She preceded him in death on January 15, 2008. He was also preceded in death by his parents, and his sister, Bobby Carol Hill.

Jimmy was an MP during his service in the US Army. He was a member of the United Methodist Church. Jimmy was a member of the High Plains Police Chief's Association, Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management of Texas, Sheriff's Association of Texas, NRA, Lion's Club International, Texas Panhandle Peace Officer's Association, and served as the Scout Master for the Boy Scouts of America in Wheeler. After a long and distinguished career in law enforcement, Jimmy retired as the Borger Chief of Police in 2013.

He is survived by his son, Jason Adams and wife, Sheena Embry, of Abernathy, TX; two daughters, Stacy Adams Mansoor and husband, Samuel, of Round Rock, TX, Stephanie Adams Garfias and husband, Antonio, of Round Rock, TX; five grandchildren, Mason Adams Mansoor, Victoria Grace Mansoor, Carson Adams Mansoor, Milo Antonio Garfias, and Simon Mateo Garfias; and his special friend, Jan Haynes.

Spider Mites

Spider mites are affecting many ornamentals and vegetables around the county. One of the most common pests attacking ornamental plants is the spider mite, commonly referred to as "mites". They are not insects, but are more closely related to spiders and ticks. Adult mites, spiders and ticks have eight legs. Mature mites are usually less than 1/50 inch long and generally are found on the undersides of leaves.

Mite infestations often go undetected until the plants are damaged severely. Mite populations tend to peak during the hottest, driest time of the year, generally between late June and mid-September. Mites can be seen by shaking the foliage over a white sheet of paper and observing any mites present. A microscope may be needed. They are very small and move slowly.

The undersides of infested leaves usually have fine, silken webbing spun across them. Among the live mites, there may be cast skins, which leave a grayish residue on the leaf's underside.

Damage from light infestations appears as yellow or gray stippled patterns on the leaves. Heavy infestations cause the leaves to turn yellow, gray or brownish and eventually drop off.

Most populations of insect and mite pests are regulated by naturally occurring beneficial insects, also known as beneficials. However, these beneficials may take longer to control the pests naturally than you'd like. In the meantime, the plants are damaged and become stressed.

To manage the pest population more quickly, you may employ chemical control methods such as an insecticide. It is important to become familiar with a pesticide before using it. Always read and follow the pesticide label instructions. Be sure to use proper equipment and the rates of the product that are specified on the label.

Spider mites can be very difficult to control and may require 3-4 applications at 7 day intervals. Products such as Malathion, Kelthane, and permethrin may be used. Check label before apply-

ing to vegetable crops. For more information contact the County Extension Office at 826-5243.

Wes Crites, Sheriff, requested an upgrade to Cop Sync System. A Cop Sync System presented the proposal to the court. Cop Sync provides the computers in the deputy's cars, maintains the computers, maintains records of calls, deputy's times and locations and will allow the dispatcher to have visual contact with deputy's car cam when necessary. This past year, the deputies made 241 accident reports and had \$100,000 in fines. The deputies have 24-hour contact with Cop Sync should something be wrong with the system. The court approved a 6-year contract at a cost of \$109,805.50 to be paid after October 1, 2016.

Tina Lewis, TxDOT Grant-Works, met with the council to give a report on the TIF Grant. The project is nearing completion with 40 miles of county roads improved. Remaining to be completed is another 20.5 miles; this work will be completed within the next two weeks.

The bills were approved for payment.

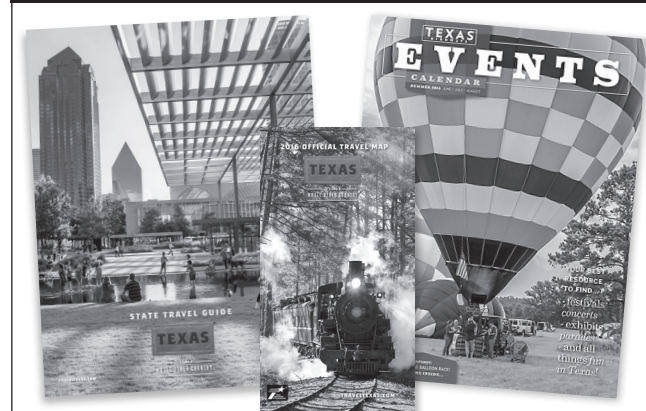



ORDINANCE NO 193

TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO.25

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO DISCHARGE FIREWORKS WITHIN THE CITY OF WHEELER, DEFINING THE TERM FIREWORKS AND PROVIDING A PENALTY AND A SAVING CLAUSE.

SECTION 1.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Wheeler that it shall hereinafter be unlawful for any person to discharge any fireworks of any kind or size anywhere within the city limits except for the July 4th fireworks presented to the Public by the Wheeler Fire Department at the City Park.

The term "fireworks" shall mean and include any fire cracker, roman candle, torpedo, sky rocket or any other combustible package or contrivance of inflammable or combustible material, regardless of the name whether named or not capable of producing audible, visible or physical effects.

SECTION 2.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not exceeding one hundred dollars.


SECTION 3.

The declaring of any section or portion of the above ordinance unconstitutional or in violation of State or Federal law or city charter shall not effect the remaining sections or portion of such ordinance.

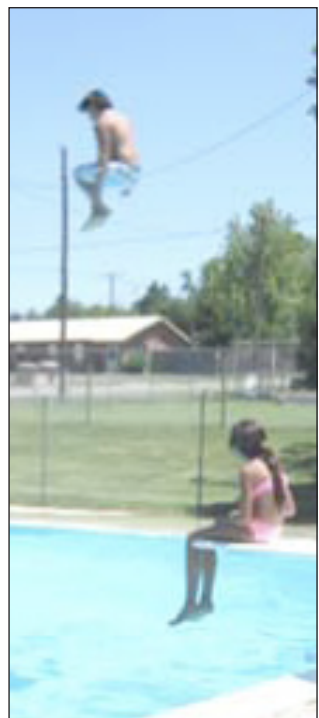

Cervical Cancer and Its Treatment

Cervical cancer is the easiest female cancer to prevent. A Pap test, which screens for cervical cancer, can help prevent cervical cancer or find it early. It is one of the most reliable and effective cancer screening tests available. With a Pap test, the doctor is looking for any cell changes on the cervix that might become cervical cancer if they are not treated appropriately. For this reason, women should start getting regular Pap tests at age 21.

So, who should be screened and when should they be screened? According to the American Cancer Society's guidelines, women between ages 21 and 29 should have a Pap test every 3 years. The doctor may also suggest an HPV test if there are abnormal Pap test results. For women between the ages of 30 and 65, it is preferred that they have a Pap test plus an HPV test every 5 years, but it is also okay to have a Pap test alone every 3 years. If a woman is over age 65 and has had regular cervical cancer testing with normal results, she should not be tested for cervical cancer. Once testing stops, it should not be started again. However, women with history of a serious cervical pre-cancer should continue to be tested for at least 20 years after that diagnosis, even if testing continues past age 65. If a woman's uterus and cervix were removed for reasons not related to cervical cancer and she does not have a history of cervical cancer or serious pre-cancer, she also should not be tested. Women with a history of serious pre-cancer will need to visit with their doctor about their screening needs.

and cervical cancer and the best way to prevent these cancers, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service in Wheeler County will conduct a Friend to Friend party on August 16, 2016. There will be a discussion of the obstacles women may encounter when trying to access mammograms and Pap tests locally. Information will be available on how those who qualify can access financial assistance if the cost of the screening prevents them from getting a screening.
