City To Apply For Two Block Grants

On Monday, September 17, 2018, at the Wheeler City Council meeting, there were two Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) that the city council executed a resolution to execute an interlocal contract with PRPC under the Interlocal Cooperation Act for grant application and grant management. One of the CDBG is for a new Water Tower and the other is for Downtown Sidewalks and Lights.

The application to the Texas Department of Agriculture for the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program (TxCDBG) is for infrastructure assistance through the 2018 Texas Capital Fund Downtown

Revitalization program. The Interlocal Cooperation Act included in Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code provides for contractual agree-

ments between governmental entities and encourages the use of interlocal agreements from the federal level. The Tex-

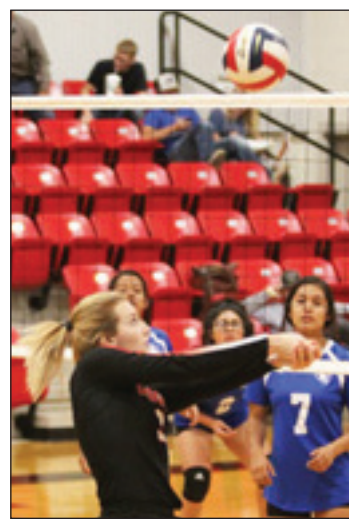
