County Employee Burned In Magic City Fire

On March 23, James Moya, a fire fighter and county employee, was on a road grader when it stalled out and he was unable to escape. The heat was so intense that the windows blew out. His father got to him and pulled him out. A medical helicopter from Altus, Oklahoma flew in to get him because Amarillo couldn't fly due to the high wind speeds. He was taken to Lubbock burn center. His mother said his face and arms are the worst from what they can tell. James is expected to recover with burns over 30% of his body, face and arms. The cause of the fire is unknown. 2,000 acres burned in the Magic City area before it was brought under control.

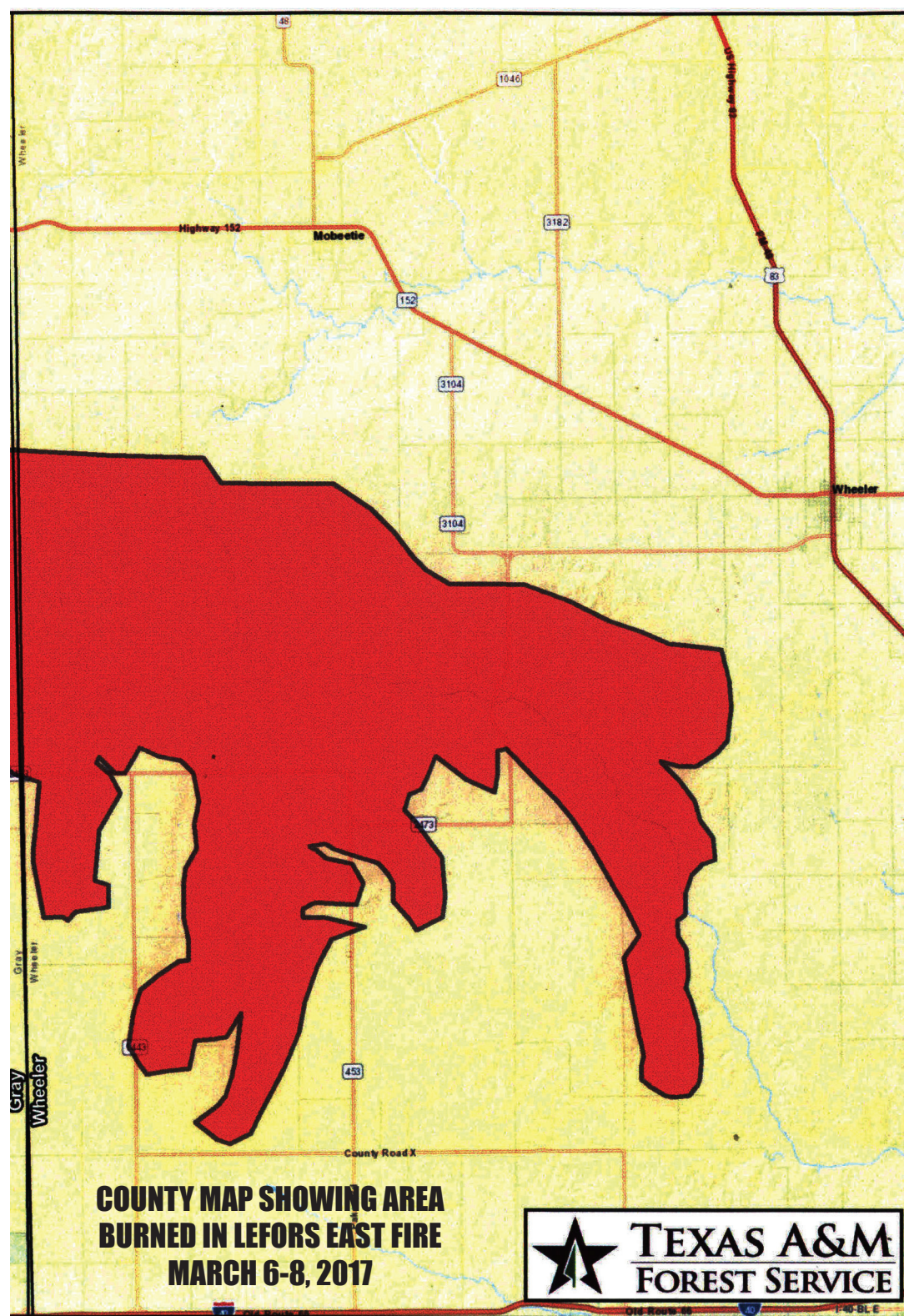
