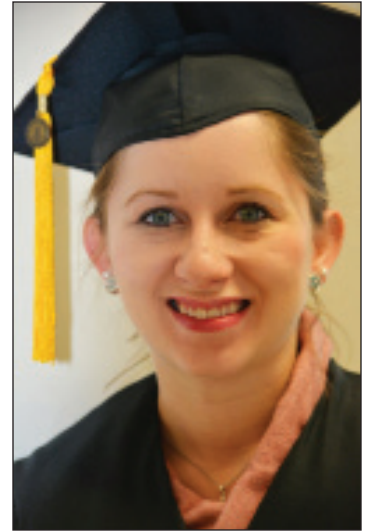

(Editor's Note: This letter was written about Shamrock, but holds true for Wheeler. Mr. Walton owns Eastern Panhandle Insurance in both Wheeler and Shamrock.)

Letter to the Editor  
Dear Editor and Citizens of Wheeler County,

I have lived in Shamrock since 1974 and have been in business in Shamrock since 1978. I have experienced the ups and downs the business community will have based on the local economy, which is to be expected in any community especially a small rural community. Recently I have heard several people comment about the vacant downtown business buildings we have in our county. "Why doesn't someone put in a business" they will say. "I can remember when there was a business in nearly every building" they would comment.

Well, I have a theory about the vacant buildings and lack of a business community. When I moved to Shamrock we had 3 pharmacies, a men's clothing store, a western wear store, an appliance/plumbing/electric store, 2 hardware stores (one of which sold guns, ammo, dishes, small appliances, etc.), 4 insurance agencies, furniture store, carpet store and many other businesses in our community. Shamrock was rather self reliant. The businesses were owned by local residents and provided a large number of local jobs. The owners and employees had families, kids in school and they were all very active in community activities. What changed? I believe as a community (as with most small communities) we are responsible for our own destiny. As the transportation system improved it became very easy for us to run to Amarillo or Pampa to make a purchase. We started buying our appliances at Home Depot or Lowe's because we could save \$75 on a washer/dryer set. Soon the appliance business could no longer operate and closed. We could go to Dillard's or Penney's to buy our clothing at a better price. Soon the clothing stores were no longer able to operate and closed. We could buy our medicine thru mail order, soon we only had 1 pharmacy. We could run to Walmart and purchase our guns, ammo, coffee maker, blender, dishes, etc. So we no longer needed a hardware store, it too is gone. Buy your insurance from GEICO, Nationwide or from an association thru your work place, soon insurance agencies close. Go to Pampa to get your carpet, soon the local carpet store closed. The list goes on and on. I recently overheard a conversation where a trip was being planned to go to Sam's to purchase supplies for a local school function and all of the items they needed to purchase could be purchased here in town, but it was determined Sam's would be less expensive. How often do we all do the same thing? We can get it here in town, but the out of town purchase will save us some money. We will also purchase a bill of groceries while we are at Walmart to buy that new TV and then fill up with gas before we head home. But does it really save us money in the long run? And at what cost is this savings? The sales tax we pay to Amarillo will stay in Amarillo and not benefit our City or help maintain our streets. I have never seen a Sam's, Walmart, Home Depot, or GEICO advertisement in the school annual. Their name never appears on sponsorship signs for the local golf tournaments held to support the scholarship programs

for our students. We don't receive their support for our Meals on Wheels program. Out of town businesses or their employees do not show up to support the car wash fund raiser for the church youth program. Sam's, Walmart, Home Depot, or GEICO do not care whether or not Shamrock or Wheeler County exist, only the people of Shamrock and Wheeler County care. But if we are raising funds for a local group, school event, 4H livestock show, broadcasting local sporting events or any other worthy community cause we go to the local businesses for their financial support, then run to Amarillo to purchase the supplies to hold the event. If we do not reverse this trend I fear we will no longer be able to fill a prescription, a repair kit for that leaky faucet, pick up flowers for that special

occasion or find a last minute gift locally I fear there will no longer be enough local businesses to support our local youth projects. I fear as we lose local businesses and their employees, we will lose opportunity for our kids. I fear for our aging citizens that are not able to travel to make a necessary purchase. I fear for our City losing the revenue to take care of our town. I fear for our hospital not being able to function as we lose population. I fear for our churches as our support resources dwindle down. But I don't think it's too late. I am always amazed by the way our community will come together to help a grieving family get through a difficult time. The way we pulled together to provide financial aid to a local family fighting a severe illness. The way we rally around a family to provide moral support as they face a critical family crisis. Can we also rally around our local business community? We have some great businesses here in town with local employees. Some of these businesses are struggling to

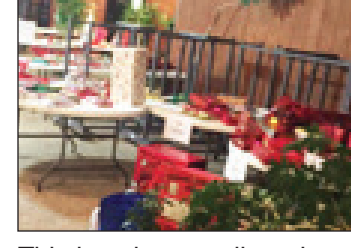
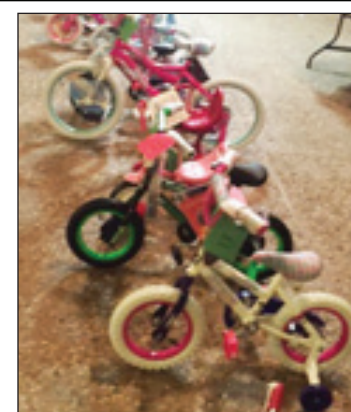

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND REPLACING PRIOR ORDINANCE PROVISIONS RELATED TO WATER AND SEWER RATES, AND GARBAGE COLLECTION RATES, AND OTHER RELATED FEES FOR THE CITY OF WHEELER, TEXAS, ADDING PROVISIONS FOR LATE FEES, ADDING A NEW SECTION PROVIDING FOR THE IMPOSITION OF A LIEN ON AN OWNER'S PROPERTY, OTHER THAN HOMESTEAD OR RENTAL PROPERTY, AFTER NOTICE FOR DELINQUENT BILLS FOR UTILITY SERVICE TO THE PROPERTY, PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE, AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Wheeler, Texas has previously passed ordinance provisions regarding the water and sewer rates, and garbage collection rates, and other related fees within the city limits; and

WHEREAS, the periodic evaluation and revision of utility rates and charges is necessary to provide sufficient revenue to operate and maintain a utility system; and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary and desirable to amend the billing and collection procedures and administrative fees charged for delinquent payments and

non-payment of residential water and sewer accounts, to clarify the collection procedures and to provide reasonable compensation to the City of Wheeler for services necessitated by a customer's late payment and/or non-payment of an account; and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Wheeler, Texas now wishes to amend such ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Section 552.0025 of the Texas Local Government Code gives municipalities authority by Ordinance to impose a lien on certain owner's property for delinquent bills for utility services received by said owner or customer; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wheeler provides utility service(s) within the City and experiences owners and customers being delinquent on the payment of outstanding bills; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes it is in the best interest of the citizens of Wheeler to have the ability to impose a lien on eligible properties as a means of securing payment of such delinquent bills.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Wheeler, Texas that the Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

1. FINDINGS OF FACT

2. ENACTMENT

The Code of Ordinances, City of Wheeler, Texas, is hereby amended to read in accordance with Attachment A, which is attached hereto and incorporated into this Ordinance for all intents and purposes. Sections of the Code shall be renumbered as necessary.

3. REPEALER

All ordinances, resolutions, or parts thereof that are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters regulated herein.

4. SEVERABILITY

Should any of the clauses, sentences, paragraphs, sections or parts of this Ordinance be deemed invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable by a court of law or administrative agency with jurisdiction over the matter, such action shall not be construed to affect any other valid portion of this Ordinance.

5. CODIFICATION

The City Secretary is hereby directed to record and publish the attached rules, regulations and policies as authorized by Section 52.001 of the Texas Local Government Code.

6. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage and publication.

7. PROPER NOTICE & MEETING

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the

public, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551. Notice was also provided as required by Chapter 52 of the Texas Local Government Code.

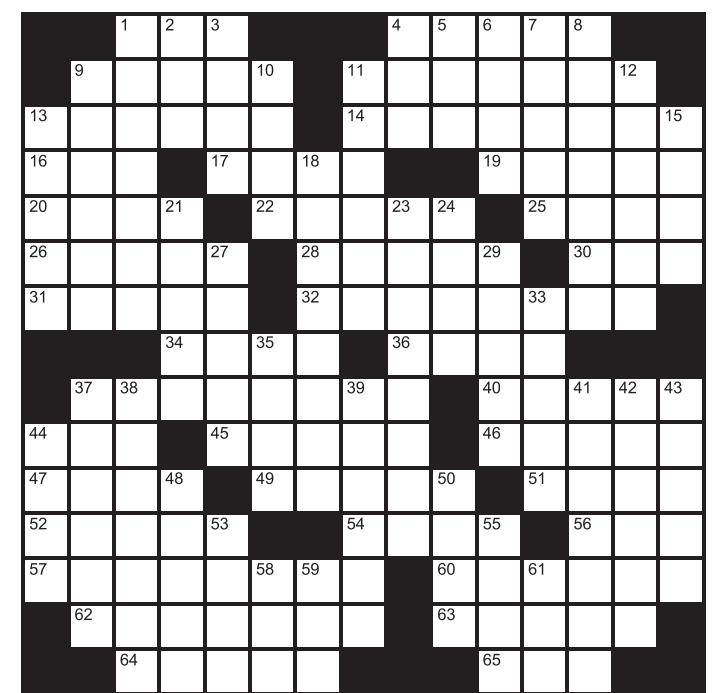

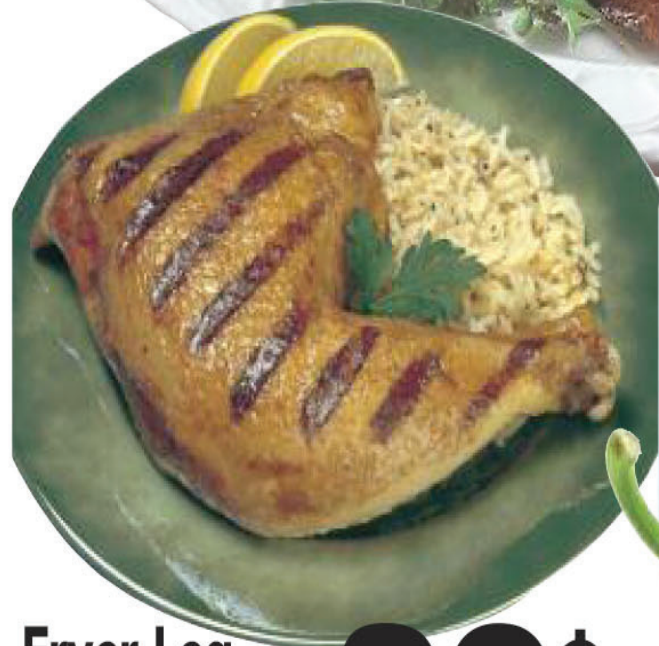
