Mr. Holt, who had resided at the Lockney Care Center for the past five years, died at 6:30 a.m. Thursday, March 10, at Methodist Hospital in Lubbock where he had been a patient for about three weeks.
Born August 1, 1896 in Huckabay County, he was the son of the late G. C. and Emma Huckaby Holt. He came to Briscoe County with his parents in a covered wagon in 1900 .
