The Wheeler County Farmers' Market is going to begin on Wednesday, June 29th, from 3:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. on the east side of the courthouse in Wheeler. Vendors are welcome from all over Wheeler County with each vendor providing his own table, chairs, bags, cash box, etc. Last season we had as many as 10

vendors and this summer we are hoping for more. With all the early growing season, more people should have plentiful gardens, and the market provides an excellent outlet source for the sale of agricultural products to the public. Only products grown in Wheeler County should be sold at our market; therefore no Colorado peaches, Oklahoma watermelons, Floydada pumpkins, etc. would be allowed. The exception would be made by a general consensus vote of the participating vendors on a one-by-one basis.

Some gardens were planted early this year and with recent rains results should be great. It promises to be a good fruit year with lots of blackberries, plums, apples, grapes, etc. available; however there are very few apricots and peaches this year. There should be lots of summer squash, winter squash, tomatoes, peppers, peas, okra, corn, turnips, radishes, melons, cantaloupes, cucumbers, etc. In addition to the fruit and vegetables for sale, the usual

Ft. Elliott's Shaley Goad Named Outstanding Athlete Of the Year

Wins Golf Gold 2015 & 2016

(Editor's Note: Each year the Happy State Bank recognizes the athletes of the year in each of the high school sports. The outstanding golfer this year was Shaley Goad. The following article appeared in the Amarillo Globe-News.)

Why honored: Shaley Goad continues to be golden, and the junior continues to sign her name to the Fort Elliott High history books. Last year she became the first Fort Elliott student to win a UIL athletic gold medal, capturing the 2015 Class 1A state girls individual golf championship.

She now owns back-to-back gold medals, having claimed the 2016 1A state golf title this month. She was the lone golfer in the field to break 80 both days and her rounds of 77 and 75 were Goad the

two lowest in the tourney. Goad's closest competitor was seven strokes back and the third place golfer finished 20 strokes back. The other 46 students at Fort Elliott couldn't be prouder of her.

Quotable: "As a person Shaley is an outstanding student athlete who always has a smile on her face," said Fort Elliott girls golf coach Sarah Pool. "She is a driven person, who in whatever she does works to be the best and not just average. Seeing her go back-to-back is such and honor that I know doesn't happen very often. There was never a doubt in my mind she wouldn't do it because she is driven and passionate about working at golf."

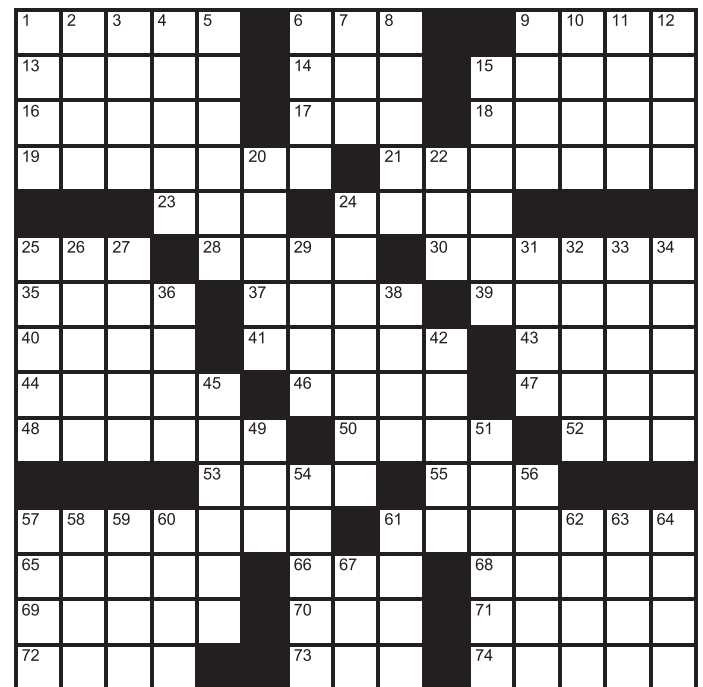
