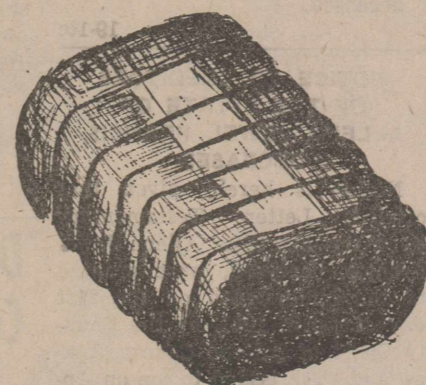
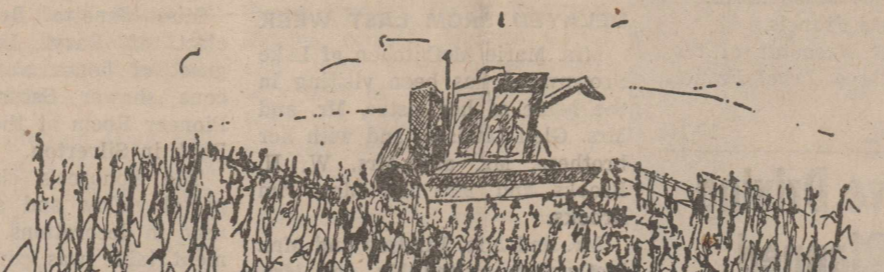

## Mon. Is Kindergarten Registration Day

Monday, May 11, from 8:30 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. has been designated for identification of the five-year-old children who will be eligible for kindergarten next year. On that day the children will be registered and records begun on them. Parents should bring birth and immunization records.

That day a series of tests called the Developmental Indicators for the Assessment of Learning (DIAL) will be administered to the children. The test will screen students for:

- (1) Gross Motor Skills—throwing, catching, jumping, hopping, skipping, standing still and balancing performance.
- (2) Fine Motor Skills—visual matching, block building, cutting, copying, small muscle agility and pattern/tempo reproduction performance.
- (3) Concept Skills—sorting blocks, naming colors, counting, positioning, following directions, thinking, reasoning knowledge and identifying body parts.
- (4) Communication Skills—short term memory, use of nouns and verbs, problem solving, self-identification, classification and story telling.

Parents may discuss specific concerns with a counselor/diagnostician. The diagnostician will also discuss test results with the parent.

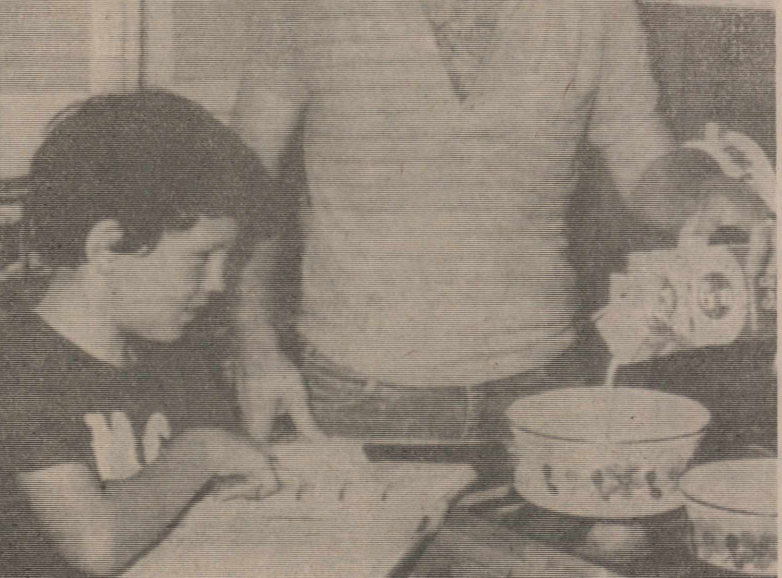
## Social Security Representative's Schedule Changed

When John wants to talk about his biological parents, they talk. If he wants to talk to some of his former foster parents, they call them. Wilson wants to keep John in touch with his past as much as possible.

"John says he wants a brother and when the right time comes we will get him a brother. If I ever had the opportunity to adopt his own brother I certainly would do that," Wilson said. "My advice to a single who wants to be a parent would be to 'define yourself... don't pay attention to what others tell you or think you should do'... because I know first-hand what I would have missed if I had let people talk me out of what I wanted to do," Wilson said.

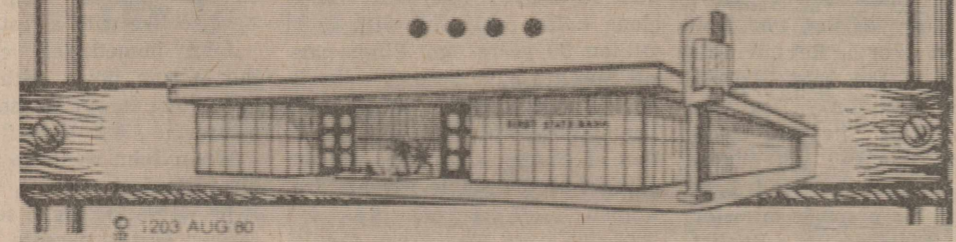

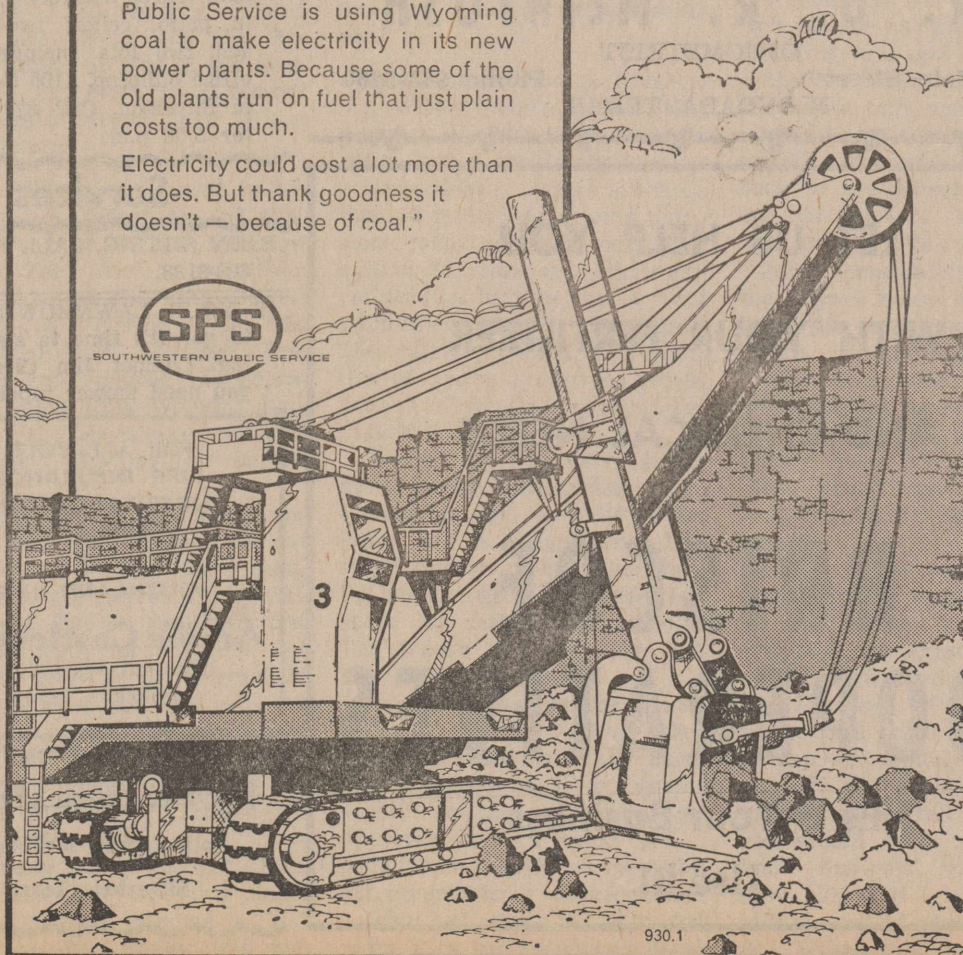
