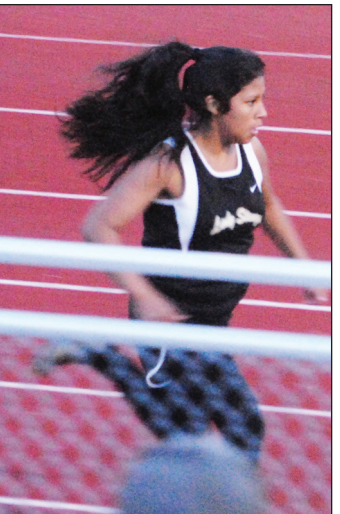

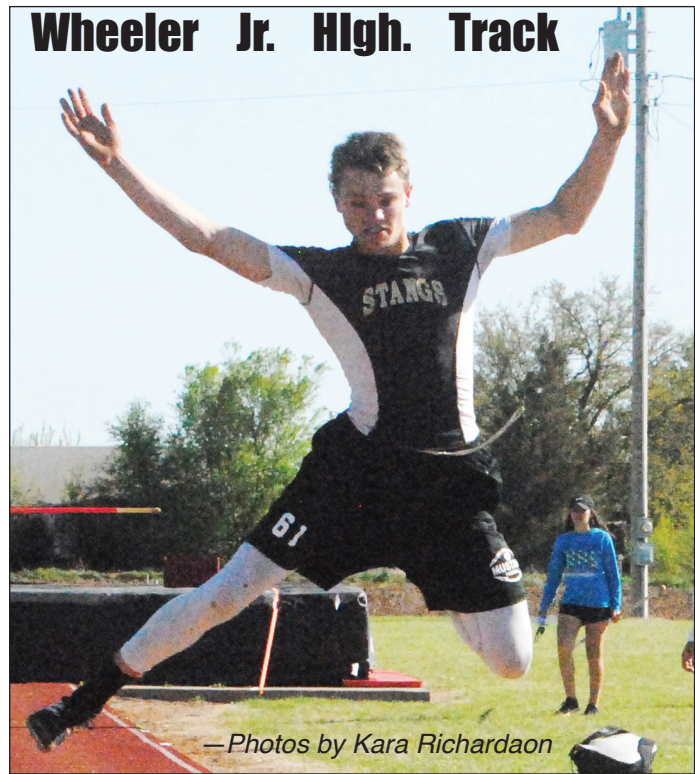

Mac Purcell was born September 8, 1954 in Herford, Texas, to Gene and Bobbie Walsler Purcell. He graduated from Canadian High School in 1973 and had tremendous pride of being a Canadian Wildcat. Mac had many athletic accomplishments in football, basketball, and track. In 1971, he made all-district defense in football.

He received defensive line-backer and offensive back in football in 1972. He received a full football scholarship to Oklahoma Panhandle State University until he was injured and couldn't play anymore. Then he came back home to help his father run a dairy. He married Gay LoRel Zybach on January 31, 1975 in Wheeler. Mac and Gay have been married for 42 years.

He loved his family, ranch

life, and spending time with family at Pinon Valley Lodge in Colorado, riding razors and sitting on the deck enjoying God's creation. Mac was known to have a huge heart and would help anyone in need. He had a calling to minister to others and lead them to Christ. He always had his side-kick, Hershey his dog, with him whether sitting in his lap or out feeding his cattle.

Mac was a member of the

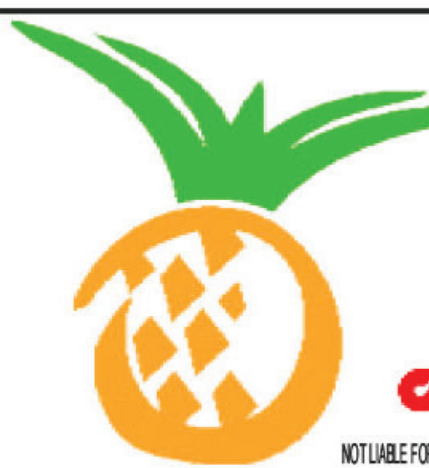

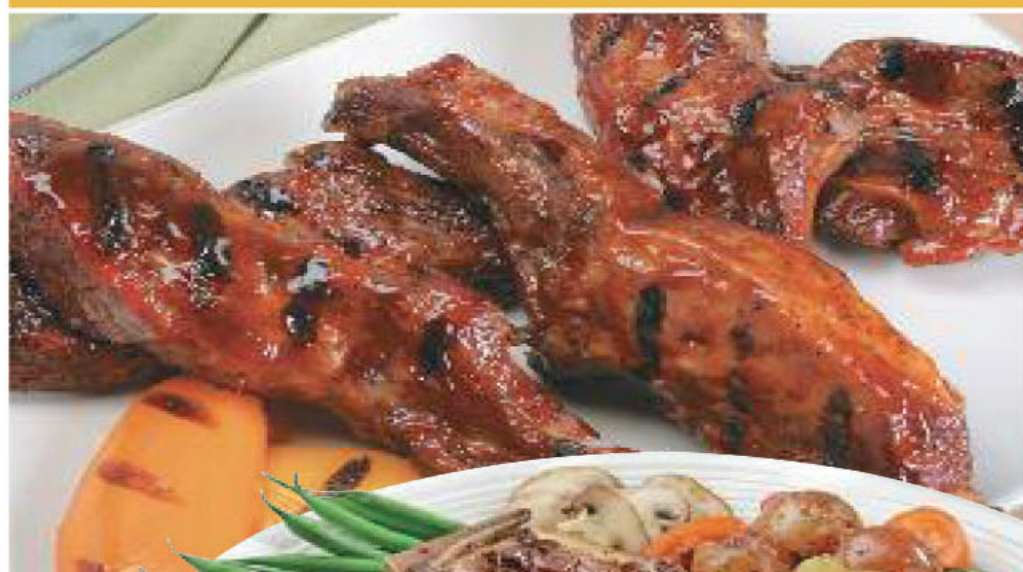
