



# DEAR EDITOR:

I know you don't publish many "letters to the editor" (and I don't write many) but I hope you'll find room for this one.

Recently I have received several letters reminding me of my 10-year class reunion. Unfortunately I will not be able to attend, but I have been thinking back on my years in the Silverton schools.


