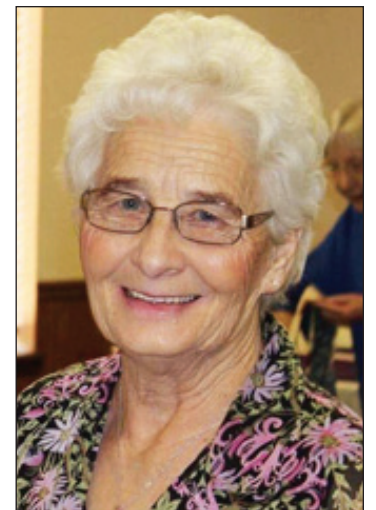

The CITY OF WHEELER (name of taxing unit) conducted public hearings on 8/20/2018 and 8/24/2018 on a proposal to increase the total tax revenues of the CITY OF WHEELER from properties on the tax roll in the preceding year by 8 percent. 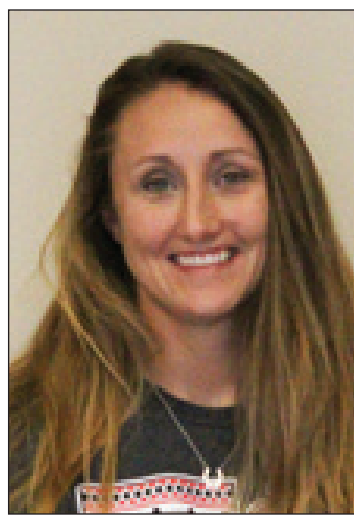
New Teachers At Fort Elliott



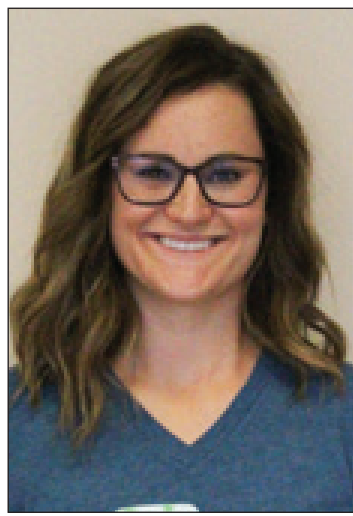
