In 1926 she married her childhood sweetheart, Dean Allard, and to this union was born a son, Joe Lynn Allard, on July 29, 1929. She also helped rear a nephew, Billy Don Stevenson.

Mrs. Allard was the first lunchroom supervisor for the Silverton School System. Former students and teachers still remember her peanut butter cookies and other goodies.

Joe Lynn Allard passed away March 13, 1967, and Dean Allard passed away August 23, 1976.

The little white house on Pulitzer Street is home away from home to many people. Mrs. Allard holds continual open house and her hospitality is appreciated by everyone who drops by.

gest that it will be a popular attraction for that part of the state, and should draw visitors from both near and far.

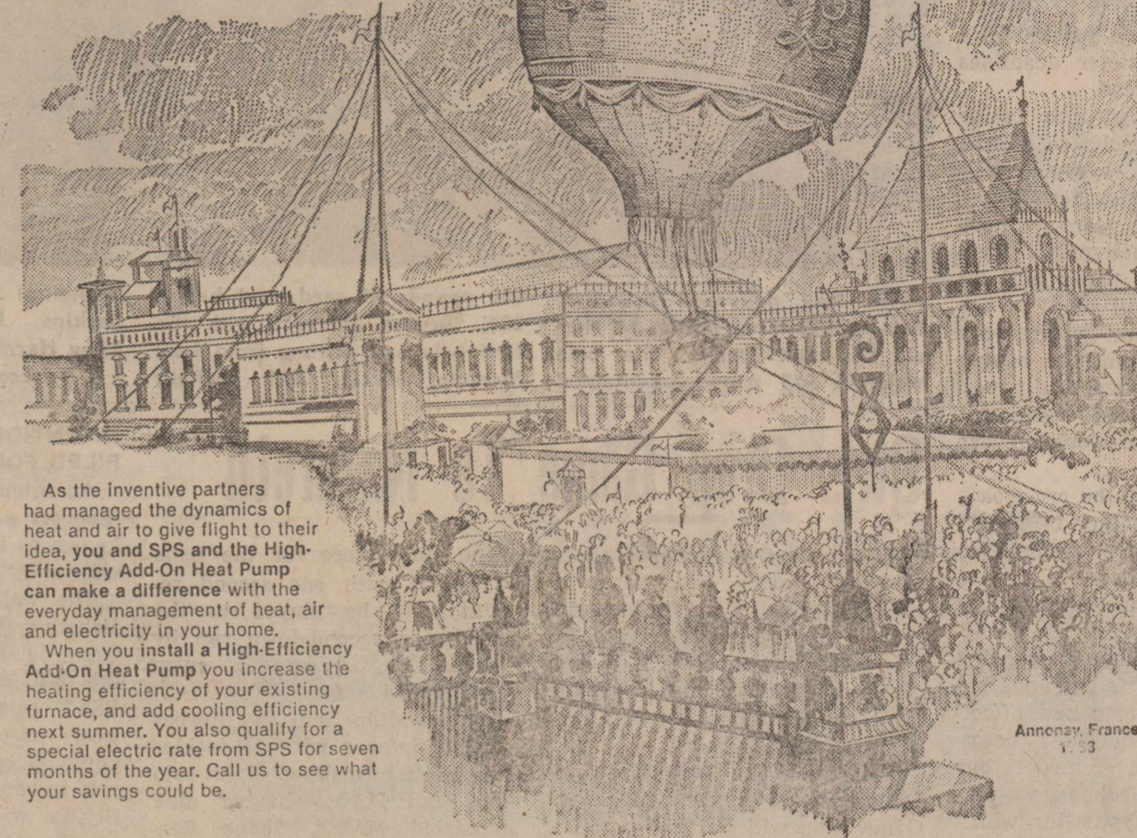
