of the drivers. The Shamrock Fire Department wants to give a very well deserved THANK YOU to Wheeler County Deputy Lonnie Rawlins, who responded directly to the scene, when the call came in. He was able to get there quickly and with quick thinking and a calm head, he removed two occupants from one truck. One was disoriented and didn't know what was going on and the other had been unconscious at

the time of arrival. Both were moved to a safe distance. Soon after, both vehicles were completely consumed in flame. Due to Deputy Rawlins quick thinking and quick response, he was able to save the lives of 2 of the three people involved in the wreck. That action deserved to be noted and a BIG THANK you to Deputy Rawlins for his heroic efforts.

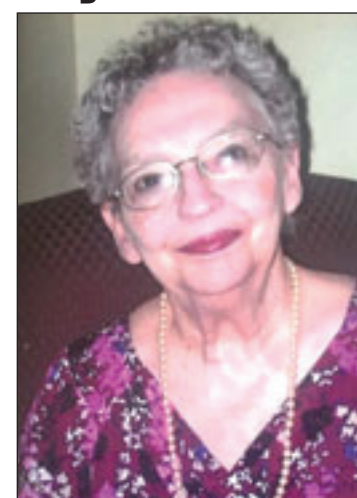

Sybil Agnes Alexander, 84, of Tuttle, Oklahoma died Thursday, August 3, 2017, at Yukon, Oklahoma.

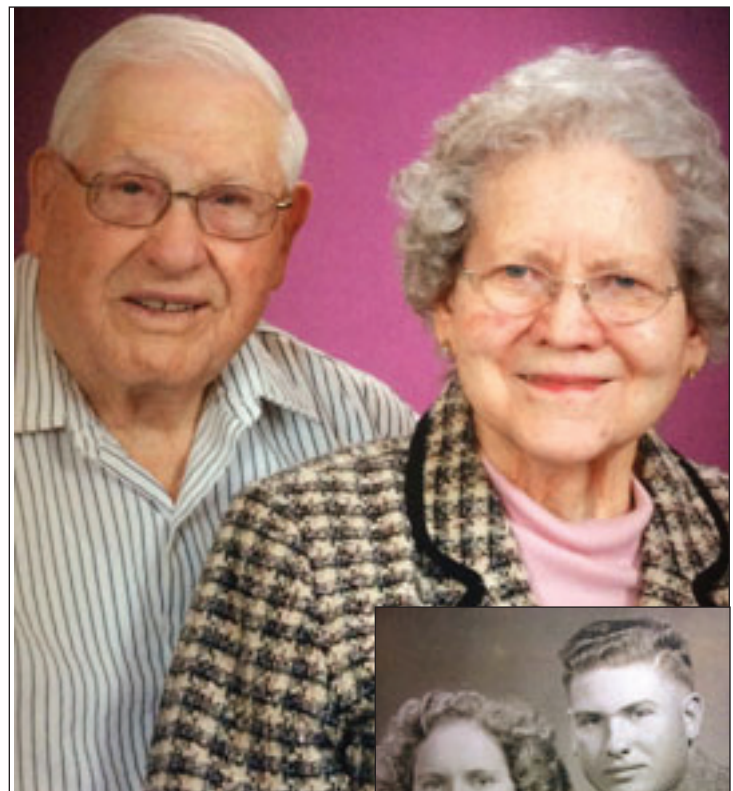

replacement of Salt Creek bridge on CR P. The county's cost of the replacement will be \$31,000; this can be by cash or "inkind" (The county agrees to do work on roads elsewhere in the county, which amounts to the \$31,000; which was the county's decision.)

• The court approved the bond for County Auditor Nicole Mock in the amount of \$5,000.

• The maintenance agreement for the District Clerk's Cannon copier was approved. The cost is \$34.00 per month plus per copy cost.

• Miguel Badillo was removed from the Wheeler County Sheriff's payroll.

• Rachel Attebery was removed from the Wheeler County Sheriff's payroll.

• Anna Holland was added to the Wheeler County Sheriff's payroll as a full time employee at a cost of \$2896.96, effective 08-06-2017.

• April Lilly was added to the Wheeler County Sheriff's payroll as a full time employee at a cost of \$2896.96, effective 08-07-2017.

• The commissioners approved the health insurance plan for the budget year. (The insured's prescriptions will not be covered if they are filled locally.)

• The court approved the Rural Volunteer Fire Department supplements for the budget year. Wheeler's and Shamrock's monthly allowance is \$2300.00 per month. Kelton, Allison, Briscoe and Mobeetie is \$1350.00 per month. This will be \$12,000 over 2017-18.

• The court is considering the Motor Vehicle Optional County Road and Bridge Fee. The fee is presently \$5.00 per vehicle. The increase of the fee to \$10 would benefit the county road maintenance by \$30,000 per year. The decision was tabled until the August 28 meeting.

• The proposed Tax has been set at 0.48647.

• The commissioners voted to pay the bills for the time period of 7/22/2017 to 8/10/2017 in the amount of \$116,003.87. The gross payroll approved for payment was \$119,696.95.

The next meeting of the Wheeler County Commissioners' Court will be Monday, August 28 at 10:00 a.m.

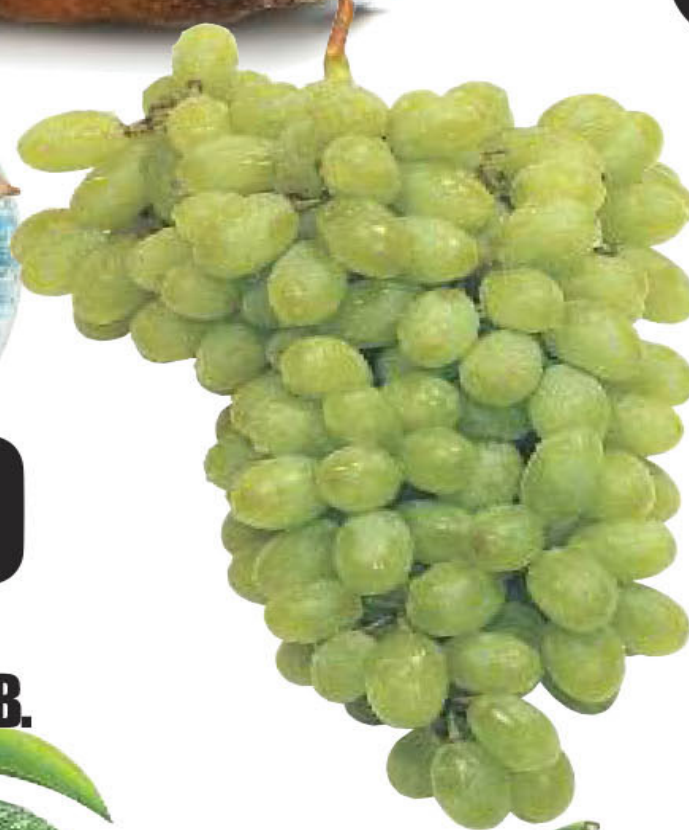
