of the presumptive conditions, and their surviving dependents would be eligible for benefits. VA is working on regulations that would establish these presumptions, making it easier for affected Veterans to receive VA disability compensation for these conditions. While VA cannot grant any benefit claims based on the proposed presumption of service connection for these conditions until it issues its final regulations, it encourages veterans who have a record of service at Camp Lejeune and develop a condition that they believe is related to exposure to the drinking water at the base, to file a disability compensation claim with VA. # Reward increased to \$15,000 for fugitive from El Paso AUSTIN - The reward for Benjamin

Dominguez, 49, a Texas 10 Most Wanted Fugitive and this month's featured fugitive, has increased to \$15,000 for information leading to his capture if the tip comes in during the month of January. The Barrio Azteca gang member has an extensive criminal past and is wanted for failure to register as a sex offender and parole violation. All tips are guaranteed to be anonymous. Dominguez is believed to be a transient, and he has lived in El Paso; Socorro, Texas;

Las Cruces, N.M.; and Modesto, Calif. His criminal history includes indecency with a child, assault causing bodily injury and burglary. Dominguez was previously featured by the U.S. Marshals Service during Operation Guardian, a national initiative that targeted the country's most dangerous noncompliant sex offenders. The higher reward amount will only be paid if the tip comes in the same month the fugitive is featured. All calls, texts, emails and Facebook tip messages are anonymous.



"We are disappointed that Cash Saver has decided to close the store in Winters," said Randall Conner, economic development director of the Winters Area Business and Industrial Corporation. "It has been a primary business in the Winters community for many years.

There are currently 15-20 full and part-time employees at the Cash Saver, which is under the Cost Plus model of stores, Lawrence said.

"We do have severance packages for those employees who are not opting to move to another location," Law-

As for the employees who have not opted to move to other company locations, Conner said WABIC will work with them to help them find new jobs.

'The Winters Area Business and Industrial Corporation will strive to secure another business for the location and will work through the West Central Texas Workforce Solutions to help the employees find new employment,"

The Winters location is the second store to shutter in recent months. Lawrence Brothers closed the Merkel store in September.

The building, which underwent remodeling a little over a year ago, is leased, Lawrence said.

Conner said he is hopeful that the new year will bring new opportunities in Winters. "Most small communities go through continual grow-

ing pains," Conner said. "As we see new businesses develop in town, others fade away. Fortunately, Winters has seen a small growth in business from year to year as evidenced by sales tax receipts and other statistics.
