

## Silverton Pledge Center To Support Telethon

In conjunction with the Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon, local residents will be operating a pledge center in Silverton. Lois Hill will be the coordinator for the telethon, and Betty Stephens will be the center coordinator this year. The pledge center will be located at First State Bank, and will be open during the same hours as the telethon, from 8:00 p.m. Sunday, September 6, to 6:30 p.m. Monday, September 7.

Residents in Silverton can call a special number during those hours to make their pledges to the telethon, in support of the Muscular Dystrophy Association. The number which has been assigned to operate during the 2 1/2 hour telethon will be 823-2426.

Pledge center volunteers are also planning a door-to-door drive for Labor Day. Children interested in helping Jerry's Kids should come by the center location on Monday, September 7, to pick up an official canister, telethon badge and instructions. In addition, anyone wishing to volunteer time to answer phones or assist with pledge center activities should contact Betty Stephens, the center coordinator.

The telethon will be broadcast in the Panhandle area by KFDD-TV, Channel 10, which will cut away from the network show for approximately 15 minutes out of every hour. The cut away will feature recognition of fund-raising events in the Panhandle area, in addition to first-hand reports of pledge center activities.

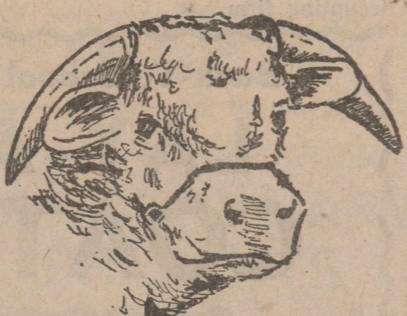

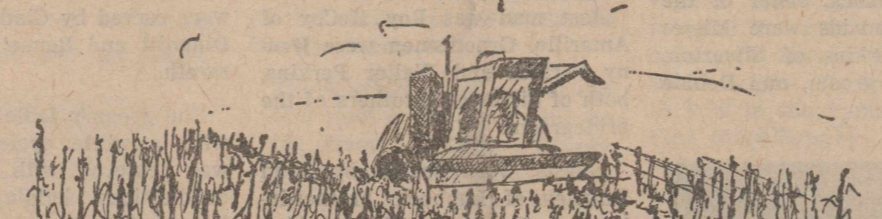

## Notice To Taxpayers

On August 28, the Briscoe County, Silverton Independent School District, and City of Silverton Tax Offices will mail to each taxpayer a notice showing the new valuation for each parcel of taxable property in the taxing district.

The notice will show the amount of taxes paid the past year and the amount that would be payable if the same tax rate was used on the new valuation. However, each taxing unit will be using a smaller tax rate than is shown on the notice and the amount of taxes for 1981 WILL NOT be as much as shown.

All taxpayers will have an opportunity to meet with employees of Jim McMorries and Co. September 16-17-18 to discuss their values if necessary. If a taxpayer feels his value is too

high, this is his opportunity to compare his property with similar property on the roll.

The Board of Review (formerly called Board of Equalization) will be in session September 21. If, after meeting with the McMorries employees, the taxpayer still feels that his value is not fair and equitable with similar properties, he should meet with the Board of Review.

## TIFFIN BROTHERS WIN SECOND IN WESTERN CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

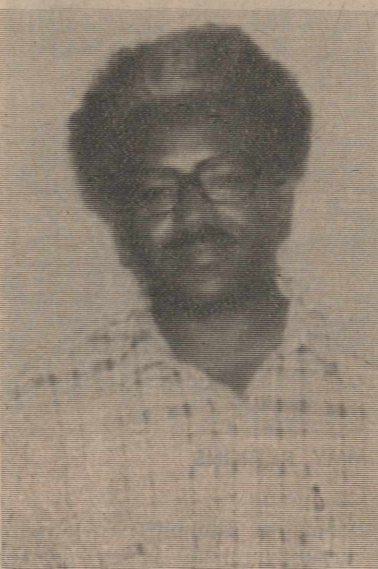

## Briscoe County Has Visitor From Sudan

Briscoe County had a special visitor Monday. Mohammed El Amin Ahmed Babikir from Elobeid, Sudan spent the day with John Crowell of the Soil Conservation Service, touring the county to learn about soil conservation practices used by American farmers. Mr. Babikir is the regional manager for the Department of Natural Resources, Land Use, and Soil Conservation, located in the Kordofan Province of Sudan.

In Briscoe County Mr. Babikir observed the way farmers use terraces, waterways, brush control, grazing systems, and irrigation to improve their farming operations and conserve the soil. Mr. Babikir was especially impressed with the machinery used by American farmers and said that in Sudan most of the work is still done with hand labor.

Sudan has a climate that rarely drops below 60 degrees Fahrenheit, and is usually above 100. Rainfall is usually limited to 10 inches or less per year. Sudan's principle crops include cotton, wheat, sugar cane, millet, and rice. Sudan is a relatively poor country compared to the United States or the oil rich states of the Middle East, but recent oil discoveries in Sudan may help improve the economics of the country.

Mr. Babikir is touring the United States looking for ways to help Sudan farmers improve their agricultural production while conserving what soil and water resources they have.
