# 90,000 ACRES BURNS IN WHEELER COUNTY

## Grass, Utility Lines, Outbuildings, Fences, But No Homes Lost!

The Wheeler County Volunteer Fire Department was called into action on Monday, March 6, 2017, at 4:15 p.m. The men and equipment did not return to the station until Wednesday, March 8 at 4:15.

What has been named “Lefors East Fire” resulted in three lives lost, \$135,000 acres burned. Some outbuildings were

lost, but no homes have been reported destroyed. Farmers and ranchers lost miles and miles of fences. Highlines and utility lines were also lost. Calculations are still underway in the number of head of cattle lost.

Hay is being brought in from all over the country to feed the cattle remaining.

Within Wheeler County 90,000 acres were burned. Would have been a total loss, had it not been for **Wheeler County’s VOLUNTEER FIREMEN!** Have you thanked one of them yet?

These many hours of work by our firemen would not be possible without those on the sidelines that jump to help with drinking water, drinks, food and snacks. (Continued Page 2)

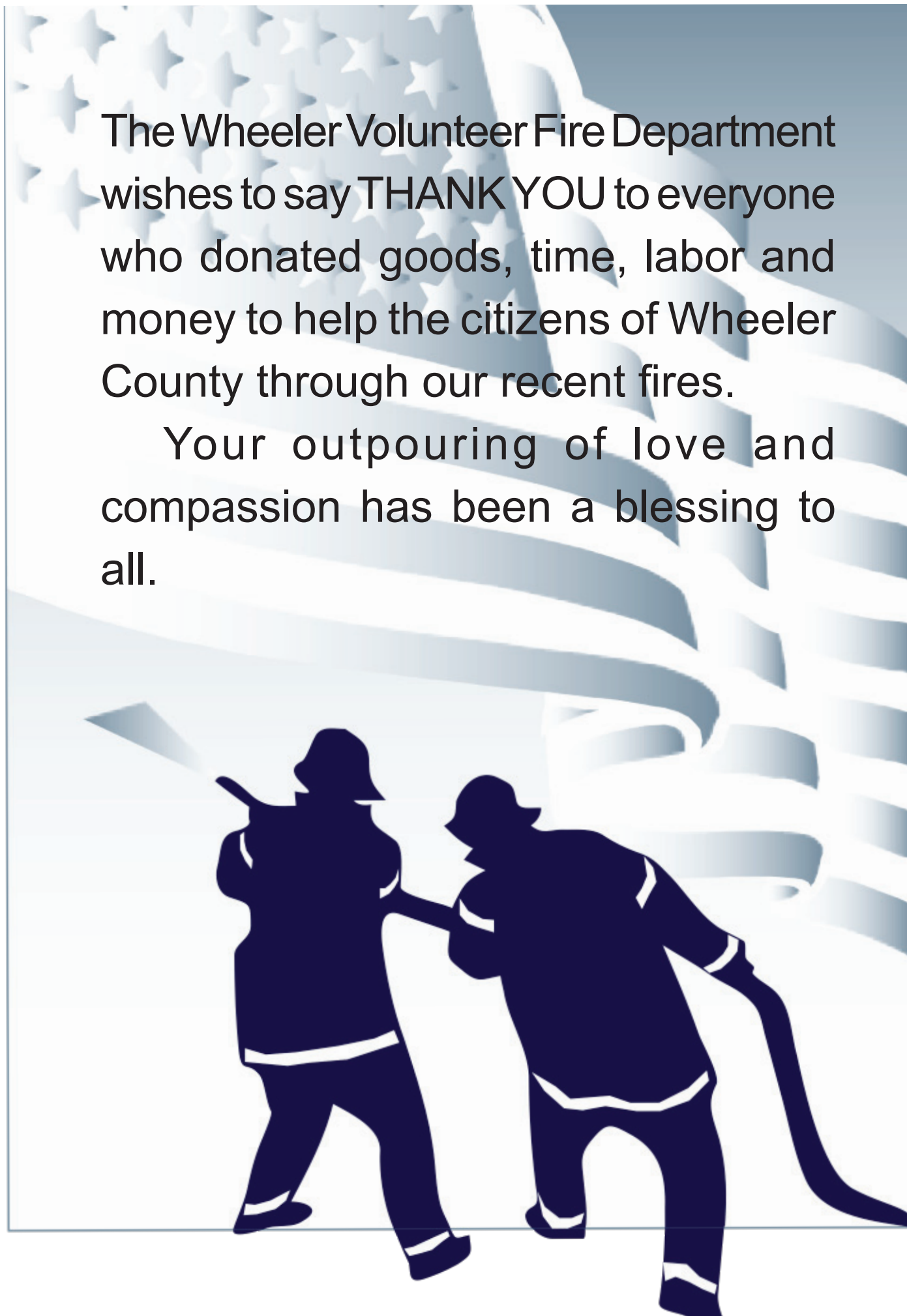

## A TIMELY REMINDER Wheeler County Stage One Burn Ban

Order Prohibiting or Restricting Outdoor Burning

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County that all outdoor burning is prohibited in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code Sec. 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for:

Firefighter Training;  
Planting or harvesting of agricultural crops;

Burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Sec. 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Sec. 153.047, Natural Resources Code;

Public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations;

Welding is allowed by commercial/professional welders under the following guidelines only:

A spotter is required for each welder, each cutter, each grinder or for any activity that causes or may cause a spark.

A diameter across the welding area shall be a minimum of 25 feet and clear of vegetation, if possible, and kept wet. The welding diameter must be three times the height of the

actual welding. Example: if welding is occurring ten (10) feet off the ground, a diameter of thirty (30) feet must be protected.

A minimum of 200 gallons of pressured water must be available on site.

Each welding vehicle must have at least one (1) fully charged 10 lb. Class ABC chemical fire extinguisher on site.

If the work area cannot be cleared of vegetation, proper precautionary measures must be taken (example: protecting brush, etc., by utilizing fire resistant tarps).

Each site will have cellular telephone communications for

emergency response.

Welding in an enclosed area is acceptable.

In accordance with Local Government Code Sec.

352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

## General Requirements for Agricultural Burning

The following information is provided for your protection when conducting agricultural burning.

### Main points:

- You are responsible for everything that happens after you start a fire.
- You must not infringe upon your neighbors property or environment.
- No burning during Red Flag Conditions.
- You must notify the dispatch office in your area prior to burning.

The Outdoor Burning Rule sets the following general

requirements for allowable outdoor burning. These requirements apply to the specific situations for which they are mentioned above. They are designed to reduce the likelihood that burning will create a nuisance, cause a hazard, or harm the environment. The party responsible for the burn remains liable for damages, injuries or other consequences that may result from burning, even when it is carried out in compliance with these regulations.

Burn only outside the cor-

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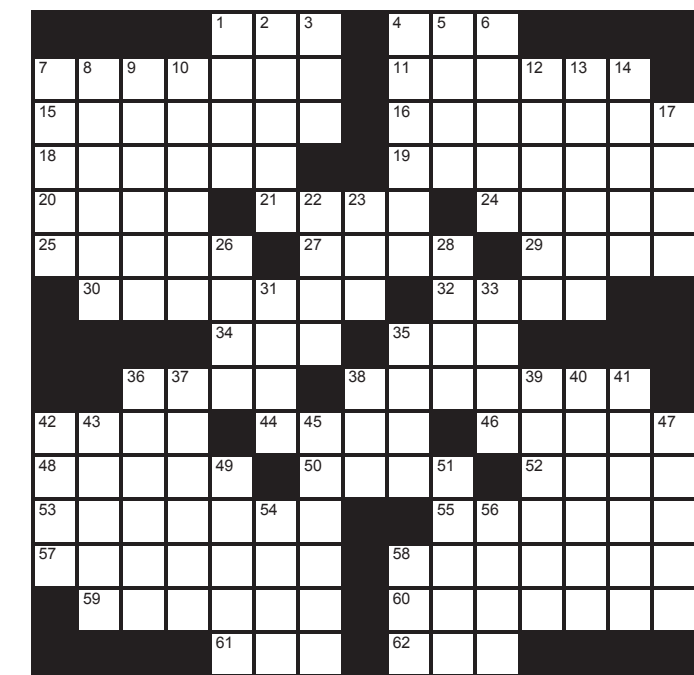

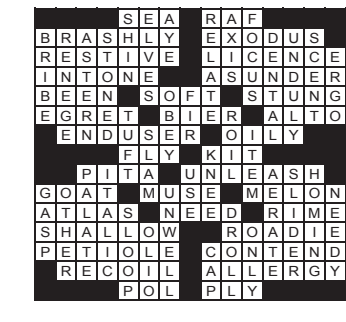

porate limits of a city or town, unless the incorporated city or town has an ordinance, consistent with the Texas Clean Air Act, Subchapter E, that permits burning (No burning inside city limits).

Commence or continue burning only when the wind direction and other weather conditions are such that the smoke and other pollutants will not present a hazard to any public road, landing strip, or navigable water or have an adverse effect on any off-site structure containing "sensitive receptors" (a residence, business, farm building or greenhouse).

Post someone to flag traffic if at any time the burning causes or may tend to cause smoke to blow onto or across a road or highway.

Keep fires downwind of, or at least 300 feet away from, any neighboring structure that contains sensitive receptors. This requirement may be waived only with the prior written approval of whoever owns or rents the adjacent property and either resides or conducts business there.

Begin burning no earlier than one hour after sunrise, end it the same day no later than one hour before sunset,

and make sure that a responsible party is present while the burn is active and the fire is progressing. At the end of the burn, extinguish isolated residual fires or smoldering objects if the smoke they produce can be a nuisance or a traffic hazard. Don't start burning unless weather conditions are such that the smoke will dissipate (winds of a least 6 miles per; no temperature inversions) while still allowing the fire to be contained and controlled (winds no faster than 23 miles per hour). [National Weather Service will issue a Red Flag Warning when: Winds are expected to be above 20 mph and Relative Humidity is expected to be below 15%. No Burning is allowed under these conditions.]

Don't burn any electrical insulation, treated lumber, plastics, non-wooden construction or demolition materials, heavy oils, asphaltic materials, potentially explosive materials, chemical wastes, or items that contain natural or synthetic rubber.

Always notify the Wheeler County Sheriff's Office or Shamrock Police Dept. prior to starting burn.
