Dominate Texhoma 49-13

After two weather delays and a somewhat clumsy start, the Wheeler Mustangs took full control of their season opener and thoroughly dominated the Texhoma Red Devils last Friday night in Texhoma by a final score of 49-13.

After a planned 7pm kickoff time was pushed back to 8 due to lightning in the area, the Mustangs took the opening kickoff. Ivan Lopez returned to Wheeler's 31 and QB Holden Guest led the offense onto the field. The evening began roughly for Wheeler when a missed shotgun snap caused an 11-yard loss on first down. Traylen Drake got back nine of those yards on second down but a deep sideline pass to Drake was picked off by the Red Devils on third and long and Texhoma took over on their own 39.

Texhoma faltered badly on their first possession. Two penalties and a fumble pushed them back to fourth and long and they punted away to Wheeler's 21. Holden Guest immediately took advantage

and streaked off the right side of the line and sprinted down to the Red Devil 12. A Texhoma penalty moved the ball inside the 10 to the 7 and RB Rudy Almanza thundered over the goal line on the ensuing play. After another Red Devil penalty on the PAT moved the ball to the 1, Guest put the ball over for 2, and the Mustangs were out front, 8-0.

Texhoma could not move the ball again on the next possession and quickly punted away. Guest fielded the ball at his own 17 but a hit from a Red Devil defender caused him to lose the ball and Texhoma recovered and took over from there. After two plays, Texhoma faced a 3rd and 12 and lofted a pass into the end zone. The ball was just over the fingertips of a Wheeler defender and into the hands of a Red Devil and after the PAT, Texhoma drew to within 8-7.

But that would be as close as the Red Devils would get for the rest of the evening.

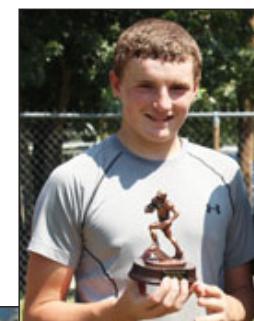

After a rain and lightning delay of 30 minutes, the Mustangs came out and thoroughly dominated from that point forward. Following an unreturned Texhoma kickoff to the Wheeler 35, the Mustangs went on a 7-play, 65-yard drive highlighted by the running and passing of Guest. Two plays after a five yard run, Guest hooked up with Drake on a 12 yard pass that gave WHS a first down at Texhoma's 48. After Almanza gained nothing on first, Drake took a handoff around end and gained 18 yards to the Red Devil 30. Another pass to Drake picked up ten. After a false start penalty lost 5, Guest threw out to lanky WR Ivan Lopez and he scampered 25 yards down the sideline to give the Mustangs 6. The two point conversion attempt was unsuccessful and Wheeler led 14-7.

Texhoma punted away its next possession and Wheeler took over at their own 38. A few explosive plays later and the Mustangs found themselves in scoring position once again. However, a holding penalty stunted their progress and a missed field goal attempt handed the ball back over to Texhoma.

Texhoma fell victim once again to a very stingy Mustang defense and punted away to the Wheeler 47 with 6:37 left in the first half. The Mustangs took all of 46 seconds to cover the necessary 53 yards in all of 4 plays with Eduardo Porras capping off the drive with a 15 yard run. An unsuccessful two point attempt was stopped and the Mustangs led, 20-7.

Another failed Red Devil drive gave the Mustangs another chance to score with 2:52 left and Wheeler took full advantage. Holden Guest rumbled for 30 yards on a 3rd and 5 setting the Mustangs up at the Texhoma 29. Almanza picked up 13 yards and Guest continued his stellar night on the ensuing play, blasting over the right side for a 16-yard TD run.

After another failed PAT, Wheeler took a 26-7 halftime lead.

The second half brought more of the same as Texhoma punted away their first possession of the second half and Wheeler pounced right away. Almanza and Guest covered 41 yards on 4 runs to the Red Devil 34 and Levi Ware finished it off with a winding scamper down the Mustangs' sideline to take a very commanding 34-7 lead after Guest carried over a successful two point conversion.

Another Texhoma punt gave WHS the ball back with 3:05 left in the third quarter (Continued Page 3)

WHITE GRUB CONTROL IN LAWNS

One of the major pests in lawns is the white grub, it occurs in most areas of Texas, but may cause damage only in certain areas. The adult form of the white grub is often called the June beetle and is about 1/2 to 5/8 inches long and light brown. The flight period for the adults in the High Plains generally occurs from mid-to-late June and lasts from one to two weeks. It is during this time the mating takes place. The mated female bores back into the earth and begins laying between 30-40 eggs which hatch in three to four weeks giving rise to small larvae or grubs.

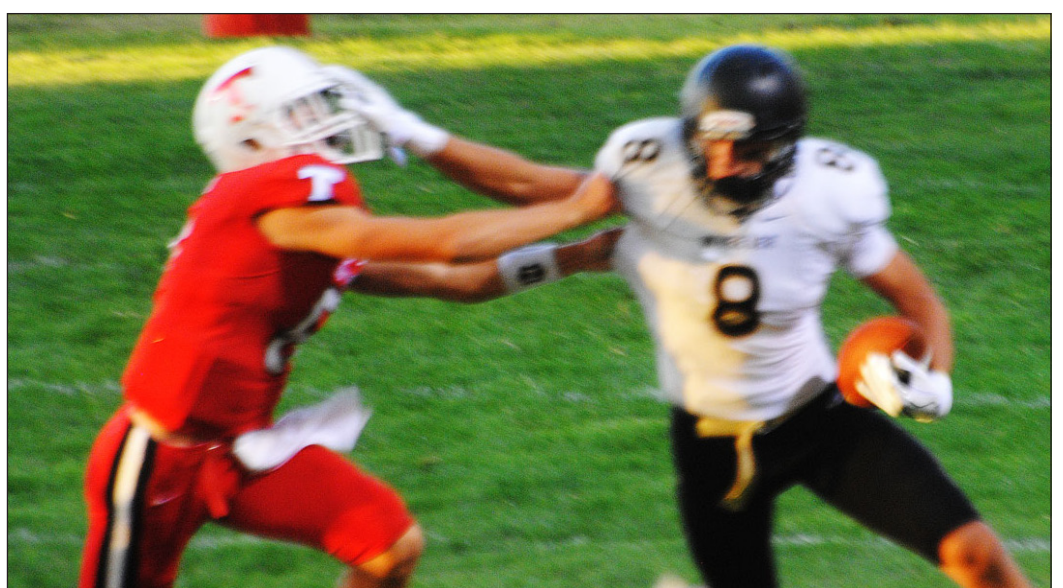
