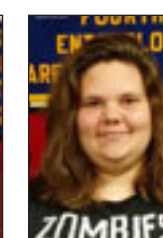

panel. Only 150 students out of the whole state get this award. His artwork will be traveling all over the state of Texas until November 2017. Statewide more than 31,000 students participated in the 20 regional VASE events. There were 2,048 state qualifiers competing. The top 8% received a Superior Rating (IV).

Students are not interviewed at the State Event. However panels of jurors evaluate each state entry to determine the degree that each work demonstrates originality of concept, technical expertise, understanding of the TEKS, and the interpretation of the student's stated intent. The state jury panel evaluates qualified artwork using a numeric rating system based on an established state rubric. Artworks receiving a Superior Rating (IV) are awarded the State VASE medallion.

The mission of the TAEA Visual Arts Scholastic Event (VASE) is to recognize exemplary student achievement in the Visual Arts by providing art students and programs a standard of excellence in which to achieve.

Felipe Covarrubia and Justin Baker are juniors at Kelton ISD. Justin is an Art I student and Felipe is an Art II student. Quentin Parker is a Senior Art III student. Congratulation Felipe, Justin, and Quentin for being among the best in TEXAS!

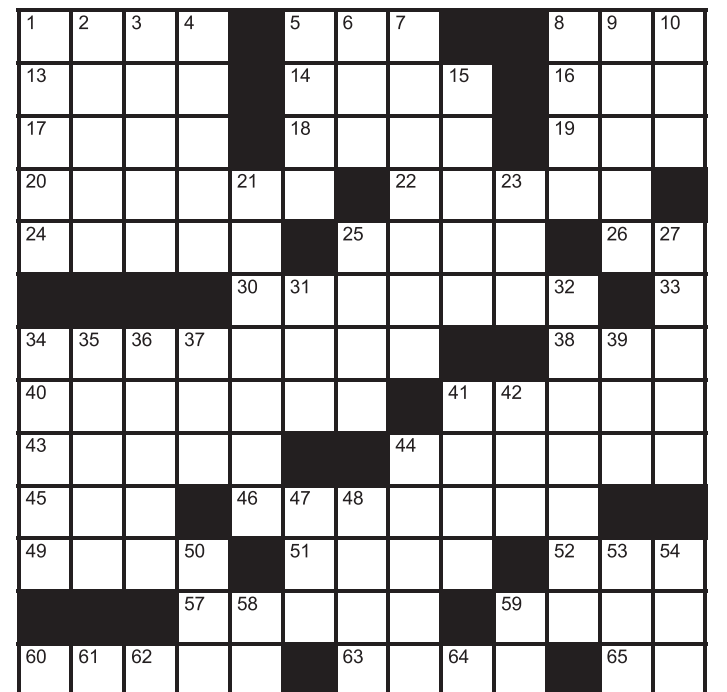

GOIN' TO CALIFORNIA

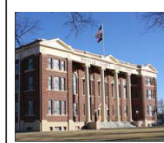

Welders were in much demand, so he bought a small trailer house and went to one construction job after another, never staying long at one place. One of the jobs he went to, was in California. Shirley was a small kid and always sat in the back seat, with her coloring book and crayolas. Since getting bored, from so many hours on the road, she would stand up on her knees in the back seat and lean forward with her

arms on the top of the front seats. This way, she could ask the name of every town they went through, and how much farther was it. She said, at that age, she talked a lot and asked one question after another. As luck would have it, her dad stopped and picked up a young man who was "hitch hiking." Naturally, he had to sit in the back with her, which she considered a good deal. Now she had someone to talk to all she wanted. She said she talked to him almost constantly for the next hundred miles or so,

pausing only to take a breath. For some reason, he decided not to go as far as he originally said, because he asked her dad to let him out at the next town. Some people are hard to figure.

TORNADO SEASON AT HAND

The next few months are "tornado season" in Texas, so a few pointers and safety tips on tornadoes are in order, says Dale Dunlap, County Agent with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service. Here are a few general facts about tornadoes: **Tornadoes generally travel an average speed of 30 miles per hour but have been clocked at 70 miles an hour. **Tornadoes normally move from southwest to northeast although their direction of travel can be erratic and change suddenly. **Tornadoes are often spawned in thunderstorms that have accompanying large hail. **Most tornado damage is caused by violent winds but most tornado injuries and deaths result from flying debris. **Tornado winds may produce a loud roar similar to that of a train or airplane. **Tornadoes can occur with little or no warning although most occur during the mid afternoon or early evening hours. Stay tuned to weather forecasts during times of unsettled weather. When a tornado or severe thunderstorm "watch" is issued, it means that tornadoes or severe weather are possible in the area designated. On the other hand, a tornado or severe thunderstorm "warning" means that tornadoes or severe weather are occurring. Persons in or near the storm path need to TAKE COVER IMMEDIATELY! **Stay away from windows, doors and outside walls. **In small buildings or homes, go to a basement or an interior part of the lowest level. Closets, bathrooms and interior halls offer the best protection many cases. Seek cover under something sturdy. **In schools, local businesses or hospitals go to a pre-designed shelter area. Interior hallways on the lower floor are usually best. **In mobile homes or vehicles, leave and take shelter in a substantial structure. If none is available, lie flat in the nearest ditch or ravine and shield your head with your hands. The key to surviving severe weather such as a tornado is prior planning. All family members should know where the safest areas of the home are in event of threatening weather. Prepare in advance. 1. Watch weather bulletins on area television stations. 2. Tune radio to local stations for weather updates. 3. Purchase a weather radio which will give you all alerts. 4. Place weather apps on cell phones to keep you updated.


