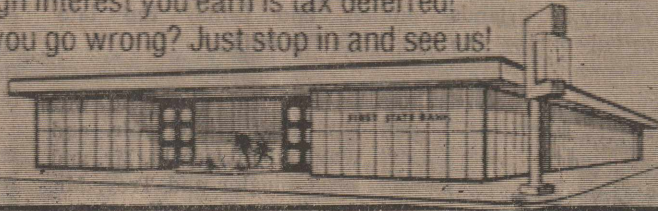

applicant, seeks an amendment to Permit No. 2297 pursuant to §11.122, Texas Water Code, and Rules 156.04.10.001-002 (31 TAC §§307.21 and 307.22) to authorize a transwatershed diversion to use up to 5200 acre-feet of water authorized to be diverted from Lake Mackenzie, an authorized 46,450 acre-foot capacity reservoir on Tule Creek, tributary of Prairie Dog Town Fork Red River, tributary of Red River, for municipal and industrial purposes in its service area which includes the cities of Tulia in Swisher County and Silverton in Briscoe County, Red River Basin (watershed of origin), and the cities of Lockney and Floydada in Floyd County, Brazos River Basin (watershed of delivery). Applicants do not request any change in the rate, period or amount of water to be diverted, and no change other than the transwatershed authorization is requested, all being more fully set out in the application.

Application No. 2528A was accepted for filing on July 19, 1982, and a hearing thereon will be held by the Commission in the Stephen F. Austin State Office Building at 1700 North Congress Avenue in Austin, Texas, on August 26, 1982, at 2 o'clock p.m. Any person who intends to offer prepared testimony at the public hearing shall prefile the testimony with the Chief Clerk of the Commission not less than five days prior to the hearing, and shall serve copies of prepared testimony on the applicant, the Executive Director and Public Interest Advocate of the Department of Water Resources and all other persons who have filed written requests not less than eight days prior to the hearing. The Commission may authorize the late filing of prepared testimony upon a showing of good cause and extenuating circumstances. Any person who desires to receive prepared testimony shall file a written protest or a written request with the Commission not less than eight days prior to the hearing.

Those opposing the granting of this application may appear at the hearing and/or, not less than eight days before the hearing date, may file written protests with the Commission and serve copies on the applicant with proof of service to be provided to the Commission. Written protests shall contain the name and address of the protestant, an identification of the pending application, the basis of protestant's interest, location of protestant's interest, location of protestant's diversion point(s) or property, if applicable and any amendments or adjustments to the application which would result in a withdrawal of the protest. The written protest will be noted by the Commission but will not be considered as evidence since the right to cross-examine is absent. No protestant will be admitted as a party to the proceedings unless the protestant complies with Commission Rule 155.04.00.001 (31 TAC §267.1) which requires a justiciable interest and actual or representative presence at the hearing. Due to the technical nature of the hearing, it may be advisable for the protestant to have an expert witness, such as an engineer, available at the hearing. 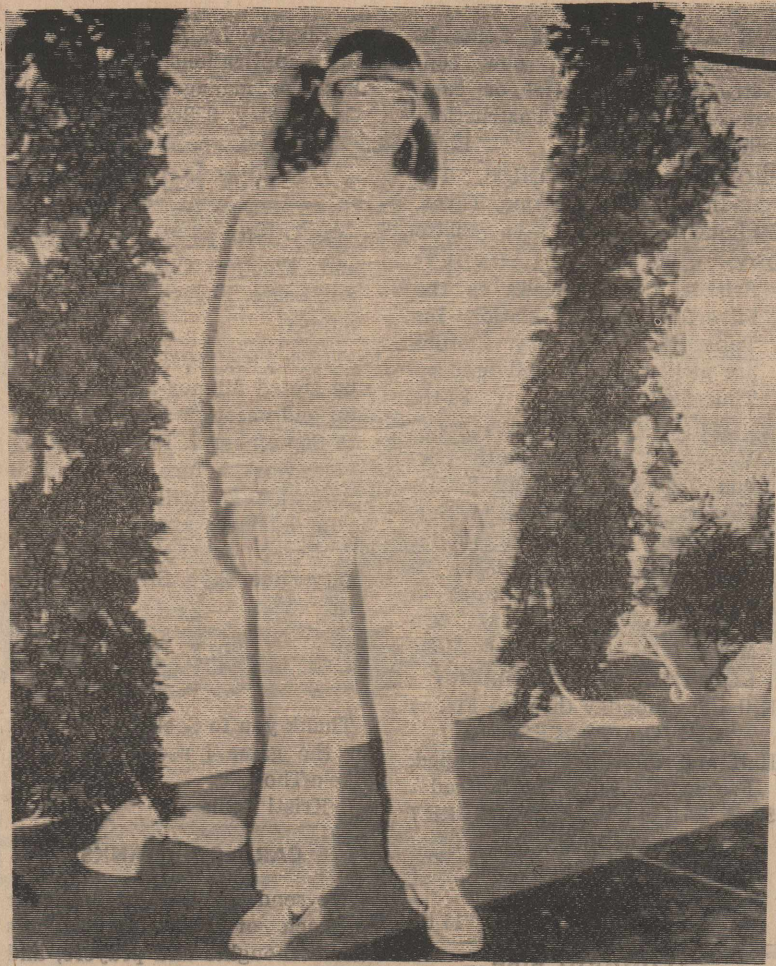

**STARCH BLOCKERS**

The Food and Drug Administration has asked more than 100 manufacturers and distributors of "starch blockers" to discontinue marketing them until scientific testing confirms the safety and efficacy of these weight management products.

Starch blockers are prepared from raw beans, such as kidney and northern beans, and possibly unknown ingredients. The products have been advertised and sold nationwide with claims that they block or impede starch digestion and thus help in weight control and weight reduction by preventing absorption of carbohydrates.

Users of the products have complained to FDA of nausea, vomiting, diarrhea and stomach pains. Persons with diabetes should not depend on starch blockers in calculating their diets.

Information supporting claims of safety or effectiveness in weight control or weight reduction has not been provided to FDA. FDA is also concerned about the safety of long-term use of starch blockers because of the lack of adequate safety testing data.

FDA, by letter, has asked the firms to discontinue marketing starch blockers and to provide the agency specific information about their manufacture and distribution. If the companies fail to comply within 10 days, FDA will then consider regulatory ac-
