Mustangs Defeat Clarendon In Playoff Thriller

In an exciting back and forth playoff battle that saw the Mustangs jump out to a 14-2 first quarter lead but eventually fall behind 18-14 late in the game, the Black and Gold used a huge third down TD run from QB Holden Guest and a game clinching interception from S Traylen Drake to take a 20-18 victory over Clarendon in Amarillo River Road last Friday night. The win advances the Mustangs to the area playoffs where they will face the Hamlin Pied Pipers in Seymour at 7pm Friday. Clarendon kicked the open-

ing kickoff through the end zone and the Mustangs began their opening possession at their 25. A first down run from Guest gained five and RB Rudy Almanza picked up three yards to set up a third and two. On third down, Guest faked to Almanza on the wide

sweep and then fired a high pass to WR Traylen Drake on the left hashmark around the 50. Drake leapt and caught the

ball to give the Mustangs a first down there. Unfortunately the drive would die out four plays

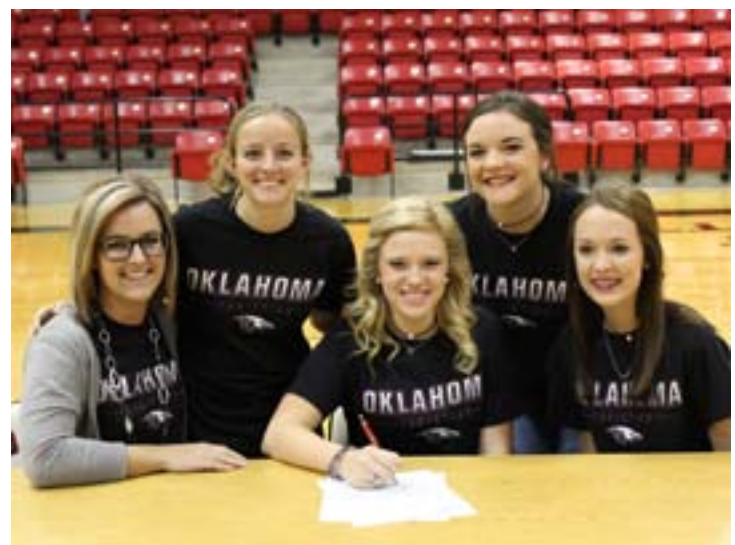

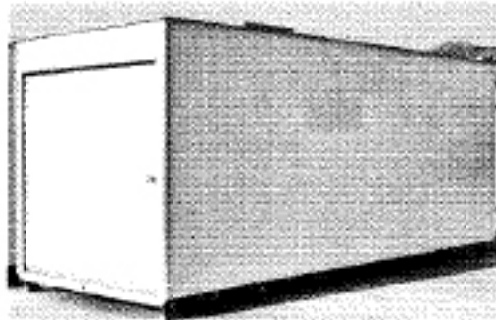

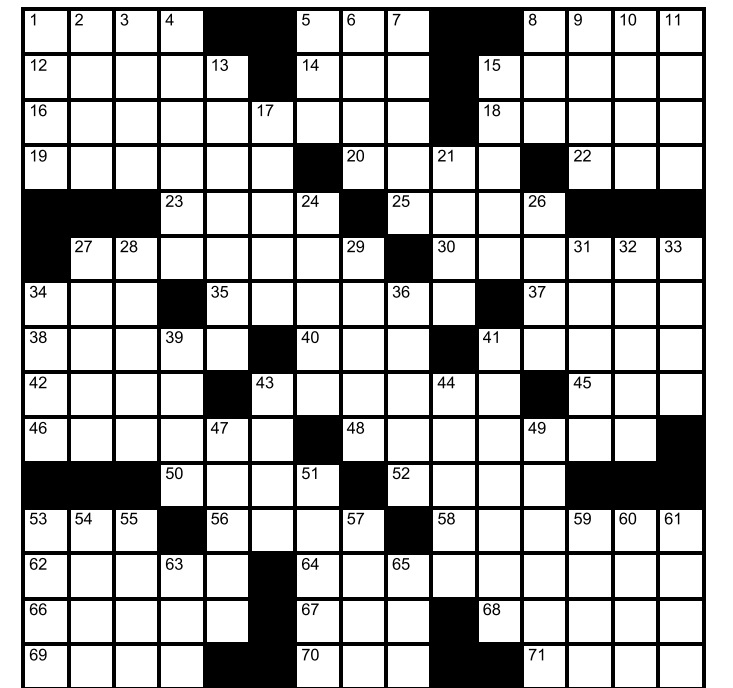

later and Clarendon took over at the Wheeler 47.

The Broncos managed ten yards and a first down on their first play but would fumble the ball away three plays later to give the Mustangs possession at their 40. Wheeler would convert a third and nine when Guest connected with WR Ivan Lopez who battled his way to 17 yards and a first down to the Broncos 42. An eight yard run from RB Eduardo Porras on the next play was followed by an incompletion that set up a third and two. A reverse counter to TE Levi Ware netted the two yards to continue the drive. Three plays later, facing a third and nine, Guest took the shotgun snap and lofted a deep pass toward the end zone. Drake caught the perfectly placed pass over his shoulder and the Mustangs had a 6-0 lead. But Clarendon would block the PAT attempt and Bronco LB Cameron Smith would scoop up the loose ball and race to the opposite end zone for a two point score that would reduce the Mustang lead to 6-2 with 2:48 to play in the first quarter.

Wheeler would regain possession three plays after the ensuing kickoff when LB Ware ripped the ball away from Bronco RB Clint Franks at the Mustang 44. They would capitalize immediately when Guest's play action pass found Lopez behind the Bronco defense. Lopez fought off a hustling Clarendon defender

inside the five and a dove into the end zone. Guest would hit Ware with the two point conversion and the Mustangs extended their lead to 14-2 with 1:15 left in the opening quarter.

The teams would exchange three and outs on the following two possessions and Clarendon would begin its fourth possession of the night at their 20 with 9:14 left in the first half. The Broncos would run the ball 12 consecutive plays with four different players and chewed up almost six minutes of clock to get within 14-9 when RB Daquawne Oliver ran in the TD from seven yards out and K Clay Koetting added the PAT with 3:19 left in the half. Neither team could muster any offense for the rest of the half and the Mustangs took their lead into halftime.

Clarendon would receive the second half kickoff and resume its ground assault. Starting from their 44, the Broncos featured RB Keandre Cortez down to the Wheeler 16. After Cortez and Oliver combined for seven yards. Clarendon faced a third and three from the ten. Mustang DE Rowdy Henson would smash through and smother Bronco QB Damarjae Cortez to force Clarendon into a fourth and four. QB Cortez would drop back to throw but Mustang CB Gustavo Andrade would intercept the pass and the Mustangs took over at the four.

The Mustangs managed five yards from two Guest runs and faced a third and five at the nine. Guest looked

to pass but a fierce rush from Clarendon forced him back into the end zone where he tried to throw the ball away. But his pass failed to be in the area of a receiver and the end zone penalty gave the broncos a safely and narrowed the Mustang lead to 14-11 with 6:40 left in the third quarter.

The safety forced Wheeler to kickoff from the 20 and the Broncos began their possession with excellent field position at the Mustang 41 after Smith's 15 yard return. Clarendon again pounded the ball down the field. Never gaining more than eight yards on any carry, the Broncos moved the ball to the eight on nine runs where they had a first and goal. Three Keandre Cortez runs could only gain a single yard and the unbreaking Mustang defense forced Clarendon into a fourth and goal at the seven. QB Damarjae Cortez would attempt a pass but Wheeler CB Luis Gutierrez would swat down the pass and the Mustang defense had another big stop inside the ten.

The Mustangs could not move the ball however and punted away, giving Clarendon fine field position at the Wheeler 43. Once again the Broncos smashed down the field. Running the ball seven straight plays, Clarendon would not be denied and Keandre Cortez's seven yard TD run and Koetting's PAT gave the Broncos an 18-14 lead with 7:02 remaining in the game.

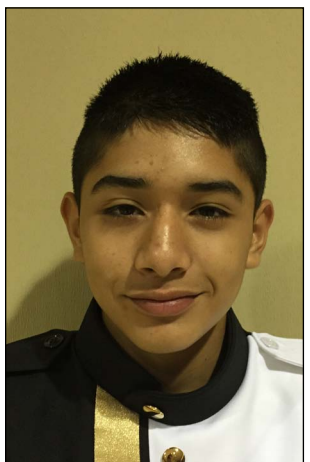

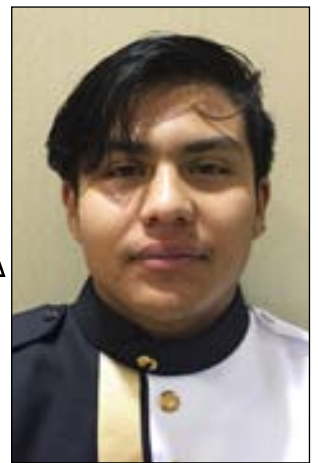

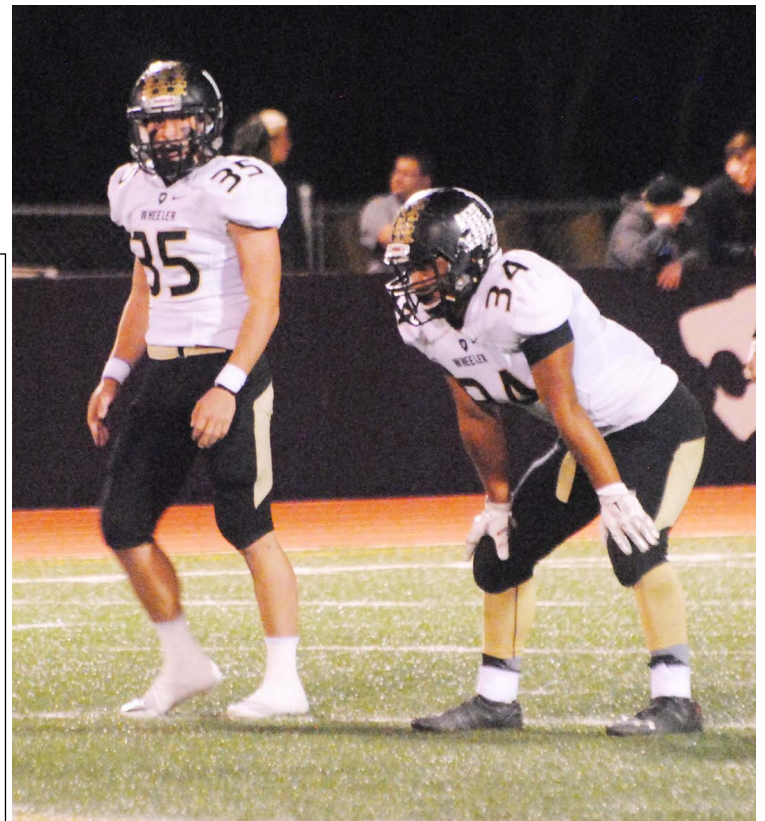

ed to respond. The offense had been kept off the field due to a combination of Clarendon's powerful rush offense and poor field position. So the Mustangs put the ball into QB Guest's hands and went to work. After Lopez returned the kickoff 28 yards to the Wheeler 38. Guest ran twice to the 42. On third down he threw to Drake for six yards and, after the measurement, the Mustangs faced a fourth and inches. Guest would smash over the right side for a yard and a first down on the next play. Three plays later the Mustangs faced a third and 12. Drake would make a tough catch in traffic for 12 yards and the chains were brought out for another measurement. Again Guest would power for a first down on fourth down. An incomplection and a Guest to Drake pass on second down gained zero yards to force the Mustangs into a third and ten from the Bronco 40. On the next play Guest took the shotgun snap and tested the left side. He burst through the line, juked a defender and raced down the left side. At the 15 he broke a desperate tackle attempt and strode into the end zone for the TD. The PAT missed but the Mustangs led 20-18 with 2:49 left to play. The Broncos would not go down without a fight. Starting from their 32 they moved the ball to the 45 for a first down. On the next play QB Damar-jae Cortez scrambled for five yards to the 50 but a personal foul penalty on the Mustangs moved the ball to the Wheeler 35 and gave Clarendon a first down with 1:31 left in the game. Cortez would drop back to pass on the next play and lofted a deep pass down the right sideline. The Bronco receiver was well covered by both Gutierrez and S Drake and the lanky Drake would go up and snag the pick to give the Mustangs the ball and, ultimately, the game. Three plays later, facing a third and three. Guest would gain four yards to seal the victory and give the Mustangs its second bi-district win in as many years. Guest led the Mustangs on the night, rushing for 67 yards and a TD and completing ten passes for 162 yards and two more scores. He also intercepted a pass from his OLB spot on defense. Drake caught seven passes for 90 yards and a TD and provided the game clinching INT on defense. Lopez caught two passes for 73 yards and a score and provided sound defense from his OLB position. ILB's Ware and Almanza and DE Henson were standouts on defense and freshman CB Andrade intercepted another pass giving him five picks on the season. The win advances the Mustangs (7-4) to the area playoffs where they will face the Hamlin Pied Pipers (9-2) in Seymour at 7pm Friday night. Hope to see a big turnout as the Mustangs continue their playoff march.

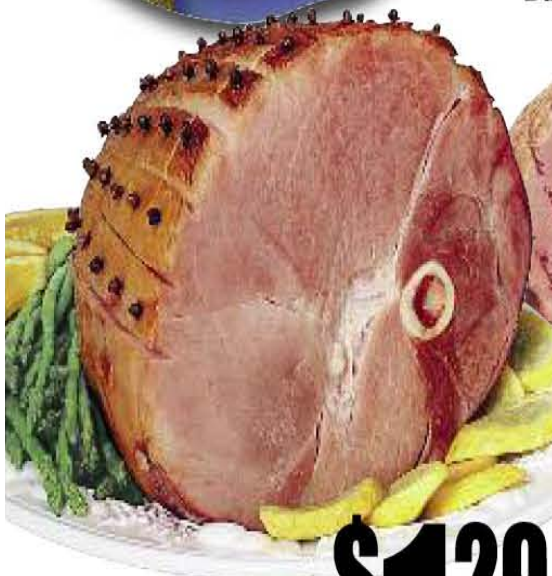
