Also Present: Charles Kuntz, CPA and Kristen Moudy, Coordinator

Ben Ed called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm and Randy opened in prayer.

Randy made a motioned to approve the April 9, 2018 minutes, Jack seconded the motion, passing it with all 7 members voting for, 0 against, 0 abstaining and 0 absent.

There was no public comment.

Charles discussed the financial statement report to the board.

Kristen presented to the board information to allow remote access to the marquee sign. The cost to convert the current software to a cloud-based software, SM Infinity LITE package is \$250 upfront/ \$0 a month. In a motion by Dale, seconded by Jack, motion passed with all 7 members voting for, 0 against, 0 abstaining and 0 absent.

Kristen presented the board with updated billboards and logos. It was requested to get current website traffic numbers

to compare once the billboards are implemented. In a motion by Stacy and seconded by John, the motion passed to move forward with the artwork for the two billboards with all 7 members voting for, 0 against, 0 abstaining and 0 absent. In a motion by Randy and seconded by Dale, the motion was made to reimburse Kristen for \$600 that was placed on her personal credit card for (2) \$300 payments for the billboards and then pay off the remaining balance with a check, all from the HOT funds under Advertising line item, the motion passed with all 7 members voting for, 0 against, 0 abstaining and 0 absent.

Discussion was held about our debt obligation for First State Bank for Nanna's Sweet Treats to cover any late payments. In a motion by John and seconded by Jack, the motion was made to make good and fulfill debt obligation of \$6,892.40 out of ED Funds under Business Development to First State. Elvis Impersonator To Perform At Britt Field Wed. Evening July 4

Harvey McFaden, Elvis Presley impersonator, will perform at Britt Field Wednesday, July 4, 2018. His appearance will precede special presentations, memory balloon releases and annual fireworks display.

Harvey is from Houston, Texas, and has been a life long Elvis fan. While in the Navy, he met Jimmy "Orion" Ellis, a country singer who had a superb Elvis style in his singing. Around this time, Harvey saw his first two Elvis impersonators. These experiences, along with his love of Elvis, inspired him to portray Elvis at a few parties and the response was wonderful.

Soon after Harvey retired from the Navy, he went to Tennessee and met Elvis Tribute Artist Lou Vuto, along with Elvis' long time friend, Charlie Hodge. This was followed by a tour of Sun Studios and his second trip to Graceland. Harvey then ordered his first jumpsuit. He performed several events in 2000, leading to his first paid performance in 2001. Harvey began making over 50 appearances per year. He added his Country Classics show in 2005; went full time in 2006, leading to 109 performances that year. In 2007, Harvey made 187 appearances. He had 263 appearances in 2008 and in 2009, 310 performances. In 2010, Harvey moved from the Huntsville area to near Abilene. In 2010, he made 214 appearances and surpassed his 1000th Elvis tribute. In 2012, Harvey made his first international appearance, performing for the Elvis Fan Club of Singapore, part of 231 performances that year. In 2013, Harvey had his second international performance, in Hanoi, Vietnam. He made 256 appearances in 2013; 283 in 2014; 325 in 2015, 304 in 2016; 210 in 2017... & is at 173 for 2018! In recent months, Harvey has met several milestones, including his 2,300th Elvis performance; his 2,200th retirement center performance, and his 3,100th career performance.

Harvey has had his Elvis songs played on Canada's ETA internet radio numerous times as well as www.elvii.com, www.tributesradio.com and www.elvistributeartist-network.ning.com, in the U.S.

Sharon has also a CD available called, "Timeless," a collection of 10 of her favorite/ most requested songs.

Harvey and Sharon reside in Hawley, Texas, near Abilene. He primarily performs within 150 miles of Abilene but has also traveled to Branson, Birmingham, Baton Rouge, Meridian, and many other cities. His primary mission: to touch as many lives as possible with the music and magic of Elvis — to make people smile, and especially, to remember Elvis.

She was a lifelong devoted Christian and was a member of The Church at Quail Creek. She leaves a legacy of love and care for all her family. She taught us all the power of prayer, the constance of God's love and presence, and to be sure to tithe even from your garage sale earnings. This, she and Dad did without fail, for all the years of their lives.

Our home was a strong and loving home where helping others was part of every day's intentions. Mom volunteered in every capacity in school and in church that she was able. She was awarded Lifetime Membership in the PTA, having served a number of years both locally and regionally. She volunteered in quilting and made clothes for a 6 foot Raggedy Ann and Andy at the Ronald McDonald House for families of stricken children. She delighted in helping others in the Prayer Room at church, and in the Food Kitchen that her church helped sponsor. She drove 200 miles round trip to Wheeler every Monday for years, never missing, to visit her mother in the Care Center there.

She was preceded in death by her loving husband Jim on November 13, 2009, and her loving daughter-in-law Tracey early in 2018. She is the last remaining of her immediate family including her parents, 2 sisters, and 2 brothers.

Survivors include a son, Jimmy Lewis of Amarillo, and 4 daughters, Contessa Skelton and husband, Greg, of Austin, Teresa Hook and husband, Denzil, of Amarillo, Mary Handley and husband, Mark, of Alvarado Texas, and Amy Waite and husband, Brad, of Portland Texas. Electric Outage Causes and Solutions

Outages can originate from different parts of the Xcel Energy system. Restoration times vary based on where the fault has occurred. Some common types of outages, and the way in which they are worked, include:

- **Transmission Line** - The high voltage network is made up of transmission lines that move power from generating plants to large concentrations of customers, such as towns or industrial areas. A transmission outage can affect thousands of customers, who can be restored quickly when the fault is cleared or when power is rerouted around the fault.

- **Substation** - The transmission network feeds into substations where voltage is stepped down to a distribution voltage and sent over the lines that run along major roads and up and up down alleys. An equipment malfunction in a substation can also affect a large number of customers, but power can often be rerouted around the disabled substation and power restored to affected customers even before the substation repairs are made.

- **Distribution Feeders and Taps** - Distribution lines are broken into feeder lines and tap lines. A feeder line supplies power onto multiple tap lines. Feeder outages can also affect a thousand or more customers, while tap line outages can affect anywhere from 40 to 400 customers. When outages occur on the feeder and tap lines, linemen are first dispatched to patrol the lines to check for faults or damage. If the line is clear, a breaker can be closed back to start the flow of power again. If damage is found, the damaged area can be isolated through switches and power can be rerouted into the area from another direction to restore the bulk of the affected customers.

- **Transformer and Service Level** - Outages that occur at the transformer or service line level affect smaller numbers of customers. Overhead transformers are bucket-shaped devices mounted on a pole and typically serve 10 to 12 customers. Service line outages are generally caused by impacts to the overhead line running from the alley to the customer's meter box. If a storm affects a large number of transformers and service lines, the restoration can take longer since service personnel have to make many stops to get everyone back into service.

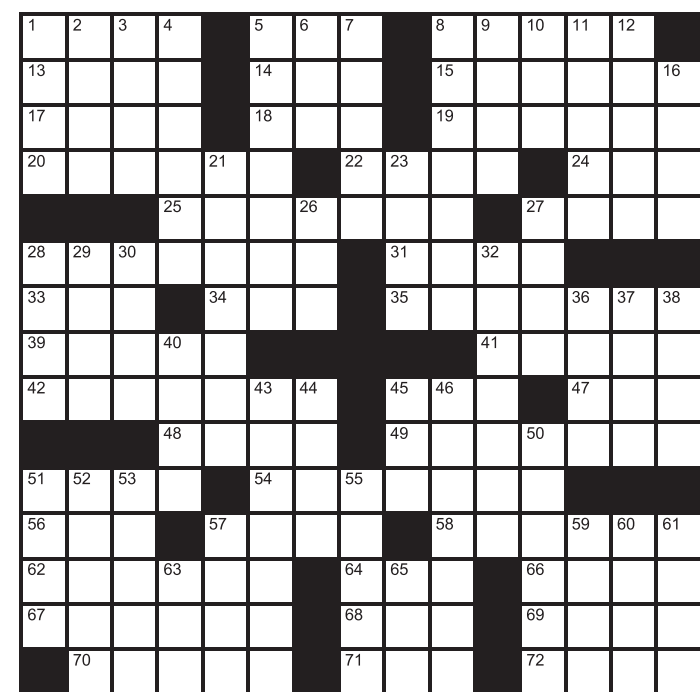

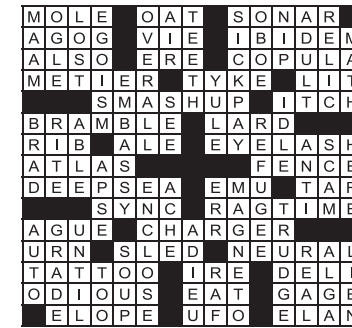

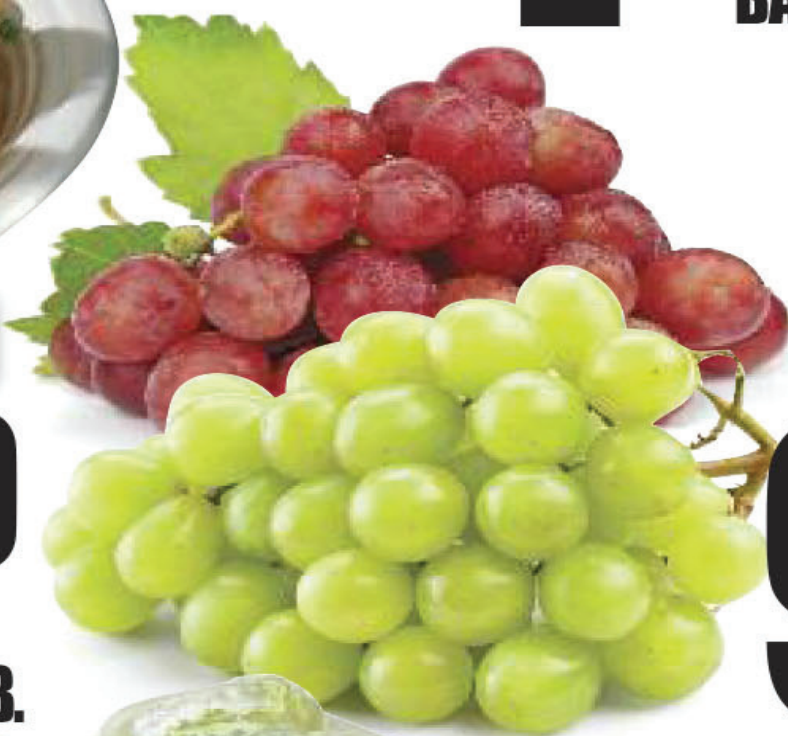
