County Accident Claims Teenager

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) was called to a one-vehicle crash Sunday on County Road (CR) 4 in Wheeler County, resulting in the death of one person.

At approximately 6:45 p.m., Kynna Peers, 15, of Mobeetie. was driving a 2003 Chevrolet Tahoe south on CR-4, approximately 5 miles northwest of Mobeetie. Peers left the roadway and lost control of the vehicle which caused it to roll over multiple times.

Peers was pronounced dead on scene by Wheeler County Justice of the Peace, Mark Brown.

The two passengers, Hannah Shepard, 16, and Heather Bell, 18, of Mobeetie, were air-lifted to the hospital with serious injuries.

> "Every individual rancher will weather these losses differently, depending on what their financial position was at the time of the fire," Amosson said. "If they had large losses and already had a marginal financial position then it could put them out of business, but in most cases it will just create more financial stress for them. and they will keep ranching."

> For many ranchers, little insurance money will come into play, he said.

> "Typically, not much is insured except for ranch houses, sometimes major buildings and once in awhile the cattle," Amosson said.

Ranchers (from Page 1) the 2014 farm bill Livestock Indemnity Program, he said. Eventually, livestock losses are required to be registered with the U.S. Department of Agriculture Farm Service Agency in order to receive partial compensation.

With proper documentation, this program can compensate ranchers for 75 percent of the market value of cattle lost in the fire until the preset loss limit for a producer is reached, Amosson said. Additionally, a portion of fencing replacement costs may be covered through the USDA's Natural Resource Conservation Service Environmental Quality Incentives Program

The key to the matter is ranchers need to contact their local NRCS and FSA offices if they are considering any cost share possibilities before they start rebuilding fences. FSA requires that the producer set up an appointment with FSA in order for them to do an inspection on what is left of existing fences. After inspection by FSA, producers can receive cost share on fencing of up to 75% on perimeter and cross fencing. NRCS also has available funds to assist with cross fencing and producers should also contact them before fencing begins. Once again it is imperative, that producers contact the USDA offices before they begin fencing.

For fire victims, many of the hay supplies listed and trucking will be free of charge. There is a large listing of hay donors on the site listed.

Multiple accounts from donations have been set up across the panhandle for victims where they can apply for financial assistance. For a listing of those organizations and applications, contact the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service in your county.

Our communities are blessed to have so many people from across the state and the nation provide supplies, labor, and financial assistance to all of our producers and families affected by the fires. May God bless all who have been affected and all who have provided assistance.




