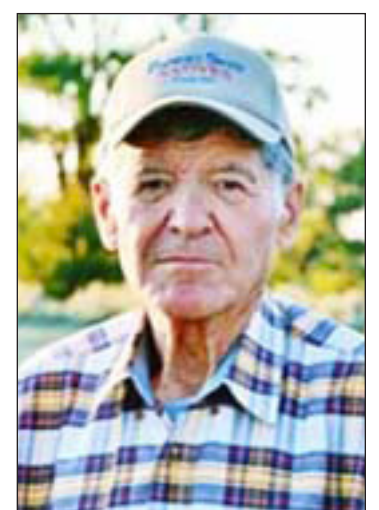

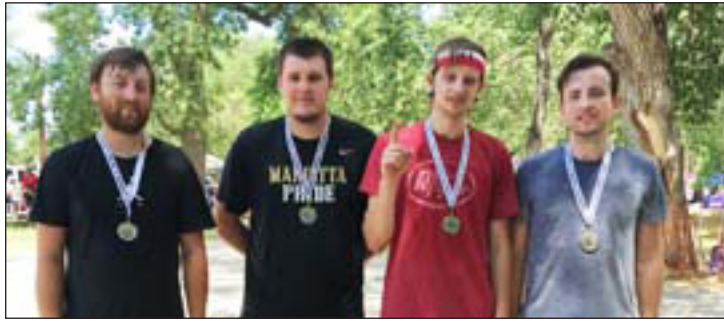

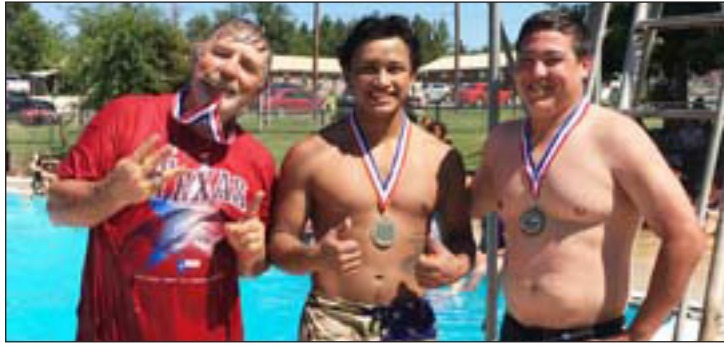

sure, County Clerk and District Clerk were accepted by the court.

• \$50,000 was paid to the county. The Outside Prisoner bill was paid by Hutchison County.

• Line Items transfers were made within the County Sheriff's Budget.

• One bid was received for the construction of a building for 4-H Shooting Range in Shamrock. The bid by Sims Construction of Mobeetie was for \$49,950. The County Judge had allowed \$49,000 in the budget; Sims reduced the bid and the court approved the bid of \$49,000.

• The item for the purchase of time clocks by the county was tabled.

• The court approved the Health and Employee Benefits Pool Group Health Renewal.

• Leslie Standerfer, County Attorney asked the court to approve a pay supplement for Cristina Hoffman to be paid out of Pre-Trial Diversion Funds. The request was not approved. "If you give one a raise, you have to give all a raise," stated Commissioner Snelgrooves.

• Daryl Snelgrooves, Commissioner, Pct. 1, was given permission to add Braden Moore to the payroll as part-time seasonal employee.

• Enbridge Pipelines (Texas Gathering) L.P. was given permission to bore under County Road EE for the installation of an oil and gas pipeline.

• Four Point Energy, LLC was given permission to cut County Road 30 for installation of a 4" water line.

• The TxDOT's Transportation Infrastructure Fund was discussed. The project is nearing completion with work remaining on County Roads 6 and 9.

• The court approved the bills for the period 6/28/2016 to 07/08/2016 in the amount of \$398,674. 22. Payroll for the same period was \$124,354.91.

• Ralph Wallace with Texas County and district Retirement System discussed the retirement plan and consid-

eration of partial lump sum withdrawal.

• The court held a budget workshop at the end of the meeting.

The next Commissioners' Court meeting will be Monday, July 25, 2016.

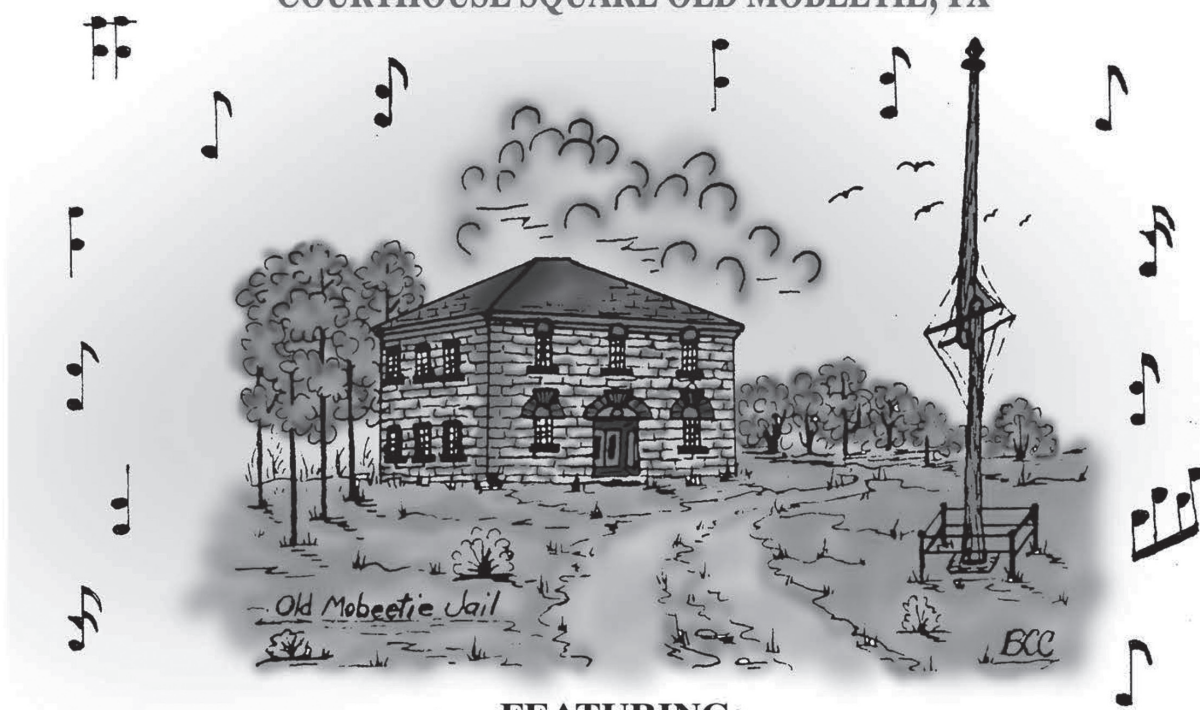

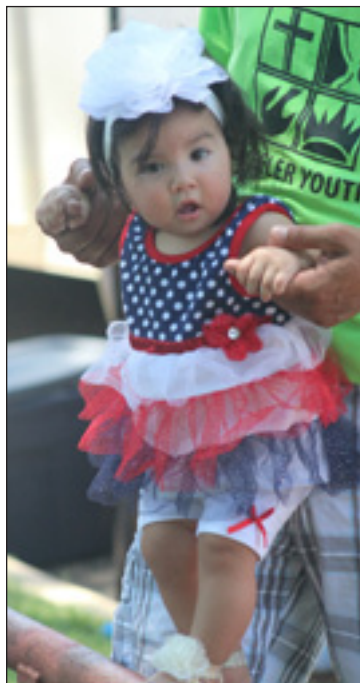
