City Applies For Grants For Downtown Improvements

Mayor McCain called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Kendall Hefley made a motion to approve the August 20 minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Stacy McQueen. All 5 voted in favor, 0 against, 0 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Britt McCarter made the motion, seconded by Carol Porton, to approve the meeting minutes for two special sessions on August 24th and 31st. All 5 voted in favor, 0 against, 0 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Carol Porton made the motion to approve payment of monthly Hefley Hardware bill. The motion was seconded by Tammy Moore. The motion

carried with 4 voting in favor, 0 against, 0 absent, and 1 (Kendall Hefley) abstaining.

Stacy McQueen made the motion to pay all other monthly bills presented. The motion was seconded by Britt McCarter. All 5 voted in favor, 0 against, 0 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Dustin Meyer, with P.R.P.C., presented the Council with a Resolution to execute an Interlocal contract with PRPC under the Interlocal Cooperation Act for grant application and potential grant management. Tammy Moore made the motion to adopt a Resolution to partner with PRPC for the preparation of applying for a grant through the TxCDBG program and potential grant management. The motion was seconded by Kendall Hefley. All 5 voted in favor, 0 against, 0 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Dustin Meyer, with P.R.P.C., reported to the Council that Parkhill, Smith, and Cooper were the engineers whose proposal scored the highest after a selection process with the Mayor and City Secretary. Britt McCarter, seconded by Carol Porton, motioned to award Parkhill, Smith, and Cooper (PSC) as the Engineering Firm assisting and planning with the City of Wheeler and Economic Development on the Texas Community Block

The family suggest memorials be sent to the First Baptist Church in Wheeler.

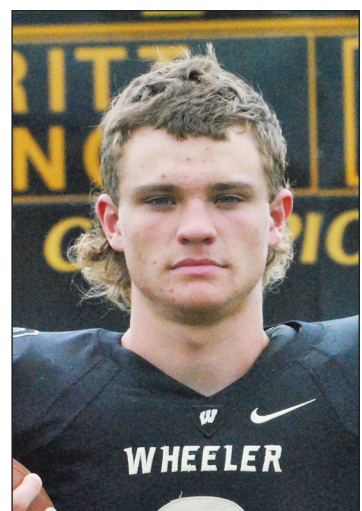

Marshall Named “Player of the Week”

Hesston Marshall was named the Globe-News “Player of the Week” for his play in the Wheeler-Shamrock game October 19, 2018. Marshall is a sophomore and plays RB-LB.

Performance: What didn't Hesston Marshall do in a 27-14 win against rival Shamrock is the better question. First off, he kept the Mustangs Perfect in District 5-2A Division II at 2-0. Marshall, who ran a lot out of the Wildcat formation against the Irish, piled up 209 yards on 21 carries and one touchdown. He averaged 10.0 yards a carry, and was even 5-of-6 passing for 44 yards. Defensively, Marshall added five tackles and partially blocked a punt.

Comment: “We ran him a lot out of the Wildcat,” Wheeler coach Chris Evans said. “We felt like as good as Shamrock was up front, getting him to the outside was out best option for



Hesston Marshall his speed. He's a competitor, and is always looking for an extra yard. I thing that's what is great about him. He's also the kind of person you want your son to grow up and be. He doesn't get in trouble, yet, he's always looking for a challenge.” —Kale Steed, Amarillo Globe-News

Don't Delay, Get Flu Shot

It's not too late to get a flu shot.

Even though the flu season usually begins about now, the vaccine will protect you within about two weeks. The season typically peaks in January or February and runs through May.

The flu hospitalized and killed more Americans last winter than any seasonal influenza in decades. More than 900,000 people landed in the hospital, double the number of many seasons. More than 80,000 people died, far exceeding the previous high of 56,000 for a flu season over the past 30 years.

The hospitalizations and deaths were mainly among people 65 and older. As people age, their immune system typically weakens and their ability to ward off diseases declines. Moreover, the flu virus can cause complications for those already struggling with chronic health problems.

Last year's heavy toll underscores the importance of getting a flu vaccine as soon as possible. The shot can prevent infections and reduce the severity of complications from the disease.

If you're enrolled in Medicare Part B, your flu shot won't cost you anything, as long as your doctor, health clinic or pharmacy agrees not to charge you more than Medicare pays. There's no deductible or co-payment.

If you were vaccinated last year, you'll still need another shot this year, since your immunity to flu viruses wanes after a year. Also, the types of viruses usually change from season to season, so new vaccines are made each year to fight what scientists believe will be the season's most common strains.

You have many flu shot options. Besides the traditional flu vaccines that help protect against three strains of the virus, there are now "quadrivalent" vaccines that help protect against four strains. There's also a high-dose vaccine approved for people 65 and older.

If you have any questions about which is best for you, talk to your doctor or other health care professional.

Despite the risk that flu and its complications pose, the vaccination rate remains much lower than it should be. Even during last year's horrible season, less than half of the U.S. population was vaccinated.

Why? Some people don't understand that the flu can be serious and life-threatening, so they don't think a flu shot is worth their time and effort. Others resist annual vaccination because they believe it's risky, even though decades of experience have shown flu shots to be safe.

If you're concerned about a serious allergic reaction or some other medical condition that may make the flu vaccine unsafe for you, you should consult your doctor before a vaccination. Otherwise, it's important to remember that you can't get the flu from the flu shot.

Side effects are rare. Most people notice nothing after their vaccination. A few may have a slight fever or some soreness where the shot was given. But those side effects usually last just a day or two.

As flu season begins, you'll want to wash your hands and stay away from sick people to reduce the spread of germs. But as useful as those steps are, an annual vaccination remains the best way to protect yourself and those around you. By avoiding the flu, you'll avoid giving it to family and friends.

Grant Program (TxCDBG) for the Downtown Revitalization Program if grant is funded. All 5 voted in favor, 0 against, 0 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Charles Kuntz presented the monthly financial statements. Paul Arganbright gave a monthly maintenance report to the Council members.

Kristen Moudy presented the Council with a Resolution to approve funding in support of the Downtown Revitalization program. Section 1 of the resolution designates the 3 blocks included in the TxCD-BG application. After discussion, Stacy McQueen made a motion to adopt a resolution with an amendment to Section 1 to include the West 100 block of Texas Street in the designation of the Downtown Revitalization Program. Carol Porton seconded the motion. All 5 voted in favor, 0 against, 0 absent, and 0 abstaining.
