NIGHT-FLYING MOTHS CREATE NUISANCE

Night-flying moths, mainly cutworm moths, often become a nuisance to homeowners in the spring.

The moths are attracted to light and are sometimes referred to as "candlemoths."

Night-flying moths are difficult to control. The following steps alone or in combination with others, may provide some relief under favorable conditions:

—Reduce the attraction of the site.

—Intercept moths before they reach the site.

—Exclude moths from the house.

—Destroy moths which get into the house.

Reduce the attraction of moths to a house or buildings through proper light management. This often provides substantial relief. Use indirect lighting where practical so the light source is shielded from areas from which moths may come. Locate inside light fixtures so that moths outside cannot see the lamp itself.

There is little evidence that any light repels insects, but a yellow light is least attractive to most insects.

During periods of heavy moth flights, keep outside lighting at a minimum.

Insect light traps can intercept moths before they become a nuisance. Place such traps at least 100 feet away from a house or building.

To exclude moths from houses or buildings, properly screen windows and doors as well as air vents and ventilating ducts.

Household insecticides can control moths to some degree. Spray where moths collect and rest outside, such as door frames, window sills, carports, porches and garages. Since moths do not feed on anything where they are resting and are protected by a heavy coating of scales, sprays will not provide any immediate or spectacular results.

Apply ready-to-use household spray formulations of diazinon and baygon to resting sites and cracks and crevices where moths may enter buildings. Be sure to follow label instructions for "nuisance pest" control. Add a commercial wetting agent or a teaspoon of liquid detergent per gallon of mixed spray to increase effectiveness.

Once moths get inside the house or building, a vacuum cleaner often gives the best control. A household pyrethrin aerosol spray will also control moths inside a room. Again, be sure to check the label on the container when using any insecticide.

What's new under the sun? — Solar food. That's what you might call one of the world's oldest food preservation techniques — food drying. However, with electric food dehydrators and modern ovens, few people use the sun for food drying.

This year's apricot crop has prompted many of you to try drying apricots. I have had several requests from you for drying information. The Extension Office has an excellent publication, "Drying Fruits and Vegetables at Home," that is free to you upon request.

One of three methods of preparation before drying is sulfurizing. I asked the local pharmacist if he could obtain sulphur, and he can. However, this method is recommended for drying outdoors because of the odor and

STATEMENT OF INTENT TO CHANGE RATES

General Telephone Company of the Southwest, in accordance with the Rules of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, hereby gives notice of the Company's intent to implement a new schedule of rates in Texas effective October 1, 1981.

On April 28, 1981, the Public Utility Commission of Texas issued its order in Docket 3690, creating a separate Docket 3861 to consider the impact and effect of the accounting changes ordered by the Federal Communications Commission (CC Docket 79-105).

The Federal Communications Commission has changed the method of accounting for inside wiring costs associated with the one-time station connection, move, or change activity. The new rate schedule will increase the Company's gross annual revenue derived from local service by no more than three percent. The schedule of rates and charges is available for inspection at each Company business office in the State of Texas.

fumes. The other two methods for apricots are steam blanching and syrup blanching. One of these three methods must be used to preserve color, stop enzyme growth, and preserve nutrients and quality. An Extension food and nutrition specialist in Minnesota found that there can be significant nutrient loss in home dried foods if the proper methods are not used and the food is not packaged and stored properly.

Also, remember that the quality of the finished product can be no better than the original fresh product, so choose the very best fruits to preserve.

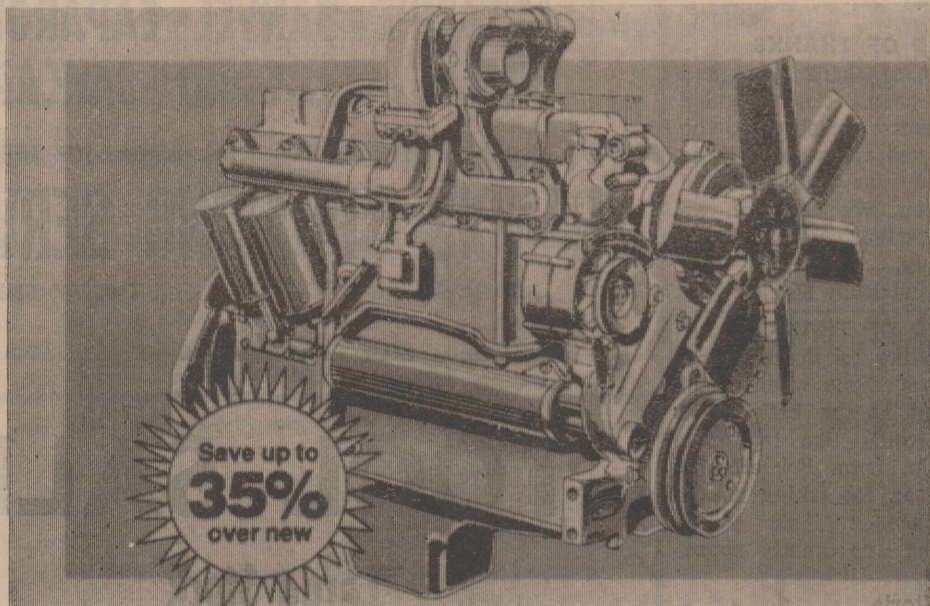

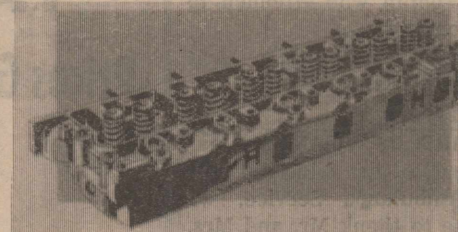

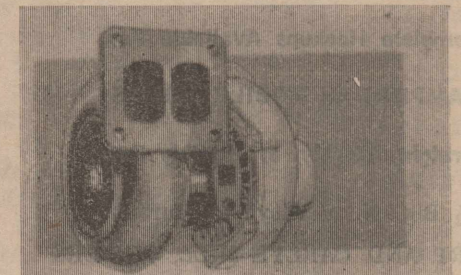
