The pumpkins come from Mr. Tim Assiter's Pumpkin Ranch in Floydada, Texas.



PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Hesston Marshall was named the Globe-News "Player of the Week" for his play in the Wheeler-Shamrock game October 19, 2018. Marshall is a sophomore and plays RB-LB.

Performance: What didn't Hesston Marshall do in a 27-14 win against rival Shamrock is the better question. First off, he kept the Mustangs Perfect in District 5-2A Division II at 2-0. Marshall, who ran a lot out of the Wildcat formation against the Irish, piled up 209 yards on 21 carries and one touchdown. He averaged 10.0 yards a carry, and was even 5-of-6 passing for 44 yards. Defensively, Marshall added five tackles and partially blocked a punt.

Comment: "We ran him a lot out of the Wildcat," Wheeler coach Chris Evans said. "We felt like as good as Shamrock was up front, getting him to the outside was our best option for his speed. He's a competitor, and is always looking for an extra yard. I think that's what is great about him. He's also the kind of person you want your son to grow up and be. He doesn't get in trouble, yet, he's always looking for a challenge."

Walker Huff, 60 of Allison passed away October 18, 2018 in Canadian.

Funeral service were 1:30 pm, Sunday, October 21, 2018 at the First Baptist Church in Allison with Pastor Michael Price and Matt Huff officiating. Burial followed at the Edith Ford Memorial Cemeteries in Canadian under the direction of Carmichael-Whatley Funeral Directors of Canadian.

Walker was born January 13, 1958 in Canadian, Texas to Boyd and Ellen Huff. He has been a lifelong rancher on the Huff family ranch along the Gageby Creek in Hemphill County. As a lifelong rancher, Walker's life was marked by grit, determination, and perseverance. He loved his horse Comanche, and together they logged many hours working cattle. He was never known to sit on the sidelines, whether he was stacking hay, mending fence, or simply raking leaves. People also always knew exactly where they stood with Walker, whether that be a firm correction to "stop whining" or casting his vote as to the "right way" to get the job done. Behind the rough exterior of a ranching life, however, was someone who taught us all about the softer side of life. Walker had the keen ability to know when something was wrong and would intervene with assurance that everything (Continued Page 2)

> Program Initiatives are the National Air Quality Initiative, National On-Farm Energy Initiative, National Organic Initiative, High Tunnel System, and the StrikeForce Initiative. Landscape Conservation Initiatives included are the Long Leaf Pine Initiative, National Water Quality Initiative, Working Lands for Wildlife and the Monarch Butterfly Habitat Development Project. Other eligible activities will include Disaster Relief Funding, Conservation Activity Plans and WaterSmart. Any applications submitted in FY18 under the above programs and initiatives that were not funded will be deferred to this first EQIP signup for FY19.

Additionally, applications for the Regional Conservation Protection Program or RCPP-EQIP will include the Texas Gulf Coast Stream and Wetland Initiative and OPJV -Grassland Restoration Incentive Program.

EQIP provides financial and technical assistance to agricultural producers to address natural resource concerns and deliver environmental benefits such as improved water and air quality, conserved ground and surface water, reduced soil erosion and sedimentation or improved or created wildlife

habitat. This Farm Bill program is a competitive process and EQIP applicants compete for funds in funding pools. Various funding pool categories allow similar application types to be grouped together when competing for funds. In order to compete, EQIP applications are ranked using environmental ranking points based on planned practices and resource concerns being addressed. Local NRCS field office staff will work with the applicant to rank the application and plan the conservation practices.
