Wheeler I.S.D. will hold an election on Saturday, March 7 to name two members to the Board of Trustees.

Places 7 and 8 are the two seats on the board to be filled. These seats are presently held by Ike Finsterwald and Kent Ware.

Deadline for filing for a place on the board is Friday, February 19. Finsterwald has filed for re-election and Wade Butler has filed to have his name on the ballot for Place 8.

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County met in regular session on Monday, February 8, 2016, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00 a.m. court was reconvened to consider twelve items on the agenda.

• Minutes of previous meetings were approved as presented.

• The monthly reports of the Justices of the Peace, County Tax Assessor, Treasurer, County Clerk and District Clerk were accepted by the court.

• An adjustment in the Justices of the Peace budgets was made.

• No line transfers in the budget were made.

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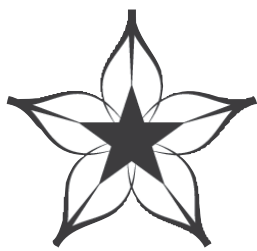

Below is an excellent resource for stocker cattle producers. Information

was provided by Dr. Ted McCollum, Texas AgriLife Beef Cattle Specialist in Amarillo.

A balanced mineral supplement will significantly improve performance of stocker cattle on small grains pasture

Well-designed trials demonstrated that stocker cattle consuming a balanced mineral supplement while grazing small grains pasture gained on 0.19 to 0.24 lb/d (Ave. 0.22 lb/d)

This equates to an additional 22 lb gain for every 100 days of grazing

Using a \$10/cwt slide and deferred feeder cattle futures prices, the additional gain is worth about \$1.00/lb or \$22/hd/100 d grazing

At the targeted 0.25 lb (4 oz)/d intake and \$1.00 value of added gain, then the breakeven (maximum) cost of the supplement \$1760/ton

In these same trials, adding the ionophore Rumensin to the mineral supplement

increased daily gains another 0.19 to 0.23 lb/d (Ave. 0.21 lb/d) compared to mineral only

This equates to an additional 21 lb gain for every 100 days of grazing

The purpose of a federal operating permit is to improve overall compliance with the rules governing air pollution control by clearly listing all applicable requirements, as defined in Title 30 Texas Administrative Code § 122.10 (30 TAC § 122.10). The draft permit, if approved, will codify the conditions under which the area must operate. The permit will not authorize new construction. The executive director has completed the technical review of the application and has made a preliminary decision to prepare a draft permit for public comment and review. The executive director recommends issuance of this draft permit. At the TCEQ central and regional offices, relevant supporting materials for the draft permit, as well as the New Source Review permits which have been incorporated by reference, may be reviewed and copied. Public Comment/Notice and Comment Hearing. Any person may submit written comments on the draft permit. Comments relating to the accuracy, completeness, and appropriateness of the permit conditions may result in changes to the draft permit.

A person who may be affected by the emission of air pollutants from the permitted area may request a notice and comment hearing. The purpose of the notice and comment hearing is to provide an additional opportunity to submit comments on the draft permit. The permit may be changed based on comments pertaining to whether the permit provides for compliance with 30 TAC Chapter 122 (examples may include that the permit does not contain all applicable requirements or the public notice procedures were not satisfied). The TCEQ may grant a notice and comment hearing on the application if a written hearing request is received within 30 days after publication of the newspaper notice. The hearing request must include the basis for the request, including a description of how the person may be affected by the emission of air pollutants from the application area. The request should also specify the conditions of the draft permit that are inappropriate or specify how the preliminary decision to issue or deny the permit is inappropriate. All reasonably ascertainable issues must be raised and all reasonably available arguments must be submitted by the end of the public comment period. If a notice and comment hearing is granted, all individuals that submitted written comments or a hearing request will receive written notice of the hearing. This notice will identify the date, time, and location for the hearing.

Written public comments and/or requests for a notice and comment hearing should be submitted to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, Office of the Chief Clerk, MC-105, P.O. Box 13087, Austin, Texas 78711-3087, or electronically at www.tceq.texas.gov/about/comments.html and be received within 30 days after the date of newspaper publication of this notice. If you communicate with the TCEQ electronically, please be aware that your email address, like your physical mailing address, will become part of the agency's public record.

A notice of proposed final action that includes a response to comments and identification of any changes to the draft permit will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments, a hearing request, or requested to be on the mailing list for this application. This mailing will also provide instructions for public petitions to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to request that the EPA object to the issuance of the proposed permit. After receiving a petition, the EPA may only object to the issuance of a permit which is not in compliance with the applicable requirements or the requirements of 30 TAC Chapter 122.

In addition to submitting public comments, a person may ask to be placed on a mailing list for this application by sending a request to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address above. Those on the mailing list will receive copies of future public notices (if any) mailed by the Chief Clerk for this application.

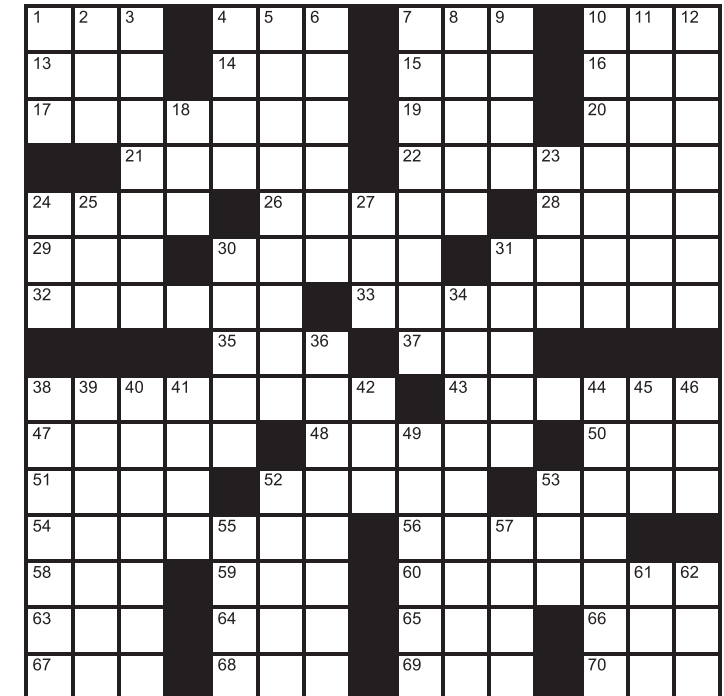
