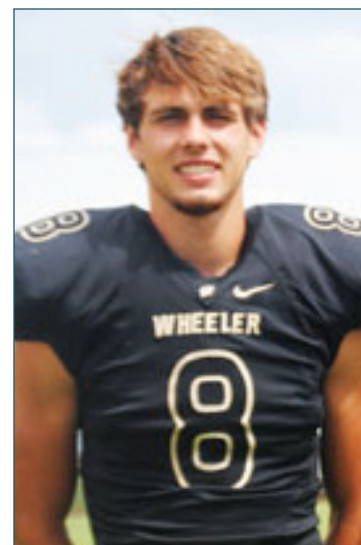

Bean returned to his birthplace for the unveiling of an 8½-foot, 1,300-pound statue — "Tiptoeing on the Oceans of Storms" — that was sculpted by Amarillo's Mickey Wells. The statue stands in front of the 2-year-old Wheeler Historical Museum, just north of the football field.

Bean was born in Wheeler in March 1932 at the hospital on the edge of Main Street, which is now the Sandy Basin Inn. Arnold, his father, worked for the state of Texas and the Department of Agriculture, where he studied flood control and soil variances.

Bean lived only two years in Wheeler before his family moved to Louisiana. He went to high school in Fort Worth and eventually graduated from The University of Texas. Bean, who is now a painter, retired in Houston. On occasion, he returns to his roots.

Since the last person to walk on the moon was 46 years ago, odds are the next — if there is a next — wasn't in the Wheeler gymnasium. But Bean spoke of personal dreams, discarding limits, seeking to be special, qualities not unique to space exploration.

"Again, it was Pete who told me if I wanted to be special, what have I done special today?" Bean said. "How, he asked, was I going to be special someday? I said, 'Well, maybe someday I'll be standing by a lake and a guy can't swim and I'll save him; I don't know.'

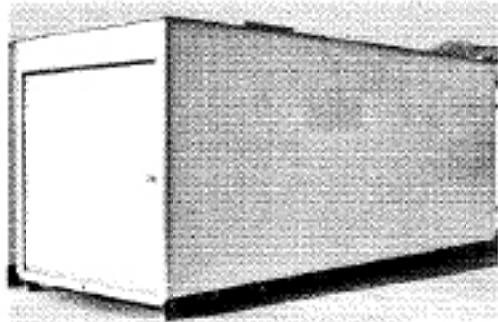

next play. On the ensuing play, Guest took the shotgun snap and let loose to wide open WR Traylen Drake streaking down the left sideline. Drake gathered in the pass and raced to the end zone for a 55 yard TD pass. Guest ran in the two point conversion and Wheeler led 8-7 with 10:39 left in the first half.

After an exchange of punts, the Hornets set up shop at the Mustang 47. Three plays and a penalty later, they were facing a fourth and 9. Allen stood to pass but his throw was snatched by Wheeler LB Rudy Almanza on an athletic leaping interception at the Hornet 30. Almanza returned the pick to the 36 and the Mustangs were in business.

Holden Guest ran twice to set up third and inches then exploded through the defense for 35 yards to the Hornet 19. Three plays later Guest took it in from the seven and the Mustangs led 14-7 after the failed PAT with 7:37 left in the third quarter.

The Hornets responded immediately however. A failed Wheeler outside kick gave Highland Park possession at the Mustang 45. They took six plays to cover those 45 yards and Tyler Allen's five yard run brought them to points with 20-15 after Allen's run converted the two point with 5:44 left in the third.

The Mustangs went three and out after a penalty plagued possession and the Hornets took over on their own 39 with 4:30 left in the third. They proceeded to execute an impressive 16 play drive that QB Tyler Allen finished with a four yard run. Mustang LB Levi Ware picked off the two point conversion and went on an entertaining return to the Hornet 43. And while it ultimately did not give the Mustangs points, a facemask penalty on the Hornets during the return pushed the kickoff back 15 yards and would give Wheeler quite a boost, even as they trailed 21-20 with 10:31 left in the game.

Mustang returner Traylen Drake took the ensuing kick at his 33 and wound his way 32 yards to give Wheeler excellent field position at the Hornet 35. Holden Guest collected 19 yards on three run. Drake picked up 12 and Guest polished off the drive with a two yard plunge and his third rushing touchdown. The two point pass failed but Wheeler had regained the lead at 26-21 with 8:15 left to play.

Kickoff man Traylen Drake popped up the following kickoff just beyond the Hornet front line and it bounced off a Hornet looking to corral it. Levi Ware pounced on the loose ball and the Mustangs had possession again at the Mustang 46. But they were unable to take advantage and gave the ball back four plays later at the Hornet 34.

After losing three yards on first down, and throwing incomplete on second, the Hornets faced a third and 13. Allen threw for 12 yards to get them within a yard of a first down on fourth and short. But the Mustang defense rose up and took Allen down two yards short to return the ball to the offense at the Hornet 41 with 4:04 left to play.

Only needing one first down to seal the victory, the Mustangs ran Guest twice to the 33 for a third and two but a penalty pushed them back five yards to a third and seven. he said, you got to figure out ways to be special each day. It's not up to the world to give you special opportunities; you have to find ways."

As Bean showed his last slide — the Earth, moon and stars in the galaxy — he noted the difference between planets, stars and those with him in the gym.

"The Earth, we know where it will be 10 years from now; these stars, we know where they will be 10,000 years from now," he said. "The only thing in the universe we have no idea where it will be next year are human beings.

"We are not limited. We are the only things in the universe that the only limits placed on us are the limits we place on ourselves."

Bean was part of the three-man crew on Apollo 12, the second manned mission to the moon in November 1969. He was also the space commander of Skylab 3 in 1973.

Following the program, a few hundred, mostly elementary students and adults, walked to the museum for a countdown of the statue's unveiling.

For Wells, who modeled the statue from artist Paul Kashuk Jr., finishing the project was a relief.

"It was a long project, an intense project," Wells said. "I'm blessed to be part of it. And Alan is an angel from heaven."

For Bean, the statue depicting him on the moon, is one of a kind.

"I've seen all the statues, I think, of astronauts, and I have to say, this is the best one I've seen," Bean said. "It's wonderful. It's so authentic. Nobody got this much detail just right. I'm telling you, this is different. This is amazing."

Probably none more so than the man it depicts.

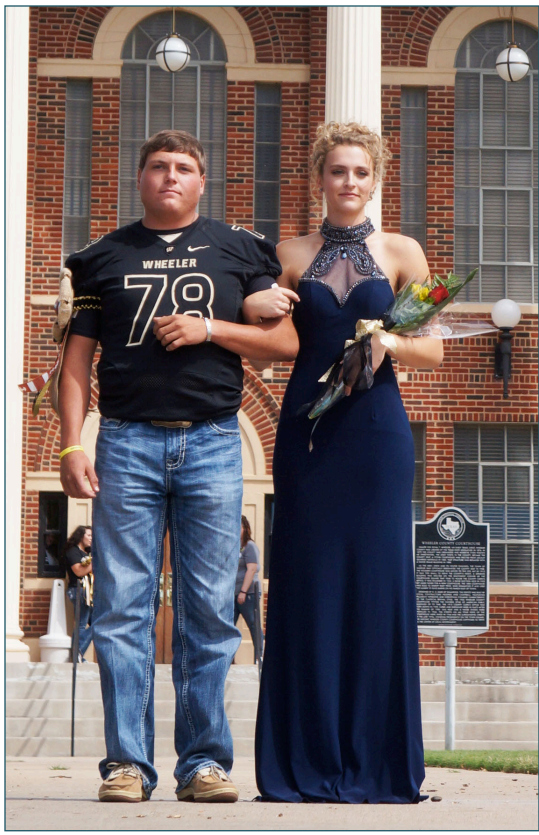

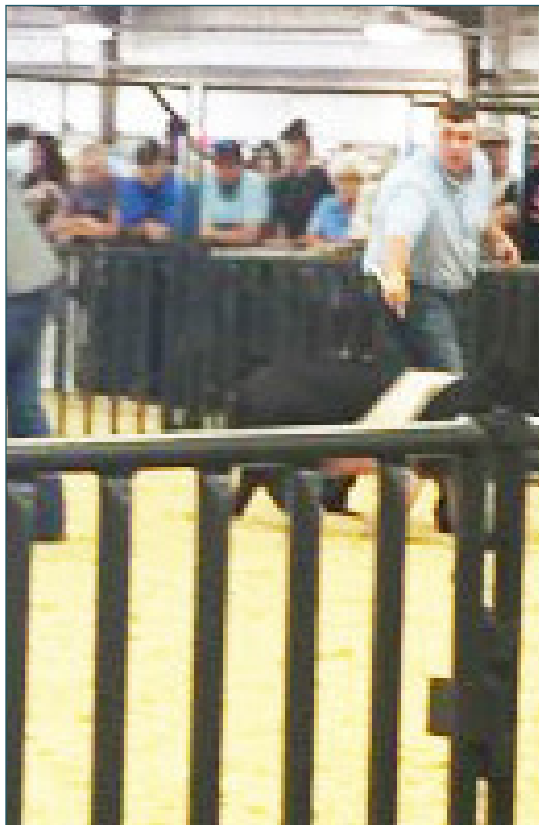

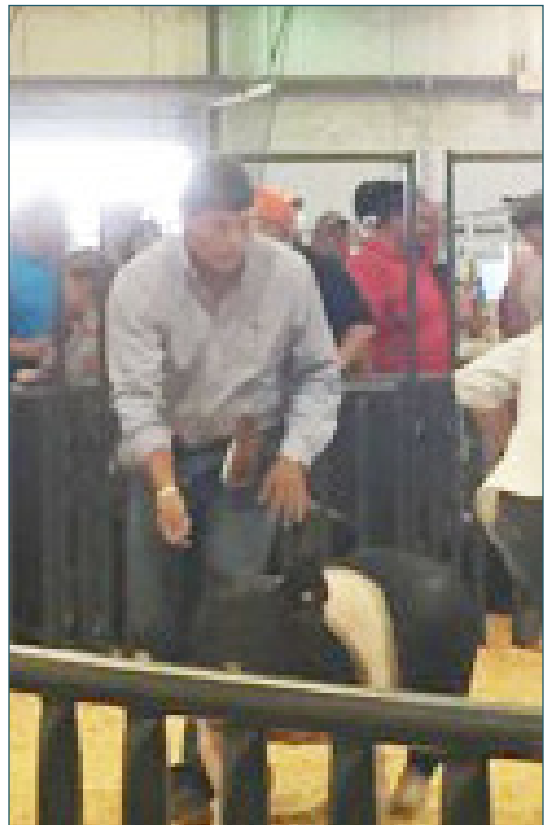
