County Clerk, Margaret Dorman urges . . .

Voters To Prepare For Nov. Election

The November Election is coming soon and Margaret Dorman, Wheeler County Clerk, together with Secretary of State Carlos H. Cascos, is promoting the voter education initiative, Vote Texas.

"The November election is just around the corner and I'm working to make sure all Texans have the resources they need before heading to the polls," said Margaret. "The state's official voting resource, VoteTexas.gov has information such as election deadlines and the ID requirements for voters."

The deadline to register in time for the November 8 Election is October 11. Texans can find a registration form to sign, print and mail at VoteTexas.gov. They may also check their current registration status.

As a reminder, when a voter arrives at the polls, the voter will be asked to present one of the seven forms of approved photo ID. If the voter possesses one of the seven forms of approved photo ID, the voter must present it. They are:

- Texas driver license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
- Texas handgun license issued by DPS
- United States military identification card containing the person's photograph
- United States citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph
- United States passport

Free Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS

With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, the approved photo ID must be current or have expired no more than four years before being presented for voter qualification at the polling place. If a voter has continued access to their acceptable form of photo ID, but, for example, forgets to bring their acceptable form of approved photo ID to the polling place and/or left it, for example, at home or in their car, the voter still possesses the acceptable photo ID and must use it to vote.

If a voter does not possess one of the seven forms of approved photo ID and cannot reasonably obtain one, the voter may vote by (1) signing a declaration at the polls explaining the reasonable impediment that the voter has to obtaining one of the seven forms of approved photo ID, and (2) providing one of various forms of supporting documentation.

Supporting documentation can be a valid voter registration certificate, certified birth certificate (must be an original), a copy or original of one of the following: current utility bill, bank statement, government check, or paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and an address of the voter, although a government document

Reports are surfacing across the country that replacement Galaxy Note 7 phones are now exploding, and it happened to Kyle Dawson's phone.

Samsung has permanently ended the production and sales of its Galaxy Note 7 phone, after an issue was causing the devices to burst into flames. And one Wheeler family is grateful that when this happened to them, the phone was in an uncommon place.

Kyle's grandmother, Deleise Atwood said, "It was extremely scary. It was very God given that I didn't have it."

For once, 13-year-old Kyle was happy he did not have his phone with him on Friday. After sending in the recalled Galaxy Note 7 due to fires and explosions world-wide, they received a new one, however it proved to still have major issues.

"I thought I had pockets in my shorts, so I had attempted to put it in my pocket and I guess I had dropped it and didn't hear it, so we got on the bus and we headed to school," says Dawson. "And then we're headed home and we saw it smoking and we started asking people around the parking lot and they said that it did blow up and it kept smoking for a long time."

"Well it's one of those things that's not ever going to happen to you, but we had been being very careful laying it in the sink at night, not charging it over night, just being very careful because it could happen," says Kyle's Grandmother De-

Samsung recalled 2.5 million of the Note 7s, and on Monday advised all customers to stop using the phones. Atwood says the company has reached out to the family after the incident.

"They have contacted us again and they're willing to make it good however they can, so I appreciate that," says Atwood. "And we're going to go back with a Samsung

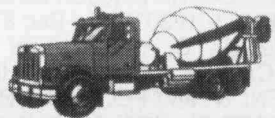

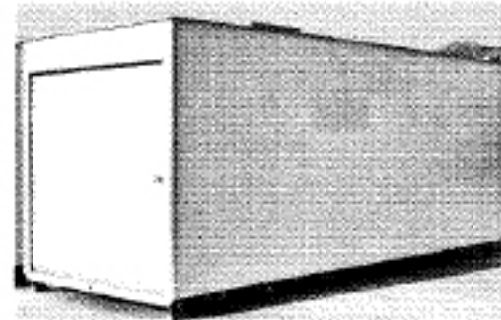

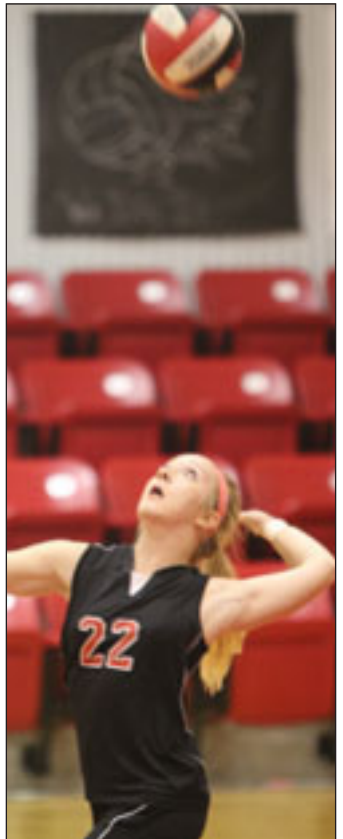

the Mustangs excellent field position at the Kiowa 37. Three plays netted 27 yards to the 10 and the Mustangs looked to take an early lead. But two runs by QB Holden Guest lost nine yards and a near catch by WR Ivan Lopez bounced out, leaving Wheeler with a daunting fourth and goal from the 19. The Mustangs tried a jet sweep to WR Traylen Drake, but he could only manage ten yards and Booker took over at their nine.

The Kiowas picked up a first down on a 20 yard pass from QB Edgar Avila to WR Valentine Ramirez, but after a run lost five yards and two incomplete passes, a 23 yard punt gave the Mustangs possession at the Booker 48. Wheeler took all of three plays: a hitch pass to WR Drake gained 19 yards, Drake picked up 15 on a jet sweep to the 14, and WR Lopez took a hitch pass from QB Guest, received some fine blocking and fought his way into the end zone. Lopez ran in the two point conversion and Wheeler led 8-0 with 6:49 left in the first quarter.

Booker fired their passing game on their ensuing possession. Passing on nine consecutive plays the Kiowas moved the ball to the Wheeler 21, but the drive stalled out there and the Mustangs took over. Wheeler picked up two first downs to the 47 and a first down pass from Guest to Lopez gained six yards to the Kiowa 47. But the second down shotgun snap was botched and Kiowa DL William Deprince scooped up the loose ball and raced to the Wheeler 32.

A second and 11 pass from Avila to WR Eduardo Meza netted 22 yards to the Mustang 11. Three incomplete passes led to a fourth and ten so the Kiowas brought on the field goal unit and K Angel Arroyo nailed the 28 yarder to narrow the score to 8-3 with 1:00 left in the opening quarter.

The Kiowas surprised Wheeler with an onside kick and Deprince was on the spot once again, recovering the kick and giving Booker the ball at the Mustang 47. A first down pass interference penalty against Wheeler moved the ball to the 32. However an illegal chop block cost the Ki-

was and forced Booker back to the 47 and into a frightening first and 25. They lost a yard on a first down run, threw incomplete on second down and Avila's deep third down pass was intercepted by Mustang DB Gustavo Andrade in the end zone and returned out to the Mustang 15.

Wheeler picked up two first downs to the 43 but three plays only netted a single yard and they faced a fourth and nine. Guest took the shotgun snap and looked to throw to Lopez, but Kiowa CB Manny Camacho intercepted the pass and Booker took over at their 40.

The Kiowas failed to capitalize and punted four plays later. Holden Guest fielded the punt at the Mustang 21 and worked to the left sideline, found a gap and raced down the field. Wheeler's Mauricio Lopez raced ahead and picked up a key block around the Booker 30 allowing Guest to cut back and finish off the 79 yard punt return TD. The two point conversion failed and Wheeler extended its lead to 14-3, with 7:51 left in the half.

Holden Guest ended the next Kiowa drive with an interception at the Mustang 33, and three plays later threw to TE Levi Ware to convert a third and 11. But on the next play Guest under threw Andrade and Kiowa CB Camacho picked off his second pass of the night.

The teams would exchange two scoreless possessions each to close the half with the Mustangs up 14-3.

The Mustangs received the second half kickoff and marched down the Kiowa 34 in eight plays where they faced a fourth and four, but Guest could only manage two yards and Booker took over. Booker punted away four plays later but a roughing the punter penalty handed them 15 yards and an automatic first down. 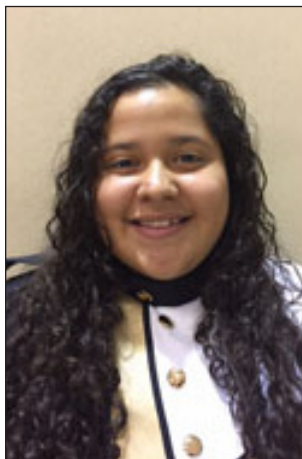

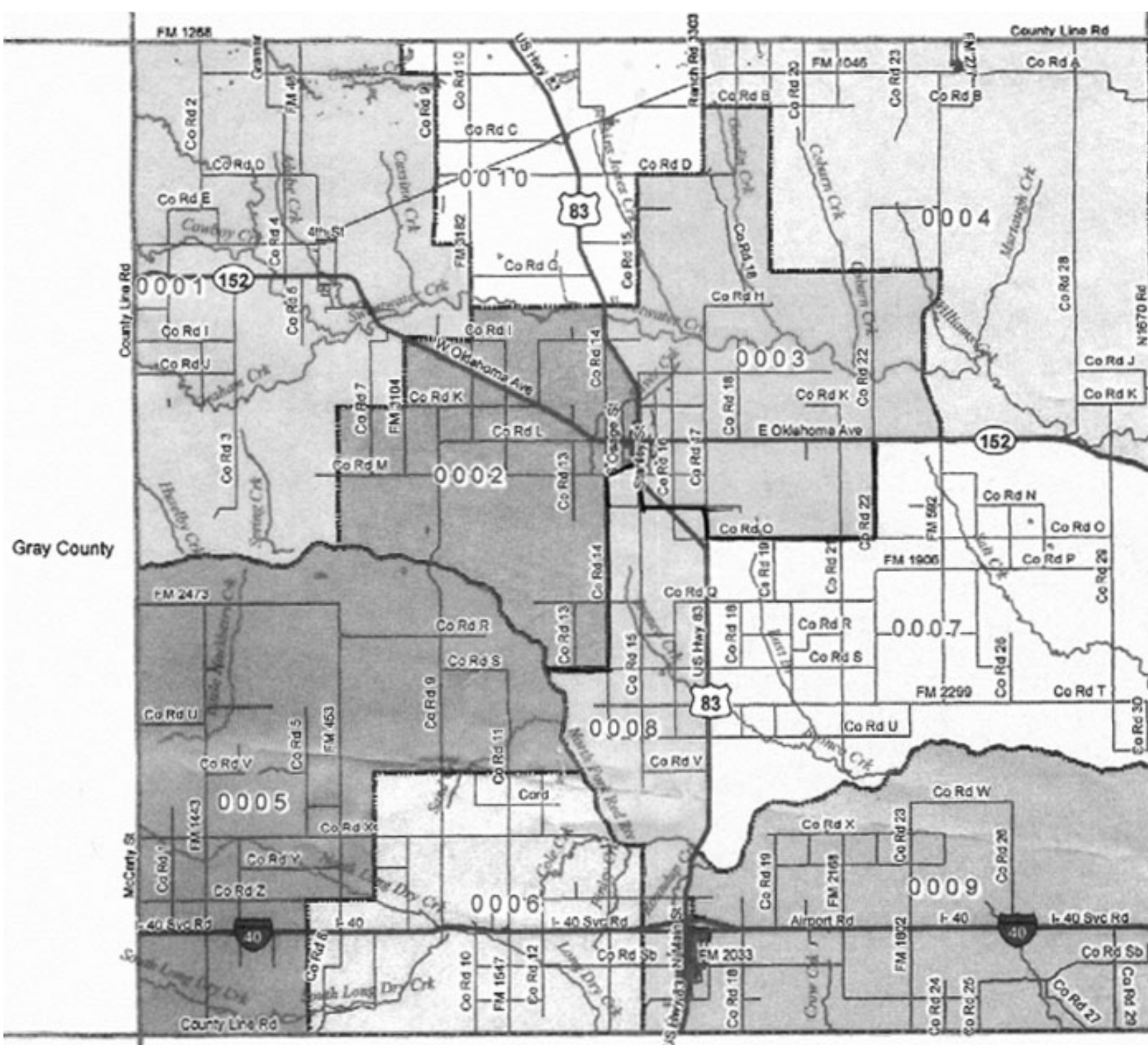

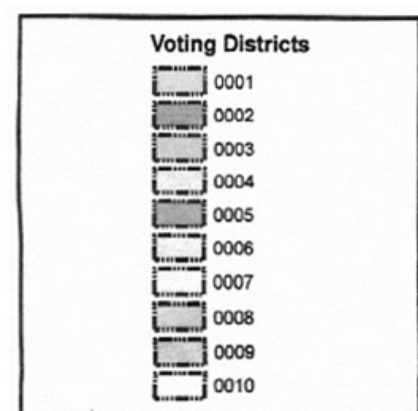
