and documented through the Historic Texas Cemetery designation process to record their historic association and significance.

"This designation is a tool that will increase public awareness of these important cultural resources," said Mark Wolfe, executive director of the THC. "Knowledge and education are among the best ways to guarantee the preservation of a historic cemetery."

Cemeteries hold valuable historic information and they are often the last reminders of early settlements' historical events, religious beliefs, lifestyles and genealogy. While the Historic Texas

Cemetery designation encourages cemetery preservation, it cannot guarantee that a historic cemetery will avoid destruction. Threats to historic cemeteries include urban expansion and development, vandalism, grazing animals and long-term deterioration from weather and uncontrolled vegetation.

The THC developed the Historic Texas Cemetery designation to address the destruction of historic cemeteries and the illegal removal of cemetery fixtures. Any individual or organization is eligible to submit an application for this designation.

**HISTORICAL BACKGROUND**

The Simpson Family Burial Site is located east and north of Mobeetie in Wheeler County. Its name is associated with the original owner of the land, William Hawkins Simpson, and his family members believed to be buried there. A cement curbing, almost obscured by time and its location in a grassy CRP field, measures approximately sixteen square feet. W.H. Simpson received a patent from the state of Texas in 1894 for this land. Nearby, is a historical mesa, Bankhead Mound, where mirrors were placed and used to flash signals warning Ft. Elliott soldiers of approaching Indians.

W.H. Simpson and his wife, Minnerva Stephens Simpson, came to Mobeetie by train from Pendleton County, Kentucky at the suggestion of Minnerva's brother, Zeke Stephens in 1886. According to Walter Simpson's (W.H.'s son) oral history in "Light'n Hitch", W.H. Simpson's father, Nathaniel Simpson, came with them to Texas. W.H.'s mother, Mary Aydelott, had died in 1885 in Kentucky. W.H. first leased land from two brothers, Saeb and Ben Merry. Later, he obtained the land where the Simpson burial site is located.

It is noteworthy to mention what good people W.H. and Minnerva Simpson were. Elmer Simpson (W.H.'s son) stated in "HideTown" that his father always admonished his boys to "be fair and honest and see the other fellow's side". Several sources indicate that W.H., in addition to farming corn, melons, and raising cane seed for area merchants, collected buffalo bones, freighted items for Ft. Elliott, and was a constable. Minnerva nursed the sick of the community and assisted mothers when their babies were born. She helped care for the injured after the tragic 1898 Mobeetie Tornado. Admirably, she took no pay for her services. Children born to their union in Kentucky were William Ernest, Nathaniel Walter, Robert Edson, Ezekiel John, Minerva Pearl (?), and Leslie Franklin. Additional children born in Texas were Ida Mary, Rolla Elmer, James McKinley (Mack), Floyd Elridge, and Annie Maybelle.

W.H. and Minnerva sold their land to C.H. Clay on October 27, 1916. At this

time they were already living in Clovis, New Mexico. A very unique part to the land instrument was that the family burial site was not sold. It was retained by the Simpson family.

Since there are no tombstones in the burial plot, deciding exactly who was buried there was difficult. The time lapse and the lack of birth and death records, also, made it challenging. Research from several family histories associated with the Simpson family helped to ascertain that Nathaniel

Simpson (W.H.'s father), who died January 1, 1893, in Mobeetie was buried there. He would be the last burial there. W.H.'s infant son, Floyd Elridge, who was born and died in 1889 in Wheeler County is the first burial. That a third burial, Minnerva Pearl's, took place, cannot be completely verified. No cemetery

"I think one of the best

attributes Shaley has is she's just so encouraging to her teammates," Pool said.

"I think with the team going down there with her she's getting to enjoy the trip more. Since she's been down there before she can help calm their nerves."

Goad went to state as a freshman and finished ninth, and that experience paid off the next year as she led from the start, shooting a 78-76-154. She won by seven shots over Blanket's Marki Kinkade, who's also returning this year. This is where Goad wanted

**TORNADOS**

The next few months are "tornado season" in Texas, so a few pointers and safety tips on tornadoes are in order, says Dale Dunlap, County Agent with the Texas Cooperative Extension. Here are a few general facts about tornadoes:

\*\*Tornadoes generally travel an average speed of 30 miles per hour but have been clocked at 70 miles an hour.

\*\*Tornadoes normally move from southwest to northeast although their direction of travel can be erratic and change suddenly.

\*\*Tornadoes are often spawned in thunderstorms that have accompanying large hail.

\*\*Most tornado damage is caused by violent winds but most tornado injuries and deaths result from flying debris.

\*\*Tornado winds may produce a loud roar similar to that of a train or airplane.

\*\*Tornadoes can occur with little or no warning although most occur during the mid afternoon or early evening hours. Stay tuned to weather forecasts during times of unsettled weather. When a tornado or severe thunderstorm "watch" is issued, it means that tornadoes or severe weather are possible in the area designated. On the other hand, a tornado or severe thunderstorm "warning" means that tornadoes or severe weather are occurring. Persons in or near the storm path need to TAKE COVER IMMEDIATELY!

\*\*Stay away from windows, doors and outside walls. \*\*In small buildings or homes, go to a basement or an interior part of the lowest level. Closets, bathrooms and interior halls offer the best protection many cases. Seek cover under something sturdy. \*\*In schools, local businesses or hospitals go to a pre-designed shelter area. Interior hallways on the lower floor are usually best. \*\*In mobile homes or vehicles, leave and take shelter in a substantial structure. If non is available, lie flat in the nearest ditch or ravine and shield your head with your hands.

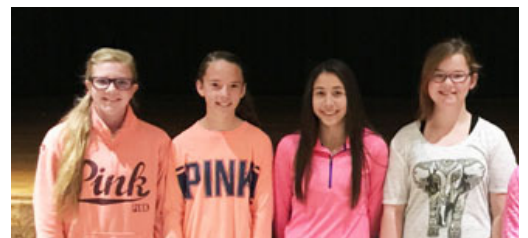

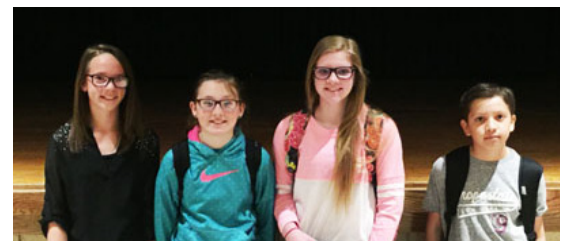

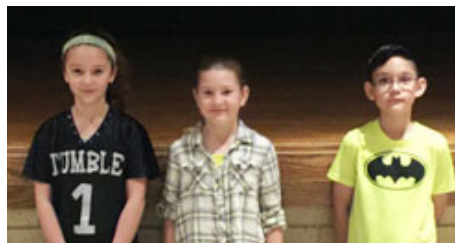

## First Projects with the Makey Makey Grant

Kelton received the Makey Makey's a few days before the Kelton Astronomy Night. The Forth Graders used the Makey Makey to enhance the displays that they already had built. They made their astronomy displays interactive by making them speak or sing when someone would push on a button or open a flap (kind of like a fancy Hallmark card). The forth graders did this by pre-recording their explanations, then they wrote a program in Scratch where if a certain key on the keyboard was pushed then that sound file would play. Some students also added programming that if another sound file was already playing it would stop it and only play the current file. With the Makey Makey plugged into to the computer, the computer just thinks its another keyboard. The student wired their buttons or flaps and assigned a keyboard keys to them. The end results were amazing. As an educator it was so exciting to see the student explain their display and then explain how they wired it and programmed it all in the same presentation.
