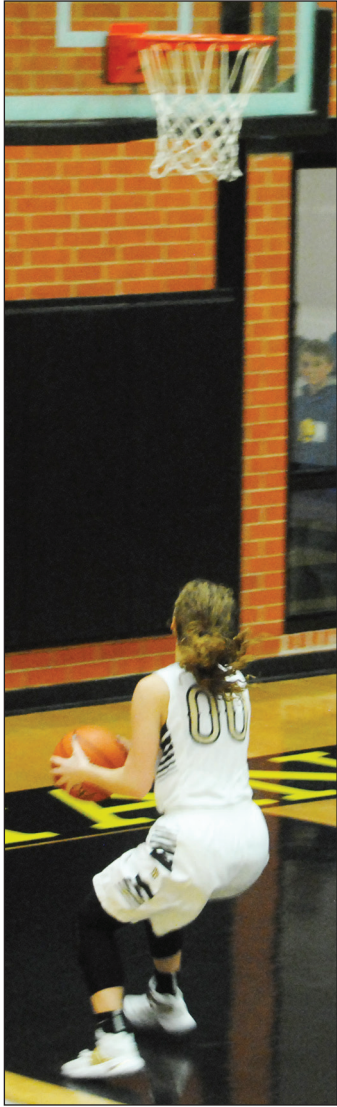

RECOGNITION OF GUESTS: Kristen Moudy, Wheeler EDC Director was present for the meeting.

NEW BUSINESS: Approval of Minutes- Louis Stas made a motion which was seconded by Rhonda Meriwether to approve the minutes from the November 2016 meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Note: No meeting was held in December 2016.

the following deposits: Memorial-\$25.00; Thursday Review Club-\$1,371.92. The B&G Electric was outstanding at this time, leaving the December 2016 balance at \$37,865.70.

Wheeler E.D.C. grant update-Kristen Moudy reported that the Wheeler E.D.C. has approved granting the museum \$7,000.00 after Pam Hill met with the committee and presented a Projected Completion Cost report. She stated that advertising costs would be paid by the EDC and not have to be taken from the \$7,000.00 grant.

Wheeler County grant update-Pam Hill stated that she had spoken to Wheeler County Judge Hefley and he informed her that Wheeler County would grant the museum \$4,000.00.

Rhonda Meriwether made a motion which was seconded by Ada Lester to request that

President Pam Hill write letters to the EDC and Wheeler County and officially request the above funds. Motion carried unanimously.

Deed of transfer from Wheeler Centennial Historical Association Inc. to Wheeler Historical Museum- After discussion it was decided that we should seek legal option before executing a Deed of Transfer, due to the wording in the Deed from the Wheeler School to the museum which states: "If Grantee discontinues use of the above described realty, or any part thereof, for public purposes or executes a document that purports to convey the above described realty, or any part thereof, the Property shall revert to Grantor, its successor and assigns." We agreed to ask Renee if she would ask Jim Fling for his opinion.

Computer purchase-Louis Stas made a motion which was seconded by Rhonda Meriwether to purchase a refurbished computer from The Mac Man in Moore, Oklahoma and allow up to \$1,200.00 for the expenditure. Motion carried unanimously. Louis will be in charge of the purchase. Payment will be from the EDC monies.

B&G Electric bill- Pam presented a revised bill from the company. They lowered the bill from \$6,502.95 to \$4,000.00, which was for the installation of 30 outlets in the walls.

Louis Stas made a motion which was seconded by Ada Lester to approve and pay the above bill in the amount of \$4,000.00.

Archival supply purchase-Discussion was had concerning the need to purchase cases/containers for preservation of the textiles that were donated by Alan Bean. Rhonda Meriwether stated that she has 4 jackets, 1 suit, 1 sweater, cap, shoes and there are also a number of newspapers.

Ada Lester made a motion which was seconded by Rhonda Meriwether to purchase supplies from Gaylord Archivals.com and expend up to \$1,000.00 for the initial purchase. Motion carried unanimously. Payment will be from the EDC monies.

Bar Code scanner purchase-The approval of this item was done in the November 2016 meeting. No action needed.

Exhibit Committees- The need to start working on the exhibits was discussed and the order of creation. Rhonda Meriwether mentioned that she felt that the Red River War exhibit should be created first along with the Battle of Sweetwater Creek, Custer on the Sweetwater and Fort Elliott. It was also mentioned that we might contact Mr. Carillo at the Wheeler School for creation of tops on the display cases that are currently at the museum. Types of clear materials (glass vs acrylic) to be used on some

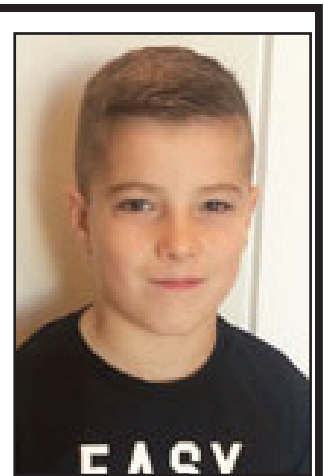

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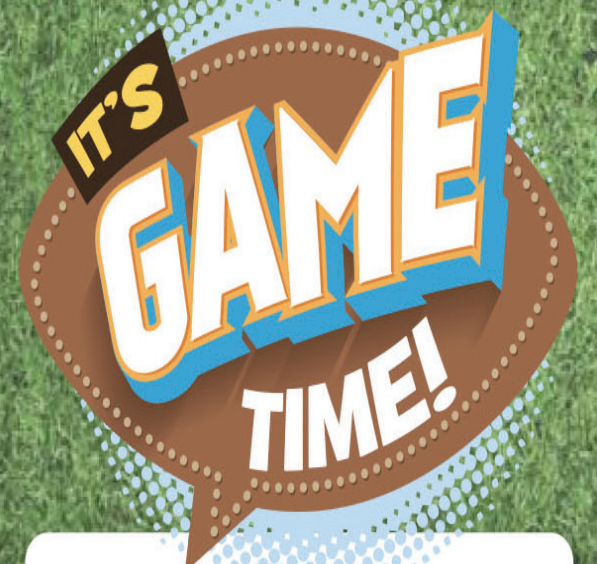
