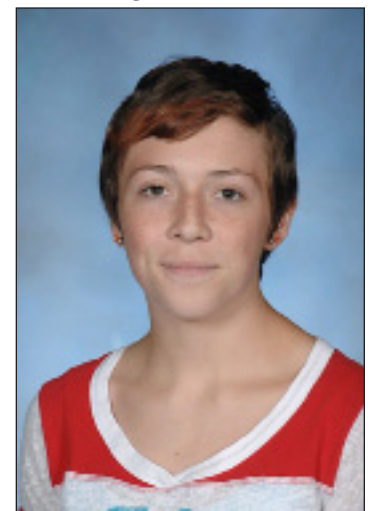

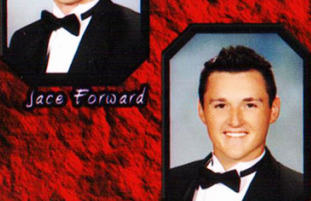

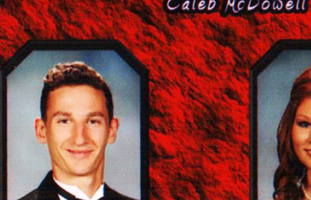

County Expenditures \$608,242.69

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County met in regular session on Monday, May 9, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00 a.m. court reconvened and action was taken on the 13 items on the agenda.

- The minutes of previous meetings were approved as read.

- The monthly reports of the Justices of the Peace, County

Treasurer, County Clerk and District Clerk were accepted by the court.

- No action was taken on the budget.

- No line item transfers were made.

- No action was taken on the Policy Manual.

- No action was taken on the Burn Ban.

- Item No. 7, had to do with Crime Stoppers to consider merging Wheeler County, Gray County and Roberts County programs. No action.
- The county voted to approve the check for \$200.00 to David Kreyling, the amount due for rent on the Probation Office.

- Bids were opened for a 60 ft. by 30 ft. metal building with insulation, a five ft. sidewalk and ten ft. overhang surrounding building for 4-H Shooting Range at Shamrock, TX. Both bids were rejected due to cost. Plans will have to be reconsidered.

- A \$400.00 bid by Anthony Liles was accepted for the 16 ft. by 70 ft. mobile home. Two other bids were received.

- The court was updated on the TxDOT Transportation Infrastructure Fund project. Upon completion of the first phase of the project, the County had money remaining. Twenty-one miles of county roads will be added to the project. Roads on the work list are O, A, 6, H, 18, 9, and 23. Work has already been completed on 40.5 miles of county roads through the TIF funds.

- The court voted to pay the bills in the amount of \$484,000.05. The 4/30/16 payroll amounted to \$124,242.64.

The next meeting of the Wheeler County Commissioners' Court will be Monday, May 23, 2016.
