

### Windbreaks Are Both Functional, Ornamental

Modern windbreaks are both functional and ornamental. Getting suitable trees was a problem in the past. Now many more varieties of evergreens and attractive species like Russian Olive are available to farmers at a very reasonable price.

The Caprock Soil and Water Conservation District will help anyone who wants to plant a windbreak to get the trees they need.

Small trees need plenty of water. A properly designed drip irrigation system is inexpensive and will help assure a high survival rate. Planting the trees in a shallow ditch will also make watering easier and more effective. The Soil Conservation Service will design a system for your needs.

Weeds have been a problem in the past. Trees should be planted far enough apart to permit cultivation with farm equipment or a garden tractor. Trees should be planted early next year. Young trees should be planted as soon as possible after they

Call any Caprock SWCD director or the Soil Conservation Service in Silverton if you want trees for windbreaks. A wide variety of trees will be available.
