Bean Blvd. The City Council is considering submitting application to the Texas Department of Agriculture's Downtown Revitalization Program. This hearing is slated to solicit input from the public related to projects allowable by the program including sidewalks and improved lightning. The council looks forward to public input at the public hearing at the time and location noted.

The City of Wheeler has scheduled a public hearing on Monday, September 17, at

5:45 at the City Office, 505 S. Alan L. Bean Blvd. The City Council is considering submitting application to the Texas Department of Agriculture's Community Development Block Grant Program. This hearing is slated to discuss the citizen participation plan, identification of local community development needs, TxCDBG funding availability, eligible activities, and the past use of TxCDBG funds. Eligible activities include water, sewer, and other primary infrastructure improvements. The council looks forward to public input at the public hearing at the time and location noted.

Saturday, Sept. 15 Is Last Day For Farmers' Market

Wheeler County farmers' market will continue through Sept. 15th. Wednesday markets will be held on Aug. 29, Sept. 5, and Sept. 12 on the east side of the courthouse from 3-6 pm, and Saturday markets will be held Sept. 1, Sept. 8, and Sept. 15 on the west side of the courthouse from 9 am - noon.

We have averaged 4 vendors per market with the maximum being 5 or 6; we haven't grown much over the past 15 years but we have managed to offer fresh produce, canned goods, baked goods, and all kinds of agricultural items at a reasonable price to our loyal customers. The vendors should have a selection of okra, peas, cucumbers, squash, peppers, tomatoes, potatoes, watermelons, cantaloupes, apples, grapes, sweet potatoes, Armenian cucumbers, Chinese okra, eggs, jellies and jams, preserves, pickles and relishes, cakes and breads, etc. for these last 3 weeks of market. So stock up for the winter with your favorite goodies while they last.

To quote one of the old-time members of the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce: "The farmers market will help the economy of the entire town of Wheeler; customers will come to the market then spend time in town eating in the local restaurants, filling their tanks at the local gas stations, buying groceries at the local retail spots, shopping the antique and consignment shops, etc. So it is a mutual benefit to all." So with that in mind why do so many in our little town never support the local farmers market? Your guess is as good as mine.

I have coordinated this market now for 15 years and will be stepping down after this season. I will pass the torch to someone else for next year. I do plan to continue raising my truck garden and hope to continue working with the public in a retail way; I enjoy both. Sales Tax Revenue For Fiscal Year

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar today released totals for fiscal 2018 state revenues, in addition to announcing monthly state revenues for August. In July, due to better than expected economic and revenue growth and an improved outlook for fiscal 2019, Hegar updated the Comptroller's Certification Revenue Estimate (CRE) forecast from last October. This was the first time the agency has updated a

CRE for a reason other than a legislative session in 30 years. Final fiscal 2018 revenues were in line with July's revised CRE forecast:

sales tax revenue for fiscal 2018 was \$31.94 billion, up 10.5 percent over fiscal 2017. oil and natural gas production tax revenue was \$4.82 billion, up 56.1 percent over fiscal 2017.

general revenue-related revenue was \$57.2 billion, up 9.3 percent over fiscal 2017.

all funds tax collections were \$55.6 billion, up 12 percent over fiscal 2017.

all funds revenue was \$120.2 billion, up 8.1 percent over fiscal 2017.

"As we said when we revised the CRE in July, economic growth in Texas in fiscal 2018 was strong with rising oil prices and production providing our state with a big boost," Hegar said. "Robust severance tax revenues will result in the biggest deposits to the Economic Stabilization Fund (ESF) and State Highway Fund (SHF) since fiscal 2015." The ESF and SHF both receive funding from oil and nat-

ural gas severance taxes. In November, the Comptroller's office will deposit \$1.38 billion in each of those funds, up from the \$734 million deposited in each fund in November 2017. Barring any legislative appropriations, the ESF will have a

balance of \$11.9 billion at the end of fiscal 2019, the largest ending balance in the fund's history.

Hegar also said today that state sales tax revenue totaled a record \$2.87 billion (Continued Page 7)

Drunk Driving Victim Shares Story

Laura Gonzalez celebrates her birthday every Labor Day weekend, commemorating the start of a new year and the end of summer alongside friends and family. Her husband Rico, however, will forever be absent from these celebrations as he was killed when he was hit head-on by a drunk driver, leaving behind his wife of less than a year and countless other family members and friends.

"We were just starting our lives together," Laura said. "We had everything to look forward to — our careers, a home of our own, starting a family. All of those hopes were ruined in an instant. The life we dreamed of for our family would only remain a dream. A drunk driver took all of that away from us."

Laura now shares her story through the Texas Department of Transportation's "Plan While You Can" campaign to communicate the devastating consequences of drinking and driving. The goal is to save lives and decrease alcohol-related crashes, with special emphasis during holidays when alcohol consumption is more prevalent.

As a combined result of the "Plan While You Can" campaign and the efforts of many state and local com-

munity partners, including law enforcement, Texas experienced a 23-percent decrease in alcohol-related crashes over the 2017 Labor Day weekend* compared to the 2016 holiday weekend. Still, during last year's Labor Day weekend, there were 264 alcohol-related crashes in Texas, resulting in 14 fatalities and 19 serious injuries.

"It's completely irresponsible and absolutely inexcusable to drink and drive," said TxDOT Executive Director James Bass. "Finding a sober ride is easy, and it can save you from being arrested or from injuring or killing yourself or others. Make an effort to plan ahead for a sober ride this Labor Day weekend. You owe it to yourself and everyone else on the road."

The "Plan While You Can" campaign includes a statewide tour featuring an interactive dodgeball game where participants avoid incoming "dodgeballs" as virtual drinks are added to the screen. As more drinks are added, participants experience how drinking can slow their reaction times as on-screen avatars begin responding more slowly to their players' movements.

Drivers under the influence of alcohol can face up to \$17,000 in fines and fees, jail time and loss of their driver's license. Visit SoberRides.org to find alternatives to drinking and driving, such as:

- Designating a sober driver or calling someone for a sober ride home
- Contacting a cab or ride-share service
- Using mass transit
- Spending the night

in August, 15.8 percent more than in August 2017. The previous record for state sales tax revenue was \$2.78 billion in November 2017.

"The strong growth in August state sales tax collections compared to a year ago is principally due to the strength of the current economic expansion, but is also due to unusually high audit refund payments in August of last year," Hegar said. "Led by receipts from the oil- and gas-related sectors, all major economic sectors including manufacturing, wholesale and retail trade, construction and services contributed significant gains."

Total sales tax revenue for the three months ending in August 2018 is up 12.1 percent compared to the same period a year ago. Sales tax revenue is the largest source of state funding for the state budget, accounting for 57 percent of all tax collections. Motor vehicle sales and rental taxes, motor fuel taxes and oil and natural gas production taxes also are large revenue sources for the state.

Revenue from other major taxes on motor vehicle sales and rentals, motor fuel and oil and natural gas production also rose in August 2018:

motor vehicle sales and rental taxes — \$486.9 million, up 16.3 percent from August 2017;

motor fuel taxes — \$309.5 million, up 1.3 percent from August 2017; and

oil and natural gas production taxes — \$505.8 million, up 86.2 percent from August 2017.
