

\$90,000 Budgeted For Shamrock Dispatch

At the 9-28-17 Commissioners' Court meeting three commissioners voted to approve a Dispatch Service Contract with the City of Shamrock, Texas at a budgeted amount of \$90,000 per year which covers dispatch, phone lines and

salary supplements. Commissioner Steve Walker, Pct. 1, voted against the contract after Sheriff Crites stated in open court that he did not use the Shamrock Dispatch, as the Sheriff's office has newer and better equipment.

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in regular session on Monday, September 25, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main

Street, Wheeler, Texas to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

First on the agenda was a Budget Hearing.

At 10:00 a.m. court reconvened with 22 items were on the agenda for action by the court.

- The 2017-2018 Budget was adopted.
- The Tax rate was set at 0.48647. The rate last year was 0.47182.
- There were no minutes from previous meetings to approve.
- One budget amendment was approved.
- Numerous budget transfers were approved.
- There were no line-item transfers.
- No action was taken on the Burn Ban.

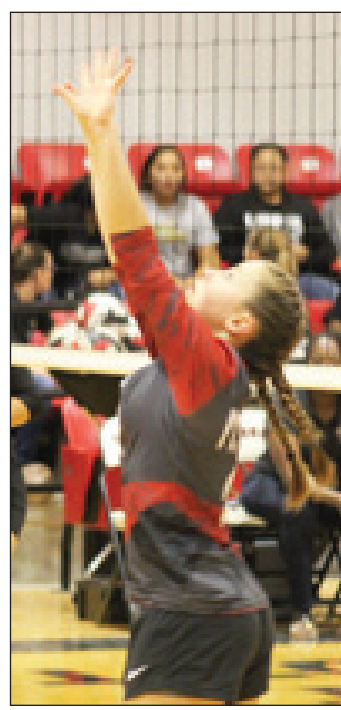

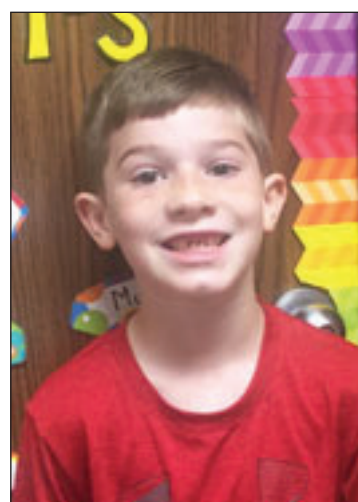

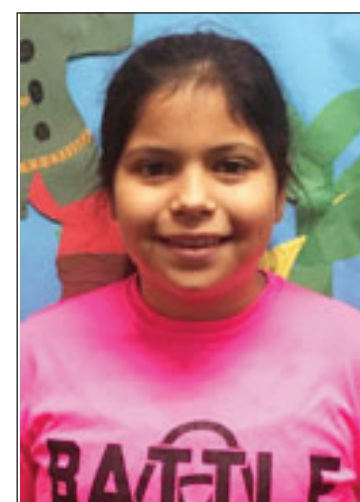

Mayor McCain called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Kendall Hefley motioned to approve the Special session meeting minutes that took place on August 3, 2017, as written. Britt McCarter seconded the motion. The motion carried with all 5 voting in favor of, 0 against, 0 abstaining, and 0 absent.

Carol Porton made a motion to approve the July council meeting minutes as written. Motion seconded by Stacy McQueen. The motion carried with all 5 voting in favor of, 0 against, 0 abstaining, and 0 absent.

Malcolm Belote approached the Council about the City utility workers turning off his water due to a water leak. The old meter has been pulled and he wants a new one installed and does not want to pay the bill for the water leak, because he does not believe there was a leak. Stacy McQueen motioned that the City install a new meter, check for leak with new meter in place, meanwhile the Belote's must pay a minimum payment of \$12.00 monthly. If it is determined that there is a water leak, they will be responsible for the full amount of the bill, and if the new meter does not show a water leak, his bill will be credited accordingly. The motion was seconded by Kendall Hefley. The motion carried with all 5 voting in favor of, 0 against, 0 abstaining, and 0 absent.

Kristen Moudy approached the Council with a request from the EDC on behalf of a hopeful new business owner, Donna Langston with "Nanna's Sweet Treats". The EDC voted at their regular monthly meeting to guarantee up to \$7500.00 of a business loan at FSB for Ms. Langston, upon approval of the City Council, to be used to cover some start-up costs of opening her new bakery. Britt McCarter made a motion to support the EDC's motion to guarantee payment for Mrs. Langston's business loan in the amount of \$7500.00 by designating this amount of the EDC's business development budget to be used if necessary to assist Mrs. Langston in paying the loan, and if not, the designation of monies should be released at the time of loan payoff. The motion was seconded by Kendall Hefley. The motion carried with all 5 voting in favor of, 0 against, 0 abstaining, and 0 absent.

Amy Zybach presented the Council with the 2017 Audit Proposal. Carol Porton motioned to accept and approve the Audit proposal as written. Don Rose seconded the motion. The motion carried with all 5 voting in favor of, 0 against, 0 abstaining, and 0 absent.

Amy Zybach presented the financial statements with suggested amendments to the 2017/18 budget as follows:

1. General Fund – Transfer to Capital Projects from \$0 to \$950,000
2. General Fund – Swimming pool operating transfers from \$29,000 to \$30,000
3. Capital Projects Fund – Interfund revenue from \$0 to \$950,000
4. Capital Projects Fund – Capital outlay – pool from \$0 to \$950,000
5. Swimming Pool Fund – office supplies from \$850 to \$950
6. Swimming Pool Fund – Salaries from \$18,825 to \$23,825

Stacy McQueen made the motion to approve amendments to the 2017/18 budget

as presented. Motion seconded by Carol Porton. The motion carried with all 5 in favor of, 0 against, 0 abstaining, and 0 absent.

Paul Arganbright reported on the monthly maintenance report.

Carol Porton motioned to adopt an Ordinance levying a tax rate for the City of Wheeler, Texas for the tax year 2017 utilizing the effective tax rate of .59815/\$100 based on the City of Wheeler's 2016 certified taxable value of \$60,699,050, for the purpose of maintenance and operation of this city and to continue the .15019/\$100 Debt Rate for the payment of principle and interest on debt of this city. The motion was seconded by Britt McCarter. The motion carried with all 5 voting in favor of, 0 against, 0 abstaining, and 0 absent.

At 8:10 p.m., Britt McCarter made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Stacy McQueen. All in favor.

the teletype system shall be vested in the Chief of Police of the City of Shamrock. Operation and supervision of the dispatch system, including the employment of personnel shall be done by a Chief Dispatcher according to policies set out by the City of Shamrock.

SECTION III

The dispatch system shall be separated on the accounting records of the City as an individual department of the City, and personnel of the Dispatch System shall be employees of the City.

SECTION IV

The City shall be responsible for providing all radio equipment, the maintenance and upkeep of such equipment, suitable for the operation of the dispatch system as such system is presently operating.

SECTION V

It is further understood that the County shall receive dispatch service for all County Officers, Department of Public Safety Officers, Texas Parks and Wildlife Officers, Wheeler County Ambulance Service, Shamrock Fire Department and all other County and State Officers operating within Wheeler County, Texas.

SECTION VI

The County shall pay unto the City fifty percent (50%) of all personnel services along with fifty percent (50%) of telephone and teletype expenses, such combined expense not to exceed \$64,160.00 (personnel

SECTION VII

The County shall provide housing for the dispatch system and shall be responsible for all utilities with the exception of telephone service. All long distance calls shall be paid for by the department responsible for making the calls. Each party hereto shall be responsible for fifty percent (50%) of the base telephone and teletype charges. The City shall be responsible for insuring the communications equipment of the dispatch system.

SECTION VIII

This contractual agreement shall be for a period of one year beginning October 1, 2017 and ending September 30, 2018. At or before the end of such period, the Parties hereto shall meet together for the purpose of renegotiating a similar contract for the ensuing year. This contract may be terminated by either of the parties with such termination to be effective not less than thirty (30) days from date of such written notice.

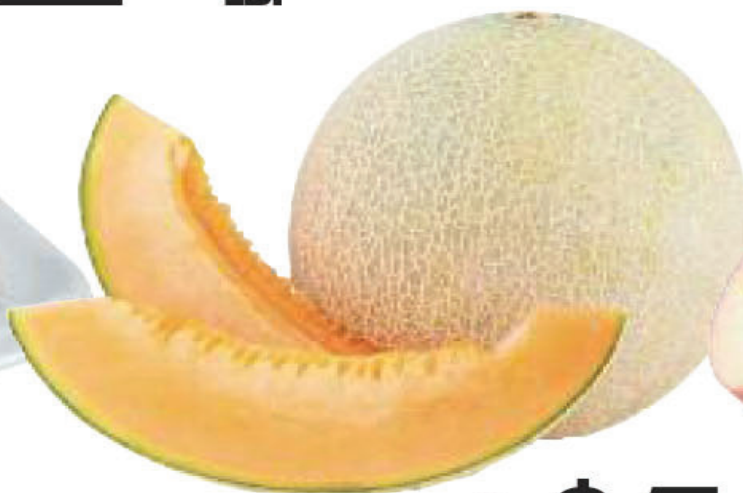
