Marching Contests

The event on Saturday has actually been rescheduled for this Friday. It is not really a contest (rather, it is a critique) and therefore, not really set up as a spectator event. This Friday we will play our show at 2:30 and then a judge will work with us for roughly an hour and a half in order to prepare the Band for the next three weeks worth of contests.

On Saturday, October 13th, the Band will travel to Dick Bivens stadium in Amarillo for the High Plains Marching Festival and will perform at 10:15am. This is not affiliated with UIL in any way, but is a contest. The Bands will be scored by a panel of music judges, a panel of marching judges, as well as a percussion judge, Drum Major judge, and a Color Guard judge. These scores are all weighted differently, but averaged together to give each school an overall ranking. The competition is an “Open Class” competition, meaning that schools AA schools like Wheeler will be in competition against schools like Amarillo High. Schools with a ranking in the top seven will perform again in the evening for the finals portion of the contest.

On Saturday, October 20th, at 1:15 pm, the Pride of

Wheeler will compete at the UIL Region Marching Contest at Dick Bivens in Amarillo. This is important because the outcome will determine whether or not the Band advances to the next level of competition. At this contest, there is a panel of three judges with each critiquing every aspect of the Band’s performance. Schools are given a rating (1-5) from each judge and these ratings are averaged together. Schools who receive an overall “1” as their rating will advance to the Area level of the

UIL competition.

On Saturday, October 27th (if the Band received a “One” rating at the UIL Region Contest), they will travel back to Amarillo to Dick Bivens stadium for the UIL Area Marching contest. This contest is very similar in format to the High Plains Marching Festival. We know that we will perform early at this contest if we make it, but will not know an exact time until all of the Region contests are completed.

Doctors Recommend Getting Flu Shots

The bottom line: Influenza (flu) is a highly contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. The flu can cause fever and chills, cough, sore throat, runny nose, headaches, and body aches, and thousands of people die from severe cases. The best way to prevent flu is by getting an annual flu shot, which scientists develop to target the flu strains predicted to dominate the season.

Look out: Here comes flu season. Even though the flu is an annual occurrence, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) branded the 2017-18 flu season as one of the worst in recent years. According to CDC, 11,000 Texans died of flu-related illnesses last season. Oct. 1 marks the traditional start of flu season. The Texas Medical Association's (TMA's) Texas Medicine magazine reports physicians are urging patients not to get complacent, and to take preventive steps now.

"People of all ages are at risk," said Lenore DePagter, DO, a member of TMA's Be Wise — Immunize Physician Advisory Panel. "The flu can be deadly, especially for the very young, the very old, pregnant women, and people with chronic illnesses," said the McAllen internal medicine specialist. The flu causes misery in its victims — fever and chills, cough, sore throat, runny nose, headaches, and body aches. Thousands of people die from severe cases every year.

Statistics on the total number of flu cases are sketchy because neither Texas nor the federal government requires clinicians to report them. Still, anecdotal evidence and available data confirmed that 2017-18 was a deadly flu season. A record 172 children younger than age 18 nationwide died last year, surpassing the old record of 171 in 2012-13. Texas saw 16 pediatric flu deaths in 2017-18, up from eight in 2016-17 and seven in 2015-16, according to the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS).

Last year's flu season was so severe for several reasons. Jennifer A. Shuford, MD, DSHS's infectious disease medical officer and a consultant to the TMA Committee on Infectious Diseases, said the most prevalent strain last year was H3N2, and vaccines typically don't protect

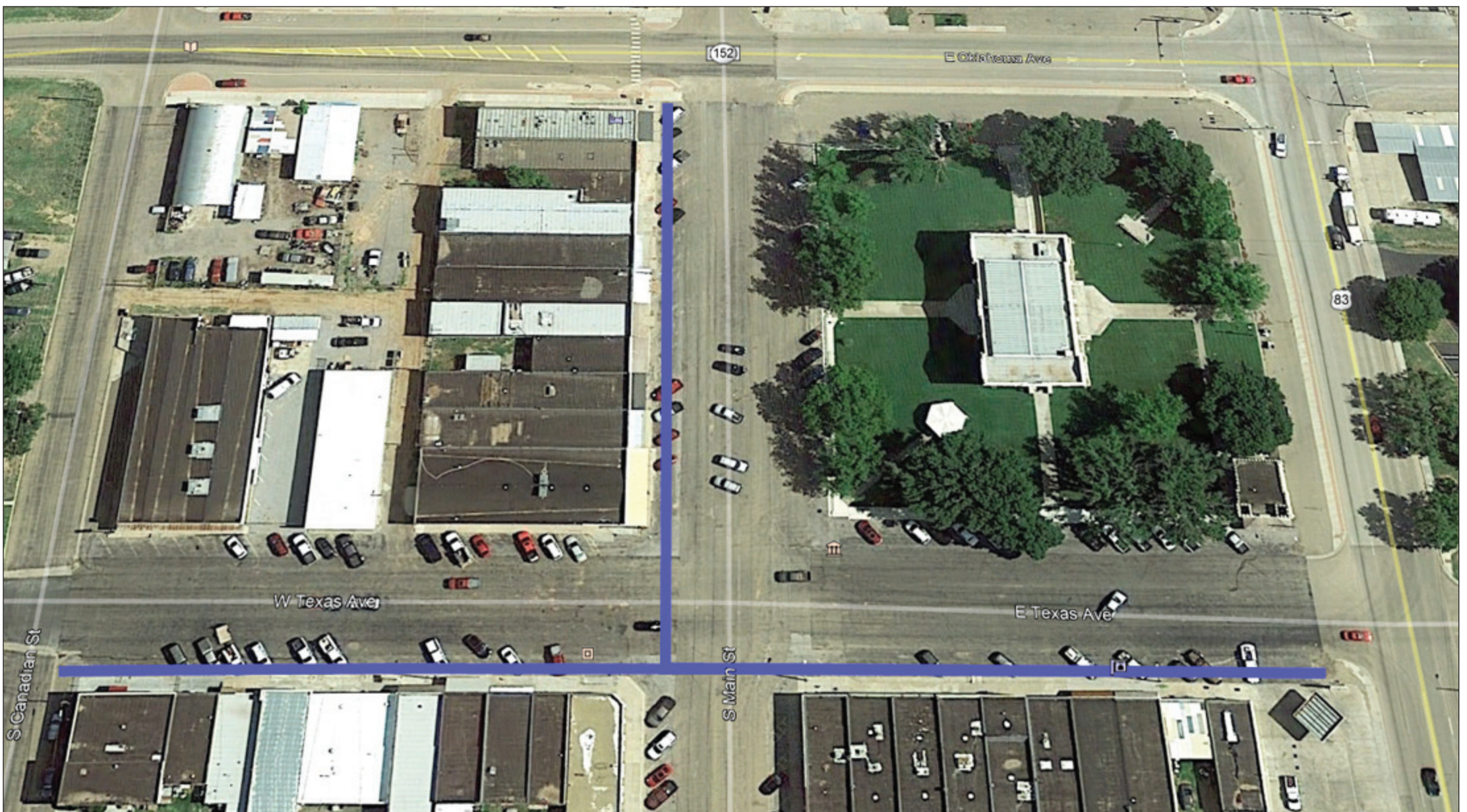

Community Development Block Grants Door to Door Survey To Be Taken



On Monday, September 17, 2018, at the Wheeler City Council meeting, there were two Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) that the city council executed a resolution to execute an interlocal contract with PRPC under the Interlocal Cooperation Act for grant application and grant management. One of the CDBG is for a new Water Tower and the other is for Downtown Sidewalks and Lights.

TxCDBG project will be agreed to through an amendment to the interlocal agreement if City of Wheeler receives funding through the 2018 Texas Capital Fund Downtown Revitalization program.

There are several guidelines the city follows to get the maximum scoring allowed. The maximum grant amount for a single jurisdiction is \$275,000 with a total of 180 maximum points. This grant application is for the building of a new water tower, one that TCEQ will require the city to be built soon.

The application to the Texas Department of Agriculture for the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program (TxCDBG) is for infrastructure assistance through the 2018 Texas Capital Fund Downtown Revitalization program. The Interlocal Cooperation Act included in Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code provides for contractual agreements between governmental entities and encourages the use of interlocal agreements from the federal level. The Texas Department of Agriculture has issued a recommendation that communities applying under the 2018 Texas Capital Fund Downtown Revitalization program consider contracting professional services for grant application preparation and potential grant administration (if funded) prior to application submission. The City of Wheeler desires to contract the grant application preparation and potential grant administration (if funded) through an interlocal cooperation contractual agreement with Panhandle Regional Planning Commission (PRPC). PRPC shall provide grant application preparation services related to the 2018 Texas Capital Fund Downtown Revitalization program at no cost. Administrative fees related to project management of any funded 2018

The other CDBG application is for \$250,000 with a maximum scoring of 85 points. This CDBG would be used for sidewalks and lighting in the downtown area. There are three blocks included in this grant are, "the south and east/west sides of the Downtown Square in Wheeler, Texas, described as the "100 Block of E Texas Ave. on the South side, between Main St. and S Alan L Bean Blvd", "100 Block of W Texas Ave. on the South side, between Main St. and Canadian St." and "400 Block of S Main St. on the Westside, between E Oklahoma Ave and E Texas Ave". To gain the most points, the EDC would match 30% of the grant. During the city council meeting, the council passed an interlocal agreement with PRPC and to enter into an interlocal agreement with Parkhill Smith and Cooper Engineering firm (PSC). A resolution was also passed approving funding in support of the Texas Department of Agriculture Downtown Revitalization Program to remove and reconstruct sidewalks/slum and blight areas located Downtown and provide safe lighting for the Downtown Area.

To show how at least half of the city benefits, under the qualifications of a low-moderate income, we will be conducting door-to-door surveys to collect information from our city residents. We have included the survey, so citizens will know what they will be asked. There are a few basic questions we are looking to answer: How many people live in the unit (house/apartment/etc.)? What the family size is? And based on family size, if your income is above or below a certain range. This will help us in being able to qualify and we will have several local volunteers helping us to conduct this survey during the first two weeks of October. Participation in the survey is critical to maintain the grant and we greatly appreciate all help.

Flu (from Page 6) well against it. "Just having an H3N2-predominant year was going to make it a more severe year," Dr. Shuford said. "Usually, when it's an H3N2-predominant season, we see more hospitalizations, more severe influenza, and more deaths. And it certainly happened that way last year." Dr. Shuford also said last year's vaccine was not a perfect match for all the flu strains that appeared. (Scientists develop each year's flu vaccine to target the strains predicted to dominate the season.) In a typical flu season, flu vaccine can be up to 60-percent effective. The 2017-18 vaccine was 36-percent effective, one CDC study found.

Nonetheless, physicians maintain the best way people can avoid the flu and reduce the severity of flu season is by getting a flu shot, especially children 6 months and older, pregnant women, people with chronic health conditions, and seniors over 65, who are most at risk. "Even if [scientists are] not totally correct [about the vaccine matching the prevalent strain], the flu shot still prevents serious illnesses, hospitalizations, and deaths," Dr. DePogter said. Doctors point to an expanded list of flu shot types this year, including the nasal spray FluMist that would make it easier to vaccinate young children. Also, this year's U.S. vaccine is designed to improve protection against two of the strains that were not well matched in last year's vaccine. "There's a sense that it's not a big deal, but it is a big deal," said Trish Perl, MD, chief of the division of infectious diseases at UT Southwestern Medical School in Dallas and a member of TMA's Committee on Infectious Diseases. "It may not be a big deal to you because you're young and healthy. But it's a big deal to the people around you. It's a big deal for the health system." This release is part of a

monthly TMA series highlighting contagious diseases that childhood and adult vaccinations can prevent. Diseases covered thus far are:

- Measles,
- Pneumococcal disease,
- Human papillomavirus (HPV),
- Chickenpox and shingles (varicella), and
- Hepatitis A.


