### Summer Food Service Program

Winters ISD is participating in the Summer Food Service Program. ### The last drop

Rain continues to fall on Runnels County and the events have put 2016 in the top five wettest springs for Runnels County. Ballinger tallied 2.07 inches of precipitation while Wingate received 2.14 inches of rain according to the National Weather Service in San Angelo.

Rain chances continue today, with a 60 percent chance of precipitation and severe weather is forecast today and tonight. The rain chances diminish Friday to 40 percent with a high reaching only 79. Dryer weather is in the forecast for the weekend and early next week.

So far this year, Ballinger has received 13.29 inches of rainfall, with 13.27 inches reported in Wingate and 15.42 inches received in San Angelo making 2016 the wettest spring on record there.

# Just Around the Corner Oh the Places You will Go!

"Oh, the places you'll go..." an apropos book by Dr. Seuss, is the perfect sendoff for the estimated 101 former students from Ballinger and Winters who are now graduates.

Ahh, to wake up in the afterglow of graduation — it is an exciting, yet bewildering time because kiddos are in that gray area between being a teen and an adult and wondering what lies ahead.
