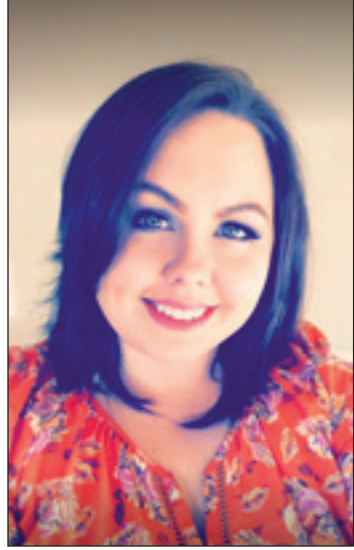

## 100-Year-Old Cemetery Looking Its Best

Halfway between the two small towns of Allison and Briscoe lies the Zybach Cemetery, one of the last remnants of an early-day pre-railroad town. Established 100 years ago in 1918, the original plot of land was donated by Clem Helton after his son Garrett died of pneumonia following a trip to Chicago. It was told by Bob Zybach that Clem commented at the time of the donation: "This corner [of the field] never would grow anything anyway."

The original one-acre cemetery acquired more land through the years, including

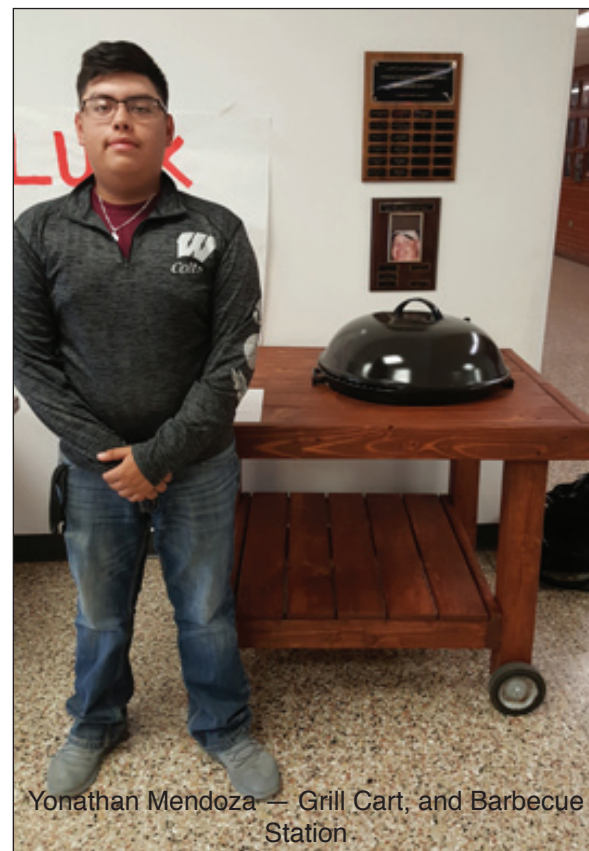

The designation is reserved for cemeteries that are at least 50 years old and documented through the Historic Texas Cemetery designation process to record their historic association and significance.

"Cemeteries are important keys in the history of Texas. Designation as a Historic Texas Cemetery helps it increase public awareness of these important cultural resources," said Mark Wolfe, executive director of the THC.

"Knowledge and education are among the best ways to guarantee the preservation of a historic cemetery."

Cemeteries hold valuable historic information and are often the last reminders of early settlements' historical events, religious beliefs, lifestyles, and genealogy. While the Historic Texas Cemetery designation encourages cemetery preservation, it cannot guarantee that a historic cemetery will avoid destruction. Threats to historic cemeteries include urban expansion and development, vandalism, grazing animals, and long-term deterioration from weather and uncontrolled vegetation.

The THC developed the Historic Texas Cemetery designation to address the destruction of historic cemeteries and the illegal removal of cemetery fixtures. Any individual or organization is eligible to submit an application for this designation.

**History of Mount Zion (Mt. Zion) Cemetery**

The history of the Mount Zion Cemetery coincides with the history of the Mount Zion School. School District #23 was first established in 1908, and its original name was Burchard School. According to Sallie Harris's book *Hide Town*, the land at that time was on the Tom Trew property, but that could not be verified. It was located in northern Wheeler County, north of Mobeetie, Texas, in Block A-2, Section 1. In 1910, it was renamed and rebounded as Mount Zion Common School District. Mount Zion had thirty-three students in the 1910-1911 school year.

In 1912, J. F. and Sallie Isham sold land to Peter Donovan and J. R. Edwards in Wheeler County, Section No. 1, Block A-2, except two acres in the northeast corner for school purposes. Mt. Zion School would be located on this land. Mount Zion Cemetery (also known as Mt. Zion Cemetery) is located south of where the school once stood. How the school and cemetery lands changed from 2 acres, to 2 1/2 acres, to 1 acre, is inconclusive. Hours of searching deed records and commissioner court records left lapses in information. It is assumed that

the first tract (2 acres) is the school land and the 2nd tract (1/2 acre) is the cemetery.

Mt. Zion School consolidated with Mobeetie Independent School District in 1936. In 1937, with that consolidation, the County School Board of Education sold the Mt. Zion School ground for the sum of one dollar to be preserved as a community center. A board of trustees continued: W. L. Bobo, Nep Trew, and W. H. McAvoy.

The school remained as a community center for many years. Quiltings and dances were held there. Baptist church services were held there twice a month.

According to Earl and Carolyn Corse, it was thought the school burned in 1953 or 1954. Other sources recalled that there was trouble at a dance, and some were asked to leave. (However, this information can't be substantiated.) Unfortunately, the school burned that night.

Wheeler County Appraisal District shows Mt. Zion Cemetery to measure one acre. Measurement of the cemetery in January 2018 corresponded with this. There are eleven tombstones. None of them are leaning or broken. All information was legible. Melba Corcoran recorded old metal markers in very poor shape, but with mowing, these may no longer be visible. Two beautiful wrought-iron enclosures surround two graves and one grave. They are in excellent shape.

The oldest grave is that of A. J. Seay, buried April 13, 1910. The most recent grave is that of Darlene Chapman Dickson, buried March 31, 2009. There was no marker associated with her name. However, there was a wooden cross that was

not weathered, that quite possibly could be hers. Otherwise the cemetery remains inactive.

Someone takes care of the cemetery. Community volunteers are to be commended for this. There are no historically significant people buried there. There is no known cemetery association.

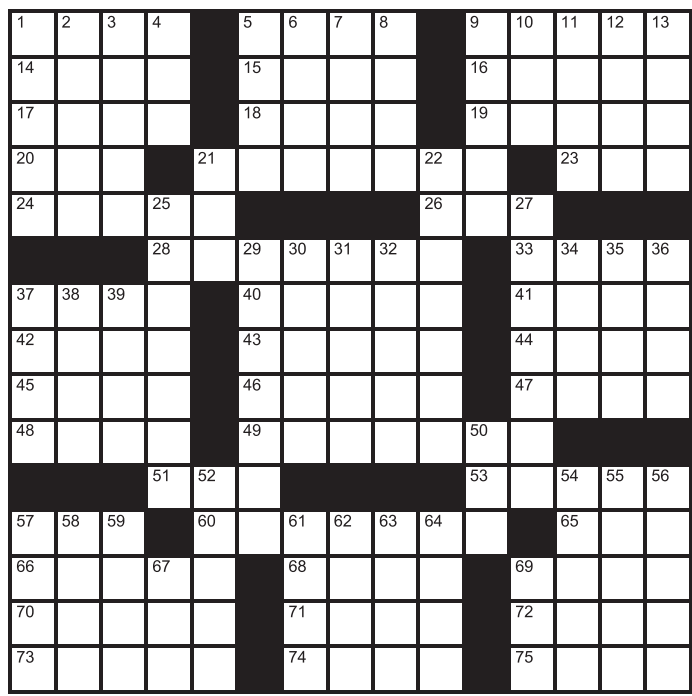

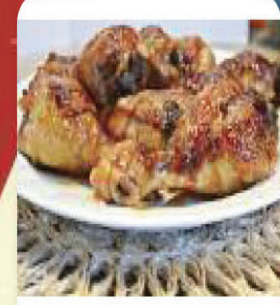

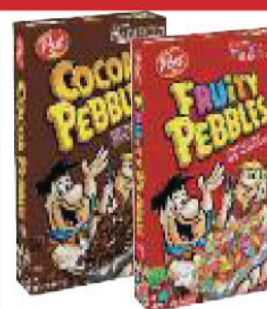
