

This enables the department to be back in service in a day or two.

The fire department and the Silverton Volunteer Ambulance Service will be working together in a combined rescue effort whenever the Hurst Tool is used. Quite often, both departments are needed at the scene of an accident and most of the members of the ambulance service are also members of the fire department. The ambulance service has

purchased several items its members hoped they would never need-but not one of them has not been used.

The Hurst Tool may help prevent someone from dying or burning in the wreckage of an automobile.

The fire department is in need of donations to help defray the cost of purchasing the Hurst Tool. It is a very expensive item at \$9,458.28, but was purchased in time to avoid a 12% increase in the price which was to go into effect immediately.
