## Tomato Troubles

Tomato gardening, while not particularly difficult, can prove frustrating when your plants seem healthy one day, and sickly the next. During this time of year, there about home grown Tomatoes. Below are quick facts and tips for a few frequently asked questions.

Tomato Cracking Cracking is a disorder
caused by soil moisture fluccaused by soil moisture fluc-
tuations (fluctuating from too uations (fluctuating from too
tomato reaches the mature green stage and the waduced or cut off, the tomato will begin to ripen. At this time a cellophane-like wrapper around the outer surface of the tomato becomes thicker and more rigid to protect the tomato during and after har-
vest. If the water supply is restored after ripening begins, the plant will resume taking in nutrients and moisture into the fruit. This will cause the fruit to enlarge; which in turn splits the wrapper around the fruit and results in cracking. The single best control for cracking is a constant and regular water supply. Apply a layer of organic mulch to the base of the plant. This

Black S Black Spots Black Spots found on the a common Tomato disease called Blossom End Rot. Symptoms may occur at any stage in the development of disease implies, symptoms appear only at the blossom end of the fruit. First, a wa-ter-soaked spot appears, which enlarges and darkens rapidly as the fruits develop. The spot may enlarge until it covers as much as $1 / 3$ to $1 / 2$ of the entire fruit surface. Spots dry out and become flattened, black, and leathery in appearance and texture.
Blossom End Rot is caused Blossom End Rot is caused by improper moisture. To control Blossom End Rot, tomatoes should be planted in well
drained, adequately aerated drails. Maintain uniform soil moisture always. Tomatoes planted early in cold soil are likely to develop blossom end rot on the first fruits. Thus, planting tomatoes in warmer soils helps to prevent the problem. Mulching of the soil is often helpful in maintaining soil water in times of moisture stress. In home gardens,
shading the plants is often shading the plants is often helpful when hot, dry winds are blowing, and soil moisture is low.
Yellow Stunted Plant \&
Root Knots
These are root knot nemaof nematode which causes galls or swellings on plant roots. It restricts the uptake of nutrients from the root system to the foliage, resulting in a yellow and stunted plant. Root knot nematodes live in the soil and can survive on a number of weed and vegetable crops. Crop rotation is often stressed as a way to control nematodes and plant diseases. Simply, plant tomaoes in different parts of your home garden year to year. different areas each year not only aids in the reduction of nematodes but soil borne diseases will also decrease. Some Tomato varieties are Nematode resistant. This is indicated by the letter $N$ after the tomato nam

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today announced that the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) will provide
an estimated $\$ 300$ million in an estimated $\$ 300$ million in cost-share assistance paythrough the new Cotton Gin ning Cost-Share program in order to expand and maintain the domestic marketing of cotton.
"Today's announcement shows USDA continues to stand with America's cotton producers and our rural communities," said Vilsack. "The Cotton Ginning Cost Share program will offer meaningful, timely and targeted assistance to cotton growers ginning costs and to facili tate marketing. The program will provide, on average, approximately 60 percent more assistance per farm and per producer than the 2014 program that provided cotton transition assistance."
Through the Cotton Ginning Cost-Share program, eligible producers can receive a one-time cost share payment, which is based on a reported to FSA, multiplied by 40 percent of the average ginning cost for each production region. With the pressing need to provide assistance ahead of the 2016 ginning season this fall, USDA will ensure the application process is straight-forward and efficient. The program estimates the costs based on
planting of cotton in 2015, and therefore the local FSA
of eligible producers and the
applications will be pre-populated with existing data. Signup for the program will begin June 20 and run through Aug.
5, 2016 at the producer's lobe processed as applications are received, and are expected to begin in July.
Since 2011, cotton fiber markets have experienced dramatic changes. As a result of low cotton prices and globers are facing economic uncertainty that has led to many producers having lost equity and having been forced to liquidate equipment and land to satisfy loans. The ginning of cotton is necessary prior o marketing the lint for fiber, or the seed for oil or feed. While the Cotton Ginning Cost-Share program makes payments to cotton producers for cotton ginning costs, will be felt by the broader marketing chain associated with cotton and cottonseed, including cotton gins, cooperatives, marketers and cottonseed crushers and the rural communities that depend on them.
