

# Only One Contested Race In May 5 Election

Local voters in the May 5 election have only one decision to make. The race for Place 2 on the City Council is the only contested race.

Don Rose filed for re-election and drew two contestants; Tammy Baker Moore and Leon Smith are also seeking the position.

Mayor Bob McCain and Place 4 Councilwoman Stacy McQueen filed for re-election and did not get an opponent.

In the Parkview Hospital Election board members, Tommy Puryear, Pct. 1, and Roger Brown, Pct. 2 each filed for re-election. No election is necessary.

A Wheeler School Board election is not necessary, as Dr. LeeAnn Hillhouse and Chad Helton placed their names on the ballot for the two vacancies. Hillhouse is

presently serving and Larry Ashurst did not seek re-election.

## Primary Election Is Tuesday, Mar. 6

Early voting in the Primary Election ends Friday, March 2, at noon.

Republicans vote in their regular 10 locations with the Democrats voting in the Commissioners' Courtroom in Wheeler and Jr. Hi. Gym in Shamrock.

# Community Care: Determined—Leadership Selection

Voters in small towns throughout America will soon be selecting individuals who will control the future of their community. Some of the names on the ballots will be seen for the first time, others are again tossing their hat in the ring, while others are seeking another term of service. Regardless, each has a desire to hold office.

Within large communities where there may be many people competing for a single position, it is common for each to publish their position on various issues and where they plan to focus their attention.

However, within small communities it is less common for

issues to be addressed prior to the election. When this is the case, voters can either seek out each candidate and ask their opinion on issues of interest or simply cast their vote based on their knowledge of the candidate and their personal reputation.

Although voters tend to assume those seeking office do so to help their community accomplish particular goals, some candidates may have no such intention. Within leadership, maintaining the status quo or keeping things as they may be the goal of some who seek election.

Conversely, some candidates subscribe to a stewardship model, seeking to leave

things better than they found it. This modern leadership method is used within a variety of businesses and organizations.

However, progress is difficult without honest evaluation and within some small communities, evaluation can be confused with criticism.

The process of evaluation involves the honest examination of all aspects of a subject's merit, worth and significance. Evaluation provides tangible information that can be used to develop improvement. Criticism is simply the expression of disapproval of someone or something based on perceived faults or mistakes. It offers no tangible means for improvement.
