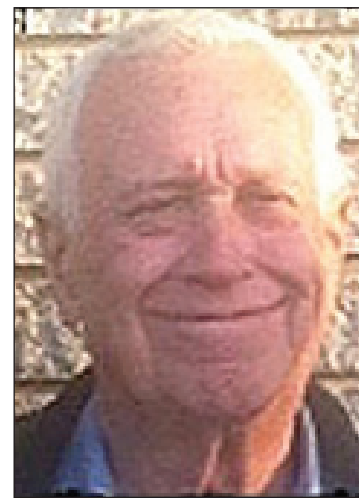

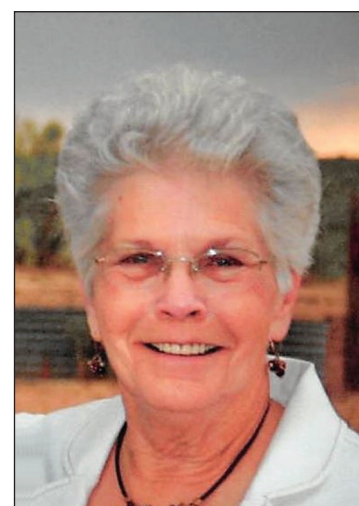

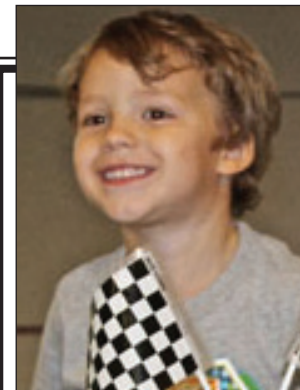

That Bluegrass Band

That Bluegrass Band was formed in 2015. We play traditional bluegrass and bluegrass gospel music as well as a number of original pieces. Don Hagen keeps that bluegrass sound rolling with his solid banjo tunes. The steady rhythm and timeless flatpicking of the guitar is in the hands of Michael Lindesmith. Michael will also step up to the mic and sing some of his favorite songs. Misty Brown adds that classic mandolin chop to the group, however, most folks will remember her for her lead and harmony vocals. The high energy and lonesome sounds of a fiddle are added by Robert Billbrey. Robert also has a definite country style to his vocals which you can hear when he takes a turn on the lead vocals. Lisa Hagen provides that steady beat on the old upright bass, as well as lead and harmony vocals. Misty and Lisa are the primary songwriters of the group, although several of the songs have been a complete "group effort".

Hanks & Company, a traditional bluegrass/bluegrass gospel band, is comprised of members Eddie Hanks, Debbie Hanks, Josh Brooks. The group loves the Lord and

enjoys playing for churches, festivals, fundraisers, or any event in need of a traditional bluegrass sound with a positive, uplifting message.

Eddie and wife, Debbie helped form the band Cedar Creek in 2007. In 2008 they left the group, joined up with Danny Milner and they became Hanks & Company. The band released one CD titled "Songs to Sing, Tales to Tell" in 2010 and has another one on the way.

Eddie has been playing guitar and mandolin since he was about 7 years old. He began playing in his father's band called Texas Grass then moved on to play in Southern Union in 1992. Since 2004, Eddie has concentrated mainly on his banjo pickin'.

Debbie had no experience with bluegrass before she met Eddie. She enjoyed singing in church and school choirs and she sang with an a Capella group while attending Texas Tech University. Eddie began teaching her how to play the bass in 2004 and states that he has "created a monster". This couple lives in Seymour, TX.

Josh Brooks was raised in Blue Ridge, Georgia. He began playing at the age of four then went on to play professionally as a teenager with Honi Deaton and Dream where he played banjo for over ten years. He even played at the Grand Ole Opry! Josh can play just about anything with strings and has a great voice. Josh joined the group in February 2017.

Garland Blocker & Blue Tradition

Garland Blocker and Blue Tradition is made up of Garland Blocker, Melvin Stephens, Nigal Blocker, Ajay Blocker, and Jennifer Blocker.

Garland is a great banjo player, playing any style including clawhammer. He also sings both lead and harmony. His influences are Ralph Stanley, Earl Scruggs, and Don Reno. Garland also plays guitar, mandolin, dobro, and bass and occasionally gets hold of a fiddle.

Melvin Stephens plays the mandolin and sings lead and harmony. He also plays guitar, fiddle, and bass. Melvin has a unique mandolin style with influences of the Louvin Brothers, Delmore Brothers, Blue Sky Boys, Bill Monroe, and many others.

Jennifer Blocker plays a very solid bass for the band. It is her job to keep the rest of them in line and "on time." She also plays the guitar. Jennifer does the booking for the band and takes good care of the business.

Nigal Blocker is 16 years old and plays mandolin and guitar. He also sings both lead and harmony. Ajay Blocker is 15 years old and plays guitar. He also sings lead and harmony. The boys have had their instruments for about 9 years but just started to play about a year and a half ago.

It all started with two Cole brothers marrying two Bradley sisters. 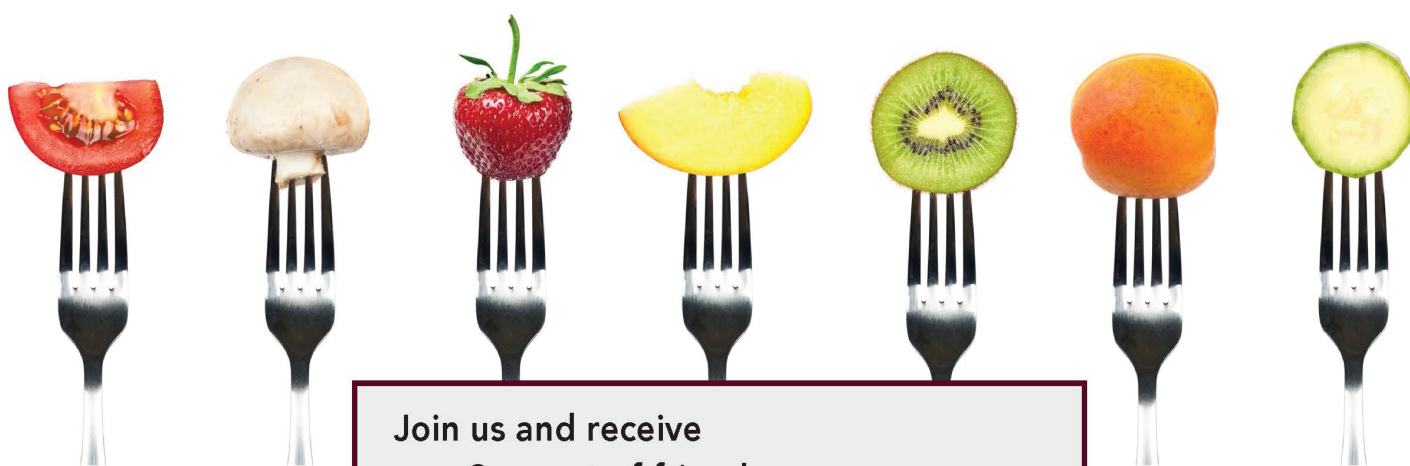
