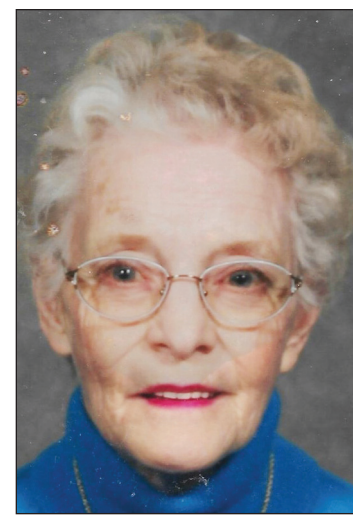

Wheeler Craft Fair Is Set For Dec. 1-2

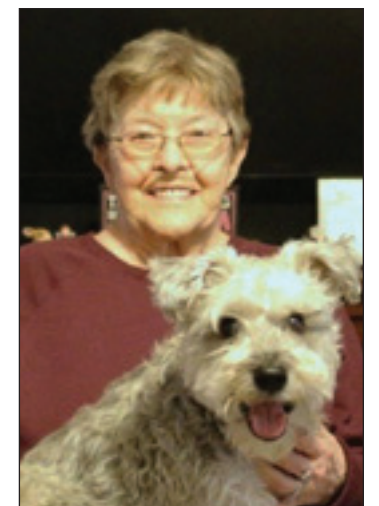
Wheeler's Annual Craft Fair is set for Saturday and Sunday, December 1 and 2 at the Wheeler County Agri-Life building at the north edge of town.

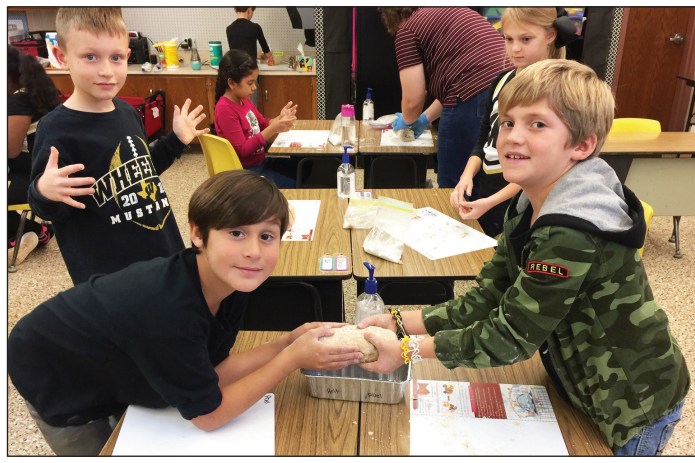

Wake-Up Call: Transportation Infrastructure

Recently, the world learned yet again that inadequate investment in infrastructure—roads, bridges, tunnels, and railways—can have tragic consequences.

This time, those consequences befell the people of Genoa, Italy, where the collapse of a 51-year-old bridge killed 43 people. Area residents had long expressed

concern about the bridge's structural integrity. For years, blocks of concrete had been falling from the span onto their cars. Yet only the bare minimum of maintenance appears to have been performed.

The tragedy in Italy should serve as a wake-up call in the United States. Plenty of bridges, tunnels, railways, and roads in this country are deteriorating. Our leaders must make the investments necessary to restore our in-

frastructure—and prevent a similar catastrophe here.

Simply put, our nation's infrastructure is failing. The American Society of Civil Engineers' (ASCE) most recent report card gave the overall condition of American infrastructure a D+. Bridges, specifically, received a C+—a bit better, but not exactly glowing.

In fact, public transit needs more investment than any other infrastructure sector. ASCE has graded the condition of the public transportation network as a D-, teetering on failing.

This lack of investment over the years in America's public transportation infrastructure has made modernizing these systems an enormous challenge for local public transit officials. For example, this past summer, Metrorail officials in the nation's capital had no choice but to address essential maintenance to overcome decades of America's underinvestment in our local public transit systems. As a result, riders have had to cope with planned partial shutdowns.

That's largely a function of inadequate funding. Public transportation accounted for over 10 billion trips last year. Yet, public transit systems are chronically underfunded. According to the U.S. Department of Transportation, public transit needs more than \$90 billion to bring our aging systems to a state of good repair. Failing to address this backlog results in a loss of \$340 billion in business revenue to the U.S. economy over a six-year period.

Fortunately, Congress has

begun to act. Earlier this year, Congress appropriated more than \$16.3 billion for public transportation and intercity passenger rail construction. This summer, the House and Senate Appropriations Committees have advanced transportation funding bills that build upon this critical investment.

Such investments in public transportation rebound across the American economy. Seventy-one percent of government funding for public transit flows to the private-sector. Those dollars support millions of jobs.

All told, investing to restore the nation's public transit systems to a state of good repair would create 162,000 new jobs and generate over \$180 billion in economic activity

over a six-year period.

The American public is on board with such public investment. More than six in 10 Americans told Gallup last year that they supported the Trump Administration's call for \$1 trillion in infrastructure spending. It's among the most popular items on the President's governing agenda. In addition, a survey by the Mineta Transportation Institute shows that 74 percent of Americans want Congress to increase federal investment in public transportation.

We don't need any more wake-up calls like the catastrophe in Italy. Our elected leaders must increase investment in our nation's transportation infrastructure.

Physicians Shift Focus To Prevent Suicide, A Growing Health Problem

The Bottom Line: Some Texas physicians are trying to help prevent suicides with mental health screening and identifying patients' suicidal thoughts during a routine examination. Data shows most victims visit a doctor shortly before taking his or her life.

The aftermath of a suicide can leave a grieving family with shock and questions that will not go away. It is especially devastating to a physician if the loved one is a family member. A day after law enforcement released Landon Powell from the Bexar County Adult Detention Center in November 2016, he hanged himself. His father Dan Powell, MD, a long-time San Antonio family physician, says his son's death changed his attitude on screening patients' behavioral health for suicidal thoughts. He has core questions.

"What does someone have to keep them going?" Dr. Powell said. "What do they have to get up out of bed in the morning for? What gives them meaning or purpose? And I think in my practice and certainly in my life, that's what I've focused more on — do my patients have no hope? ... That relates to my son's case. He was running out of purpose, reason."

Suicide is a growing problem in the United States. The

warning signs are not always apparent, but primary care physicians might be able to help prevent these deaths. Nearly half (45 percent) of people who die by suicide have contact with a physician or primary care provider in the month before, according to a 2002 American Journal of Psychiatry study. "Half of people are going to their doctors in the month before their deaths ... so there's a real opportunity there for the docs to reach them," said Jenna Heise, the statewide suicide prevention coordinator at the Texas Health and Human Services Commission, in Texas Medical Association's (TMA's) Texas Medicine magazine.

"Physicians need to recognize that they're the frontline person that people go to most often, and they're in a position to be most effective," said Stacey Freedenthal, PhD, a licensed psychotherapist who specializes in suicide risk and mental health assessment. "Not only can many people not go to a mental health specialist because of finances or whatever, there are many who choose not to because of the stigma."

Many people have easier access to primary care physicians than to behavioral health specialists, particularly in some rural areas. And many physicians use screening tools to help identify people thinking of suicide. However, the social stigma around suicide can dissuade even some physicians,

health care workers, as well as patients and their family members, from addressing the topic.

Primary care physicians can help remove the stigma by encouraging conversations about depression and suicide with their patients, says Leslie Secrest, MD, chair of the TMA Task Force on Behavioral Health. "[Primary care physicians] may not have all the answers," said Dr. Secrest, a professor of psychiatry at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas. "But [their offices] are a venue in which answers can be found."

The recent suicide deaths of celebrities like chef Anthony Bourdain and fashion designer Kate Spade shocked and saddened fans. They highlighted statistics the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) released in June showing that between 1999 and 2016, suicide rates rose nearly 30 percent nationwide. In Texas, the rate of suicide is not as high, but in 2015, it was the 12th leading cause of death, according to the Texas Department of State Health Services. However, among certain age groups, suicide rates are quite high. Suicide was the second leading cause of death for 15- to 34-year-old Texans after accidents, which mirrors CDC national statistics.

Mental illness played a role in young Mr. Powell's death,

as happens with about 46 percent of all suicides. In 2017, the Texas Legislature enacted a series of reforms designed to improve mental health care in Texas, by giving people greater access to doctors' care. The legislature expanded Medicaid for post-partum depression screenings and annual adolescent mental health screenings. The legislature also expanded access to telemedicine, allowing physicians to care for patients outside of the traditional office visit.

Dr. Powell hopes his family's tragedy will help change physician attitudes about mental health screening and identify more people contemplating suicide. "I still keep family photos in the exam room," Dr. Powell said. "They're a good lead-in for being able to talk about mental health and how it's affected our family and how we lost our son. I think that opens up communication, number one. And if they're comfortable talking to you, they're going to be more likely to talk to you. I think for me that's something that's opened some doors."

Comptroller Glenn Hegar Release

Tax Exemptions And Tax Incidence

(AUSTIN) — Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar today released the Tax Exemptions and Tax Incidence report, as required by state law.

The report estimates the value of each exemption, exclusion, discount, deduction, credit, refund and special appraisal available to payers of Texas' sales, franchise, motor vehicle sales, oil production and gasoline taxes, as well as property taxes levied by school districts.

"In previous biennia, my office has released this report at the beginning of the legislative session," Hegar said. "But given the complex revenue and spending matters Texas lawmakers will be facing, including issues such as school finance, pensions and infrastructure, I thought it

important to get this report to members of the Legislature well before the session begins. With more than six weeks until the 86th Legislature convenes, my office stands ready to assist lawmakers as they begin to lay the groundwork to tackle these critical issues."

For fiscal 2019, aggregate exemptions for these revenue sources will total an estimated \$59.8 billion. Of this amount, exemptions related to the state taxes included in the report will account for \$45.6 billion; school property tax exemptions will account for the remaining \$14.2 billion.

Nearly \$16 billion of the estimated fiscal 2019 amount represents sales tax exemptions for items taxable under other law, including insurance premiums, motor vehicle sales and motor fuels. Exemptions from the sales tax on those items are estimated to be worth \$7.2 billion, \$4.4 billion and \$3 billion respectively.

Other exemptions from the sales tax include \$9 billion in raw materials used in manufacturing, \$3.2 billion in food for home consumption and \$1 billion worth of over-the-counter drugs and prescription medicines and devices.
