There are only the four schools playing in the tournament.

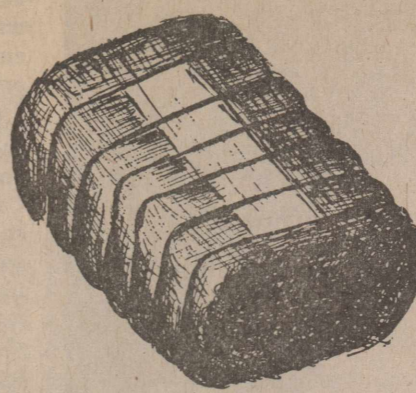
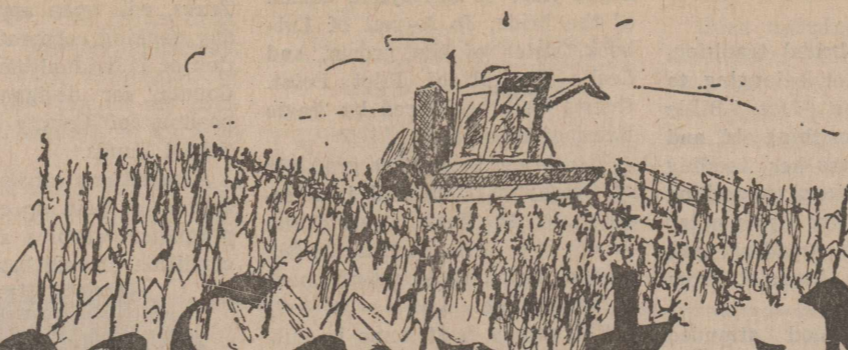
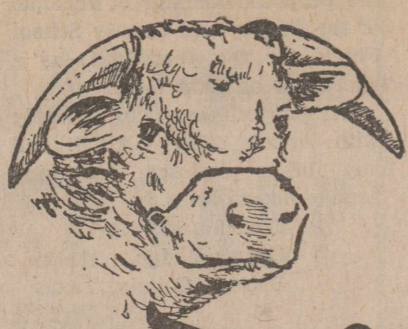

Texas Young Farmers To Note 27th Year In Waco Convention

The Silverton Young Farmer Chapter will be participating in the observance of the 27th year of the organization in Texas at a convention January 22-24 in Waco.

Members of the Silverton YFT delegation will join other Young Farmer leaders from the 200 Texas chapters to hear speakers about agriculture, trade experiences, to receive awards, and to conduct business of the organization.

Club Collecting Used Postage Stamps

As part of an effort that sent 50,000 meals to children in Bangladesh (in Asia) last year, members of the Southwestern Extension Homemakers Club in Silverton are collecting used postage stamps again this year.

Club members' participation in the program is in cooperation with the Salvation Army, which sells the stamps to collectors

and uses the money to buy food for undernourished children in Bangladesh. Last year Texas Extension Homemakers Clubs collected 446,830 stamps.

According to the Salvation Army, for each dollar it earns in the stamp market, 10 meals can be purchased abroad.

Collecting used stamps takes only a few seconds of anyone's time, and they're available almost everywhere since everyone receives mail. Extension Homemakers club members collect the stamps, trim them, leaving a one-half inch border on all sides, and mail them to Salvation Army headquarters.

If you would like to save postage stamps for this cause, collect them and bring them to the Extension Office in the Court-house basement or give them to Mrs. Polly Jarrett or any other Southwestern Extension Homemaker club member.
